The Quiet Americans: Four CIA Spies at the Dawn of the Cold War – A Tragedy in Three Acts by Scott Anderson. A gripping history of the early years of the Cold War, the CIA's covert battles against communism, and the tragic consequences which still affect America and the world today

The One Hundred Years of Lenni and Margot by Marianne Cronin. An extraordinary friendship. A lifetime of stories. Life is short. Living on the terminal ward, Lenni joins an art class, and bumps into fellow patient Margot ...

The Sentence by Louise Erdrich. In this stunning and timely novel, Pulitzer Prize and National Book Award-winning author Louise Erdrich creates a wickedly funny ghost story, a tale of passion, of a complex marriage, and of a woman's relentless errors.

The Princeton Field Guide to Prehistoric Mammals by Donald R. Prothero, Mary Persis Williams (Illustrator). After the mass extinction of the dinosaurs 65 million years ago, mammals became the dominant terrestrial life form on our planet. The ultimate illustrated field guide to the lost world of spectacular beasts such as saber-toothed cats, giant mastodonts, immense ground sloths, and gigantic giraffe-like rhinoceroses.

Wonderful Adventures of Mrs. Seacole in Many Lands by Mary Seacole and W.J.S.(1857) Considered by some as one of the best non-fiction books ever, the autobiography of a Jamaican-born British entrepreneur who opens a hotel in 1850s Crimea to nurse and comfort the wounded as they await their ships home. Her struggles with race, finances, and acceptance of her work as a "doctress". Available as a download Kindle book from Project Gutenberg (www.gutenberg.org). **** AND, Mrs. Seacole is featured in the latest Dr. Who season (S13, the Flux) !!
