GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. All exhibits must be in place by 8pm Tuesday, Sept. 1, Livestock will be accepted at the grounds Tuesday Sept. 8pm Tuesday, Sept. 1, and may be removed at 11:00pm Saturday, Sept. 5. Educational booths, Home Economics, and 4-H entries other than livestock, will be accepted from 2:00 PM TO 5:00PM. Sept. 1, 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. Sept. 5 and Horticulture-Flowers and Baked Items from 8:00 a.m. until 9:30 a.m.. Sept. 3, at the exhibit building unless otherwise stated. Judging will begin at 10:00 a.m. on Sept. 1. Entries must remain until Sept. 5.
2. Only Items listed will be accepted for entry for premiums or ribbons. Other entries will be displayed only. No ribbon or premium will be given on these displayed items.
3. A member of an extension club or 4-H club can only show in one county fair. Minimum age to exhibit in classes will be 5 years old. Animals shown by 5-8 year old exhibitors will have a category for bottle calves. Open to Sevier County residents, students who go to school in Sevier County, and members of extension clubs. Exhibitors may show one year after graduation from a Sevier County High School. Age requirement day of show.
4. 5-8 year old exhibitors will show in Open Show, with the following exceptions, unless they turn 9 before the opening day of the state fair.
Can not show in market class.
Can not show in Junior Commercial Heifer Class. (Safety reason, due to the number of cattle in classes.) There will be a 5-8 year old commercial Heifer Class if 5-8 year old exhibitors have commercial heifer that is not a bottle calf.
The fair board supports the younger exhibitors showing breeding registered cattle to the open show if safety of the 5-8 year olds exhibitors becomes an issue.
5. The Fair association will not furnish feed for livestock exhibits.
6. Competent and qualified judges will be used in all divisions and their decisions will be final.
7. Pre-registration deadline is August 15 from 9:00 a.m. - 12 :00 noon - all animals
8. Junior exhibitors will not be allowed to compete in open classes.
9. The Sevier County Fair and Livestock Association, or any of its officers, directors, or employees shall in no case be held responsible for any loss, damage, injury or death by disease, theft or from any character, to any property or person while same is on the fairgrounds, or at any other time or place. The association will not be responsible for any exhibits remaining on the fairgrounds after Sept. 5.
10. In all cases, the premium sale committee and show committee reserves the right to reject, accept or conditionally accept any entry as it is entered so that only such exhibits shall be entered and shown as have merit and will be a credit to both the exhibitor and this exhibition.
11. The premium sale committee and show management reserves the right to interpret any rule herein. In the event of an emergency, exhibitors must submit any dispute or grievance to a committee, appointed by the president, for settlement. The decision of the committee will be final.
12. Premiums will be awarded on a point basis unless otherwise specified. The value of points will be determined when all of the entries have been judged and accumulated points totaled.
13. All animals in Junior Division are to be shown by the youth exhibiting them unless unavoidable circumstances forbid their presence, in which case, the animal may be shown by a youth who is still a junior exhibitor of Sevier County.
If a circumstance arrives the Fair Association will determine the decision.
14. Entries are limited in all divisions to one entry per class per person, except livestock can be two per class per person An animal can be shown only once.
15. Clover division (5-8) may enter as many items as they wish. However, premium points will be given on the top[five entries. No "Best of Show" ribbons and money will be given in the division. This is for inside exhibits only!

