OCTANE TOUR - Frequently Asked Questions

Where do we start from every morning on the Octane Tour? Each morning Tour participants will meet in the Hotel Parking lot for a Driver's Meeting. At the driver's meeting, Tour participants will be informed of weather conditions, any delays or changes in the Tour route, any changes to the day's itinerary, etc.

Do we have to follow the mapped route on the Octane Tour?

Each morning you have the option of starting from the drivers' meeting, and from there it is up to you what route you follow. We pre-run the route prior to Octane Tour and release the driving directions but note those directions may be subject to change for road closures in the event we are notified. Check the Octane Tour Facebook Page frequently for updates in the weeks prior to the Tour. The final version of the driving directions you will be supplied with when you register will be as up to date as possible. However, note that construction pops up frequently, so be sure to allow for that and follow any posted detour signs. The driving directions we supply are a suggested mapped route for each day, but it is not mandatory that they be followed. If you want to hit some local landmark that is not on the mapped route, please feel free to!

Can I bring my pet or animal on the Octane Tour?

We recommend that you do not bring your pets. The Octane Tour stops are usually held on asphalt and it does get very, very warm. It is unfair to the animal, and it is respectful to Octane Tour fellow participants and spectators to leave the animals at home.

I am traveling by myself. Do I meet up with someone to run with between cities?

Yes, it is encouraged that you employ the buddy system. It is always a good idea to pair up with at least one other participant so you can help each other out if the need arises along the way.
