16. Litigation permeates our society. Answer these questions, which give indication of the major influence of litigation on the world of Trivia.

MOVIES: In the mid-1960's, the members of the United States Supreme Court would sit in a darkened room viewing soft- and hard-core pornography (and doing God knows what else) trying to determine whether certain films were violative of obscenity restrictions. In explaining the reason for doing this, what Supreme Court Justice, in a concurring opinion in Jacobellis v. Ohio, 378 U.S. 184 (1964), reviewing the film Les Aimant, stated "perhaps I could never succeed in intelligibly [defining pornography]. But I know it when I see it"?

TELEVISION: Recent litigation between General William Westmoreland and CBS is expected to result in a seminal decision by the Supreme Court with respect to the law of defamation. The basis for the suit is that the General was accused of doctoring the figures which were released to the press in the Vietnam War (Hey, isn't the truth an absolute defense?). This accusation was made on what CBS documentary special?

MUSIC: In the late-1970's, former Beatle George Harrison was hauled into Court for his wrongful appropriation of a prior hit by the Chiffons, which he reused for "My Sweet Lord". George lost the decision and was required to pay damages for copyright infringement. What was the Chiffon's song from which he stole the tune?

SPORTS: In the early 1960's, this athlete was the subject of contractual litigation as a result of his signing with teams from both the NFL and AFL. After resolution of the dispute by the Courts, he had a long career in the new league. In the early 1980's, he again gained legal notoriety. After resolution by the Courts (plea bargaining), he is now in the middle of a long career at a Federal penitentiary for counterfeiting. Name this award-winning football player.

COMIX: Recently, Harvey Comics filed suit against Columbia Pictures for trademark infringement. It is alleged the movie studio used an advertising symbol of the comic book's, a minor comic book character, in the logo advertising one of the studio's films. The only people who don't believe Harvey has a basis for a claim are either blind or have been retained as legal counsel for Columbia. Name the movie in question.