16. All goats and sheep can not enter grounds until 6:00- 8:00 p.m. Spet. 1. They must be checked for scrapie regulations.
17. **Entering goats and sheep for show will be checked for scrapie regulations only from 6:00-8:00p.m.**
18. Corrections can be allowed by a committee.
19. Junior exhibitors must be unassisted in show rings.
20. The Fair board reserves the right to excuse unruly animals from the grounds.
21. PREMISES TAGS AND INDIVIDUAL TAGS FOR SHOW SWINE IN ARKANSAS:

Basic Principles:

1. Arkansas Exhibition Requirements state that all swine exhibited at any Arkansas fair will have a premises tag including out-of -state swine. Also, out of state swine are required to have an individual identification tag.
2. When a show hog is purchased in state it should have a premises tag in its ear. The premises tag should not be removed. If a show hog is purchased out of state the hog must have a USDA approved ID tag. This tag should not be removed. The out of state hog may also have a USDA approved ID tag. This tag should not be removed. The out of state hog may have a premises tag. If so, this tag should not be removed.
3. All show swine from Arkansas that have a premises tag will also need a USDA approved ID tag (such as an 840 tag) to go to shows out of state. Some out of state exhibitions require an 840 tag. An exhibitor must register his premises with the USDA to be able to purchase 840 tags.
4. All show swine involved in interstate movement must meet the requirements of the receiving state and the USDA Animal Disease Traceability rule.

22. FITTING/GROOMING AND ANIMAL CARE:

1. Fitting, grooming and care of all junior livestock entries is to be performed solely by the exhibitor whose name appears on the entry. The exhibitor must be present at all times during fitting when assistance is being provided. At no time shall an exhibitor provide payment in any form to anyone assisting in the grooming of an animal. Paining of switches, tail heads, topknots and boning of legs are permissible unless prohibited for a specific breed by their respective breed association.

IN-STATE SHOW PIG PURCHASES

1. All breeders of show pigs in Arkansas will have the responsibility of putting permies ID tags in all show pigs sold at time of sale. These tags will remain in the animal's ear for the life of the animal.
2. The breeder will be responsible to report by mail or e-mail to Livestock and Poultry a log of all show pigs sold. The deadline for this is to be submitted by July 1 of the current year. The premises ID Log Form will be available for breeders to download from the Arkansas Livestock and Poultry website (www.alpc.arkansas.gov).
3. The premises ID Log Form shall include the following:
Breeder name, address, phone number, Premises ID Number, PRV # and Brucellosis #; Purchaser name, address, phone number, Breed and Sex, Date of Birth of show pig.

OUT-OF- STATE SHOW PIG PURCHASES

1. All out of state pigs shall meet all the out of state health requirements for interstate shipment to Arkansas.
2. All out of state show pig purchasers will contact the Livestock and Poultry commission to purchase their individual premises ID tag that will remain in the animals ear for the life of that animal. Purchasers will report the out of state breeder's name, address, phone number, PRV#, Brucellosis# and original premises ID of the animal purchased. The animal's sex and breed will need to correspond to the original premises ID of the animal purchased. The animal's sex and breed will need to correspond to the original health paper required upon entry to Arkansas.
3. Premises tags that are requested form Arkansas Livestock and Poultry will cost

the price of the tag plus shipping.

CAUTION

PREMISES TAGS REQUIRED TESTING ARE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE EXHIBITOR. FAILURE TO FOLLOW THESE RULES WILL DISQUALIFY A HOG FOR EXHIBITION IN AN ARKANSAS FAIR.

FINAL RULE

EXHIBITION HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR LIVESTOCK, POULTRY, AND EXOTIC ANIMALS

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

1. CERTIFICATES OF VETERINARY INSPECTION AND ENTRY PERMITS:

“Certificate of veterinary inspection” refers to a legible record (made on an official form insured from the state of origin) by an accredited veterinarian, which shows that the animals listed thereon meet health requirements of the state of destination . it must bear the identification of each animal and separate certificates must be made for each species of animal entered. Entry permits are required on all out-of-state, unless that state has a reciprocal agreement with Arkansas. Permit numbers can be obtained from the state veterinarians office (501) 907-2400 from *:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. A certificate of veterinary inspection must accompany all out-of- state animals; and

(a) Must Be available on request by animal health officials

(b) Individually identify all animals, showing positive identification of each animal by tattoo, ear tag, registration number or ear notch. Steers should be identified by description.

(c) Show required tests, vaccinations, and entry permit number, if applicable.

