Reading Recommendations: Masters of Mystery

Mysteries and Detective Thrillers are featured on many streaming services available on our televisions (see PBS Passport, BritBox, Prime, Netflix ...). Several of these feature the masters and their creations:

Lord Peter Wimsey Dorothy Sayers

Agatha Christie Miss Marple

& Hercule Poirot & others

G.K. Chesterton Father Brown

These three authors formed the Detection Club in London in 1930 with 14 other authors. They agreed to an oath, constructed by Dorothy Sayers, promising "that [our] detectives shall well and truly detect the crimes presented to them using those wits which it may please you to bestow upon them and not placing reliance on nor making use of Divine Revelation, Feminine Intuition, Mumbo Jumbo, Jiggery-Pokery, Coincidence or Act of God". Your editor has been reading these authors for the last two years, exploring England and the years between the two world wars, and the culture of England at that time. Mostly he has been getting to know the characters of the four detectives: two who solve mysteries as an avocation, and two who have made it their career. In the books, these characters are much richer than what we see on television.

The good news is that Kitsap Regional Library has most of the works of these authors in book and e-book.