(d) Show name and address of owner or exhibitor-- this shall be the same name as under which animals are exhibited.

2. Any animal or poultry showing any evidence of infections are contagious disease, or of external pair to scism, and animals with active ringworm lesion (with the resulting loss of hair close parentheses, multiple warts easily visible without close examination, or anthroposophic rhinitis, will not be permitted to exhibit.

3. All animals entering the grounds, including those shown in petsies, children's Barnyard animals, Old MacDonald's Farms, etc. Must meet requirements of their particular species.

4. All animals originating out of areas quarantined because of other diseases open Francis e vesicular stomatitis, scabies, etc.) shall not be permitted to enter the state.

OUT-OF-STATE CATTLE

1. Valid out-of-state Veterinary inspection.

2. Brucellosis requirements:

Heifers that were born on or after January 1st, 1985, that are over 12 months of age and are not Official calf Hood vaccinates will not be allowed to show unless they are from a brucellosis certified free herd or a class 3 State. All females and Bulls 18 months of age and over must have a negative Brucellosis test conducted at a state or federal laboratory within 30 days prior to exhibition.

(a) animals originating out of class free states.

(b) Animals originating out of certified free herds provided that the certified free herd number and test date is recorded on the certificate a veterinarian exception rodeo bulls participating in recognized and organized performance group With a negative test for Brucellosis within 12 months if they are individually identified and accompanied by an entry permit.

3. Tuberculosis requirements:

Animals originating out of quarantine hers or areas will not be permitted to enter the state.

1. All sexually intact dairy cattle 6 months of age and older for Interstate entry into

Arkansas will be required to have a negative tuberculosis test within 60 days prior to

entry.

- a. The same dairy cattle will also be required to have an entry permit and certificate of Veterinary inspection prior to entry, as well as the negative test and must be officially identified.
 - b. Sexually intact dairy cattle under 6 months of age can be permitted under a hold order to direct premise or designated facility and held there until they are tested negative at 6 months of age, at owner's expense.
 - c. The new regulation exempts dairy cattle that originated from accredited free tuberculosis herds (but not free states close parentheses. Neuter Dairy feeder cattle and dairy cows delivered direct to slaughter, or delivered to a market for sale direct to slaughter.
1. Rodeo stock
 - a. All rodeo bulls 12 months of age and older must have a tuberculosis test annually before entry to Arkansas for a rodeo. This requirement applies to all rodeo bulls regardless of their original state area status, and even rodeo bulls from Arkansas. All Bulls must be individually identified with some type of USDA official ID. Out-of-state rodeo bulls are required to have 30-day CVI and an entry permit.
 - b. all roping and dogging steers heifers must have an annual tuberculosis test every 12 months before entry into an Arkansas rodeo. This requirement applies to all steers and Heifers regardless of the origin, state or area status and even steers and Heifers from Arkansas. All Steers have her be individually identified with some type of USDA official ID. All tie down and roping cows are exempt from this regulation. In addition, imbranded (Mexican) steers and Heifers must have two negative annual tests for tuberculosis or one- yearly tests plus a 60-day negative tuberculosis test. Out-of-state steers and Heifers are required to have a 30-day CVI and entry permit.
 2. All breeding beef cattle 12 months of age or older entering Arkansas almost meet one of the following requirements.
 - a. Originated from a tuberculosis free state;
 - b. originate from tuberculosis- free herd. The herd number in current her test date must be shown on the certificate of Veterinary inspection;
 - c. test negative within 60 days of shipment;
 - d. originated from a state having a reciprocal agreement with Arkansas;
 - e. all sexually intact cattle and bison, from any foreign country or part thereof no recognized tuberculosis status comparable to the uniform methods and rules standards of the u.s. bovine tuberculosis eradication program, imported for a reasons other than immediate Slaughter or feeding for Slaughter must meet the following criteria:
 1. obtain a permit issued by Arkansas livestock poultry commission prior to entry; and
 2. The Arkansas premises approved in the entry permit pending two consecutive negative tuberculosis tests. The first test be conducted not less than 90 days nor more than 120 After arrival in the second test do not be less than 210 days normal or than 240 days after the arrival in Arkansas; or
 - f. Importation of steers and spayed heifers from Mexico,
 1. Steers and spayed heifers for Mexican states have been determined by the state veterinarian of Arkansas, based on the recommendations of the by National Committee, now fully implemented the control / Preparatory phrase of the Mexican tuberculosis eradication program Mater Arkansas provided they have been tested negative for tuberculosis in accordance with the Norma oficial Mexicana within 60 days of prior to entry into the United States and obtain entry permit prior to entering Arkansas.
 2. deers in Spayed heifers for Mexican states that been determined by the State Veterinary to Arkansas, based on the recommendation of the by National Committee to have fully implemented Zariah case in face of the Mexican tuberculosis eradication program by March 1st, 1997, may enter Arkansas provided they have been tested negative for tuberculosis and a cord with a Norma Oficial Mexicana Within 60 days

prior to entry of the United States. Steers and spayed heifers are equal to us accredited tuberculosis free herds in Arkansas without testing provided they are moved directly from the herd of origin across the border as a single group and not coming gold with other cattle prior to arriving at the border and obtaining entry prior to entering Arkansas.

3. Steers and spayed heifers for Mexican states that have been determined by the state veterinarian of Arkansas based on the recommendation of the by National Committee, do you have achieved accredited free Status me in Arkansas without testing provided they are moved as a single group and not commingled with cattle of different status prior to arriving to the border and obtain an entry permit prior to entering Arkansas.
4. Holstein and Holstein cross steers Spade heifers from Mexico are prohibited from entering Arkansas for regardless of test history.
5. Running has stopped for Mexico must be tested negative for tuberculosis within 60 days prior to the utilization as Rodeo or roping stock under the supervision of USDA/APHIS Port veterinarian or USA credit bureau veterinarian, read tested for tuberculosis every 12 months thereafter, and obtain an entry permit prior to entering Arkansas. No sexually intact Rodeo stock from Mexico will be permitted in Arkansas.
6. Rodeo stock from any state that has lost its tuberculosis accreditation must be tested negative for tuberculosis within 60 days prior to their utilization as a rodeo or rubbing stock Andre tested for tuberculosis every 12 months thereafter.
7. The state veterinarian May designate High incidences areas within certain states that must meet additional import restrictions and retest requirements.

OUT-OF-STATE SWINE

1. As of July 1, 2001, an official identification and individual identification.
2. valid certificate of Veterinary inspection
3. permit number
4. Brucellosis requirements:

Negative brucellosis test on all intact males (i.e., Barrows excluded) and females six months of age and older, within 30 days prior to the exhibition. Animals originating directly out of validated brucellosis free hearth, with a validated free herd number and the date of last test on the certificate, and the animals from the swine brucellosis free states are exempt from testing requirements.

5. Pseudorabies requirements:

Negative pseudorabies Test, regardless of age, within 30 days prior to exhibition. Animals originating out of pseudo rabies qualified herds with the qualified her number on the certificate, and animals from pseudo rabies free states are exempt from testing.

OUT-OF-STATE SHEEP AND GOATS

All sheep and goats entering Arkansas for excavations shall meet the requirements for entry into Arkansas. all sheep and goats imported or exhibited within the state of Arkansas must be identified by an official USDA tag or for goats a legible official goat registry tattoo if a company buys a registration certificate. all sheep and goats are exhibited with an Arkansas must have a certificate of Veterinary inspection within 30 days of exhibition.

Excavation officials must maintain records of all sheep and goats that are exhibited for a. Of 5 years to include:

- a. identification number
- b. flock status as defined by the voluntary flock certification program.
- c. the name, complete address and phone number of the owner.

Fair Personnel, veterinarians or federal state Personnel May examine sheep on grounds. Any sheep showing clinical symptoms of scrapie shall be immediately quarantined and isolated and required to undergo any approved diagnostic tests and shall be signed to slaughter or destruction with submission of tissues to an improved diagnostic laboratory at the exhibitor's expense.

Commingling (as defined by the Arkansas Scrapie regulation) Of sheep or goats of different flock status as defined by voluntary flock certification program is prohibited and

must be reported to the V FCP state official and state veterinarian.

no sheep or goats are showing symptoms of a disease, particularly footrot, sore mouth, sheep pox, evidence of fungal infection, evidence of abscesses or with draining abscess will be allowed to show and may be released by Fair officials, veterinarians, or state – Federal personnel.

OUT-OF-STATE HORSES

1. Valid certificate of Veterinary inspection with individual identification and a rectal temperature reading on each animal.
2. A negative eia test must have been conducted on all equidae over 6 months of age within 12 months prior to excavation, in the eia test papers must be accompanied with a certificate. Nursing foals under 6 months of age are exempt from testing if accommodated by negative tested dams. (photocopies of the test papers will be not acceptable - legible carbon copies will be acceptable.)

OUT-OF-STATE RATITES

1. All ratites must have a negative test for avian influenza within 30 days prior to entry in exhibition unless a state of emergency has been declared. they must be individually Identified with a form of permanent identification and listed on a certificate of Veterinary inspection with an entry permit number.

OUT-OF-STATE CERVIDS

1. the regulations for the importation of cervids Lies with the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission
2. Brucellosis:
All cervidae over 6 months of age shall have a negative test for brucellosis within 30 days or an original form of certified brucellosis- free cervid herd or originate from brucellosis-monitored Cervid herd within 90 days prior to movement.
3. Tuberculosis:
 - a. All cervidae she'll have two negative single cervical tuberculosis test conducted no less than 90 days part, with the second test conducted within 90 days prior to movement; or originated from an accredited credited tuberculosis free cervid heard; or originated from a qualified tuberculosis free cervid herd with a negative test conducted 90 days prior to movement, except that cervidae Under 12 months from a qualified heard are exempt from testing; or originated from a monitor tuberculosis cervid her with a negative tuberculosis test with 90 days prior to movement, except that cervidae Under 12 months from a monitor herd are exempt from testing.

OUT-OF-STATE CAMELIDS

1. individually identified, invalid certificate of Veterinary inspection within 30 days
2. permit number
3. registration papers when accompanied by a registry photograph of the animal are acceptable identification.

OUT-OF-STATE RABBITS

No certificate of Veterinary inspection required. inspection will be made on grounds. No rabbits showing symptoms of disease will be allowed to show.

OUT-OF-STATE POULTRY

1. All poultry, which includes game birds, quill, pheasant, peafowl, turkeys and all waterfowl shall have originated from US Pullorum clean flock or have a negative pullorum Pass within 90 days of Entry. All turkeys that also have originated from a US mg clean flock or have a negative mg test within 30 days of Entry. all the preceding information must be documented or a valid certificate of Veterinary inspection, NPIP flock certification for similar certificate. These forms must indicate that the flocks from which the eggs or chicks originated have been tested for pullorum disease and were

free of reactors; or, any eggs or chicks or poults produce under the supervision of the national poultry Improvement plan will be deemed to have met the requirements of these regulations, provided all the requirements of NPIP are complied with an applicable NPIP forms a company birds and all non- certified poultry must be individually identified, either by a permanent leg or Wing band or tattoo. Wrap- around plastic bands are not acceptable. NPIP Certified flock certification form or singular certificate are exempt from the requirements of a certificate of Veterinary inspection unless a state of emergency has been declared.

ARKANSAS LIVESTOCK COUNTY, DISTRICT, STATE FAIR LEVEL, AND OTHER SHOWS

1. all animals entering the grounds, including those showing in pet zoos, children's Barnyard animals, Old MacDonald's Farm, ECT., must meet the requirements of their particular species.
2. Arkansas's livestock (except Arkansas sheep, goats, horses, steers and rabbits) must be accompanied by a certificate of Veterinary inspection issued within 90 days prior to excavation, showing the following:

ARKANSAS CATTLE

1. If Arkansas is a class Free State, Arkansas cattle are exempt from brucellosis testing. If Arkansas is not a class free state then the following testing requirements must be met: negative brucellosis test within 90 days prior to excavation, for females and Bulls 18 months of age and over. all heifers that have calved or are bred must be tested. Animals originating from certified brucellosis free herd are exempt if the certified free herd number is shown on the certificate.
2. All heifers that are 4 to 12 months of age shall be vaccinated before entering show.
3. Heifers that were born on January 1, 1985, that are over 12 months of age and are not official calfhood vaccinated will not be allowed to show (unless they are from a brucellosis certified free herd.) this will not apply if Arkansas continues as a free brucellosis free state.
4. All Rodeo stock exhibited at a rodeo in Arkansas must meet the out of state requirements for brucellosis and tuberculosis for 12 months and older pools, roping and dogging steers and Heifers even if Rodeo stock originated from Arkansas. Tie-down roping calves are exempt from the tuberculosis testing. The exception is a CVI within the state is good for 90 days instead of 30 days.

ARKANSAS SWINE

1. As of July 1, 2001, all swine must have an official premise identification.
2. Animals 6 months or older to be tested negative for brucellosis within 90 days of exhibition were originated directly out of a validated herd, what's validation number in date of last heard Test shown on certificate.
3. Animals to be tested negative for pseudorabies regardless of age within 90 days of excavation on a test approved by the state veterinarian or originate directly out of a qualified pseudorabies free herd, with qualified her number and date of last test shown on certificate.
4. Free of other contagious, infectious, communicable diseases (erysipelas, atrophic rhinitis); otherwise they will not be allowed to show and will be released from Fairgrounds.

ARKANSAS SHEEP AND GOATS

Excavation officials must maintain records of all sheep and goats that are exhibited for a period of 5 years, to include:

- a. Identification number
- b. Flock status as defined by the voluntary flock certification program
- c. the name, complete address and phone number of the owner.
- d. All in-state sheep and goats in the state of Arkansas must be identified by ficial USDA (scrapie tag) or for goats a legible official goat registry Tattoo if accompanied by a registration certificate.

Fair personnel, veterinarians, or state federal Personnel may examine sheep on grounds. Any sheep showing clinical symptoms of Scrapie shall be immediately quarantined in isolation and required to undergo any approved diagnostic tests and shall be consigned to slaughter or destruction as submission of tissues to an approved diagnostic laboratory at the exhibitors expense.

Commingling (as defined by the Arkansas Scrapie Regulation) of sheep or goats up to different flock status as defined by the voluntary flock certification program is prohibited and must be reported to the V FCP state official and state veterinarian.

No sheep or goats showing symptoms of disease, particularly foot rot, sore mouth, sheep pox, evidence of fungal infection, evidence of abscesses or with draining abscesses will be allowed to show and may be released by Fair officials, veterinarians, or state federal personnel.

ARKANSAS RABBITS

Rabbits will be inspected on grounds. No rabbit showing symptoms of disease will be allowed to show.

ARKANSAS HORSES

Negative EIA Tests will be required within the past 12 months for all animals over 6 months of Age. Nursing foals under 6 months of age are exempt from testing if a company by negative test dams. photocopies of the test papers will not be accepted, carbon copies are acceptable.

ARKANSAS CERVIDS

1. Certificate of Veterinary inspection.
2. Negative cervical tuberculosis test within 90 days.
3. Negative brucellosis test within 90 days.
4. Originate from a certified brucellosis free and accredited tuberculosis free Cervid herd.
5. or originated from brucellosis monitored and qualified tuberculosis cervid herd within 90 days of exhibition.

ARKANSAS CAMELIDS

1. Individually identified, and certificate of Veterinary inspection within 90 days of exhibition.
2. registration papers when a company buys a registry photograph of the animal are acceptable identification.

ARKANSAS RATITES

1. Certificate of Veterinary inspection.
2. Negative Avian Influenza test within 90 days.
3. Permanent identification.

ARKANSAS POULTRY

An official representing the exhibition shall notify the state veterinarian no later than 30 days prior to the exhibition, giving names, place, inclusive dates, and the time of the event. the requirements are as follows:

1. All in state poultry, which includes domesticated game birds, quail, pheasant, peafowl, Guineas, and her keys, present at exhibition in Arkansas she'll have originated from U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean or equivalent Flocks or have a negative Pullorum-Typhoid Test within 90 days of the movement to exhibition (pullorum-typhoid Testing on Fairgrounds during the fair is prohibited.) This information will be documented on a NPIP form VS 9 - 3, 90 de certificate, NPIP flock certification form or similar certificate which will accompany the poultry during exhibition.
2. all non certified Birds must be banded (leg or Wing band), with a sealed band. Wraparound classic bands are not acceptable. In-State Waterfowl are exempt from Pullorum-Typhoid requirements.
3. Any poultry showing evidence of infectious or contagious disease or insect infestation will not be permitted to exhibit.
4. Record keeping – the sponsor of the exhibition shall compile a list of all poultry present at exhibition. This list shall contain the name and address of each owner, the

number, the species, breed, variety, type, sex, and Pullorum-Typhoid status of all poultry present. A copy of this shall be retained by the sponsor of the exhibition for at least 12 months.

SHEEP AND GOATS: (Federal Office: 501-224-9515)

Cheaper goats may be imported in Arkansas that do not originate from a consistent state, unless originating from a completely monitored scrapie flock enrolled in the voluntary Scrapie Flock Certification program. All sheep and goats imported or exhibited within the state of Arkansas must be identified by official USDA tag, legible official goat registry tattoo if accompanied by a registration certificate, or other approved device that contains a premise identification issued by the state of origin in combination with a unique animal number.

No sheep or goats may be imported in Arkansas that have commingled (as defined by Arkansas Scrapie Regulations) With sheep or goats that are not officially identified in compliance with the Arkansas Scrapie regulations prior to importation. Commingling of sheep or goats of different flock status as defined by the voluntary flock certification program must be reported to the VFCP state official and state veterinarian.

Animals that are exempt from this section of the regulation are as follows:

1. Feeders under 18 months of age or later movement to slaughter.
2. non-registered meat type goats, brush goats and castrated sheep and goats under 18 months of age.

No sheep or goats that are infected with or exposed to scrapie, and no progeny of sheep or goat infected with or exposed to scrapie, maybe moved into Arkansas without the permission of the Arkansas livestock and poultry Commission and its official permit granted. All sheep and goats imported in Arkansas shall be accompanied by a certificate of Veterinary inspection and shall meet the scrapie record requirement, which must be documented in addition to the certificate of Veterinary inspection. Any sheep or goats in violation of the entry requirements shall be in isolation and be required to undergo any approved diagnostic test for scrapie and shall be sold for Slaughter with tissues submitted for scrapie diagnosis at the expense of the owner.

LIVESTOCK RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. All animals entering the fairgrounds must meet the health requirements, according to the Arkansas livestock and poultry commission, for their particular species.
2. Registration papers must be shown for all entries in the registered classes.
3. animals must be owned by exhibitors by July 1.
4. all livestock, except sheep, goats, and steers, must be accompanied by a health certificate issued within 90 days prior to exhibition.
5. all animals will be subject to a visual inspection.
6. Entries in beef, swine, sheep and goats are limited to two entries per person per class.
7. Bulls over one year old must have a nose ring and Lead.
8. Animals with warts or ringworms are not eligible to show.
9. Cattle from certified herds will need proper papers only.
10. All cattle will have a class of Their Own.
11. Grand Champion will be selected from the first place winners.

12. Reserve Champion will be selected from the first place winners in the second place winner from the grand champion class.
13. all cattle exhibited by eligible use at Sevier County Fair will be eligible to participate in the Showmanship activity with the exception of bulls over 1 year old. Pulled over one year old will be excluded. open only to youth exhibiting cattle in their names.
14. Display should have no sharp objects.
15. Cattle, sheep, swine, and goats not shown in the show ring will be disqualified.
16. **No animal with horns will be allowed to show with the exception of breeds that require horns.**
17. All animals entered in the junior division are to be shown by youth exhibiting them unless unavoidable circumstances forbid their presents, and in which case, the animal may be shown by a youth who is still a junior exhibitor. if circumstances arise the fair Association will determine the decision.

The commercial Heifer Improvement Project is designed to improve the commercial cow/calf industry of Sevier County through recognition of outstanding commercial females and encouraging exhibitors to strive to identify and raise the best commercial females possible. In doing so, the quality and reputation of commercial cattle produced in Sevier county will continue to improve.

To be eligible for Sevier County Cattlemen's Association premiums in the Junior Commercial Heifer Show, the following rules must be met:

1. Heifers must be born and bred either in Sevier County or on the exhibitors home farm or ranch.
2. Heifers must be present at the Sevier County fairgrounds on Saturday Aug. 15 between the hours 9:00 am and 11:00 am for weighing and visual appraisal by SCCA heifer committee personnel.
3. Heifers must weigh a minimum of 450 pounds at that time. Calf must lead unassisted from trailer Aug. 15.
4. Exhibitors must furnish a statement of breeding of heifer at that time. Statement must include sire and dam's breeding, date of birth of heifer, color of heifer, statement of origin and be signed by the breeder of said animal. Photos will be taken of the heifer with the exhibitor at that time.
5. Amount of SCCA premiums and disbursement of SCCA Premiums is the sole responsibility of the Sevier County Cattlemen's Association. Exhibitors may show more heifer, but will receive SCCA premium on only one heifer ( the one placing the highest in the show. )

OBJECTIVES: To foster youth development through livestock projects by :

1. Developing sense of fair play and self-discipline
2. Learning record keeping and management practices
3. Understanding economics and agriculture
4. Developing personal pride and leadership qualities.

### **Rules for the Sevier County Fair Junior Livestock Premium Sale**

1. Exhibitors must be a FFA or 4-H member in good standing. Exhibitors must be at least 9 years of age by the opening day of the Arkansas State Fair of the Current year. Exhibitors may exhibit no later than the fall after graduating. Exhibitors must not be married or ever such. Exhibitors projects must be under the supervision of the Vo-Ag teacher or the County Agent and/or Extension Home Economist.
2. Premium sale participants must be identified by official state ear tag. Lambs, pigs, steers, and goats must be tagged by the County Agent or Vo-Ag teacher by state deadline. If the exhibitor is a 4-H member, the form must be signed by a county agent. FFA member forms must be signed by a county agent or FFA teacher.
3. Animals from the steer, market hog, market lamb, market goat, register heifer and register bull

classes are eligible for this sale. These animals must also meet the eligibility requirements set forth in the livestock rules and regulations. An exhibitor may sell two animals in the sale, providing they make a sale order, but cannot sell two lambs, two steers, two goats, or two hogs, two heifers, or two bulls.

4. The sale order will be selected from each class at the discretion of the judge. The judge has the right to excuse any animal because of low quality. The judges selections are final.

***Exhibitors must be present at time for sale order selection.***

***Exhibitor will be called three times after the third call. The exhibitor loses place for the sale order.***

5. Exhibitors must live in Sevier County or attend school in Sevier County.
6. **All exhibitors must have thank you notes turned in by December 1 of each year following the county fair, if not the money will be turned over by next year premium sale funds.**
7. The number of animals to be included in the sale are as follows
