Help us find and celebrate great home gardens!

The Community Beautification Awards committee has commenced its search for the best Kent gardens of 2025

Since 1971, The Garden Club of Kent has been conferring Community Beautification Awards annually to recognize great home gardens. The program honors good stewardship of the land and recognizes aesthetics, creativity and maintenance as well as sound environmental practices.

Preference is given to gardens located in Kent, but consideration will be given to gardens in adjacent towns if a winner is not selected in Kent.

Professionally designed gardens are acceptable, but the gardens must be maintained by the owners.

Nominations open May 15-Aug. 15

Nominations will be accepted May 15 – Aug. 15, 2025. You can download a complete entry packet from The Garden Club of Kent website at www.gardenclubofkent.org, or request the submission packet from BackyardPest@gmail.com. Instructions for submitting in your nomination will be included in the packet.

Accompanying your nomination must be at least three (3) photographs of the garden you are nominating, preferably at its peak.

Our judges much prefer to see gardens at their peaks to make the most accurate evaluation, so if the nominated garden is peaking in mid-June, then the nomination should be made in time for that to happen.

How are nominations generated?

Neither nominees nor nominators are are required to be members of The Garden Club of Kent. You can nominate your own garden or a fellow gardener — or both! Only two nominations per person are accepted, and please note that you can only nominate your own garden once, in one category.

If you know of a great garden but don't want to make the nomination yourself, let the Community Beautification Awards committee know and we'll take it from there. We make it our business to scour the town looking for interesting gardens. You can contact the committee by sending an email to BackyardPest@gmail.com.

Award Categories

Community Beautification Awards are made in the following categories. Nominated gardens must be residential.

- Front Yard Garden
- Side Yard Garden
- Backyard Garden
- Small Space / Container Garden
- Woodland & Deep Shade Garden
- Home Vegetable Garden
- Wildlife Habitat Garden
- Youth Garden*
- Best Overall Garden**

*Eligible for Youth Garden are children ages 5-17 who maintain a garden with minimal assistance; youth organizations maintaining gardens; and K-12 school gardens.

We confer an award for **Best Overall Garden, but this is not a nomination category. Best Overall is selected by our judges from among the nominations in all categories.

Judging

Each nominated garden will be evaluated by two judges: a nationally accredited horticulture judge and a master gardener. The same judges will evaluate all gardens nominated in each category.

Gardens are judged in five general areas:

- Overall attractiveness
- Plant selection
- Design and functionality
- Maintenance
- Individual efforts

Some categories have specific criteria, which are explained in the packet.

Winners

Winners will be announced at the club's monthly dinner meeting on Monday, Oct. 27 at 6:30 pm at The Garden Club of Kent, 480 Ravenna Rd., Streetsboro. Winners enjoy a free dinner and complimentary one-year Garden Club of Kent membership as well as an attractive award plaque.

We do not disclose publicly the address of winners' gardens, but we do announce winners' names and feature photographs of the gardens in our monthly newsletter and on our website and Facebook page.

What are the judges looking for?

You don't have to meet all these criteria to win an award! This is a list of the range of attributes judges will note. Gardens can be very successful and award-winning without checking many of the boxes.

OVERALL ATTRACTIVENESS

- Curb appeal
- Pleasing color, form, texture and contour
- Decor enhances garden/ doesn't take away interest from plants
- Beauty, creativity and effective design
- Plants are well maintained
- Weeds kept to a minimum

APPROPRIATE PLANT SELECTION

- Preference for natives
- Preference for perennials
- Functional landscape
- Pollinator/ bird/ butterfly friendly preferred
- Organically grown
- Range and diversity
- Continuous show of seasonal plants

DESIGN AND FUNCTIONALITY

- Functional layout
- Plant coverage
- Eco-friendly/ Habitat for wildlife
- Takes advantage of site features like water and shade
- Water use/ conservation
- Companion planting
- Meets needs of owners
- Plants appropriately places according to color/height/needs
- Sustainability practices/use of natural resources
- Edible/ culinary plants, veggies, herbs

MAINTENANCE

- · Mulch if needed
- Minimal weeds
- Adequate supports/ stakes when necessary
- Plants are neat and tidy

- Plant health and production; minimal disease/ infestation
- Cleanliness/ free of debris
- Preference for organic weed and pest control
- Paths are clear/ mostly clear

INDIVIDUAL EFFORTS/ UNIQUE ASPECTS

- Stand-out qualities that make the garden unique
- Personal touches (meaningful items/ plants/ decor)
- Special features like waterfalls or rock arches
- Uncommon plants
- Evidence of good gardening practices

COMMUNITY BEAUTIFICATION AWARDS

Judging notes for special categories

WILDLIFE HABITAT

- Primarily native plants
- Shelter, water, and food sources provided for plants and animals
- Organic

YOUTH GARDENS

- Youth ages 5-17 are eligible as long as they are maintaining a garden with minimal assistance
- Gardens maintained by youth organizations and school classrooms

VEGETABLE GARDENS

- Variety of vegetables and other plants
- Efficiency and amount of food produced will be taken into account

WOODLAND/SHADE GARDENS

- Focus on native plants
- Variety of plants and plant materials
- Provision of habitat (water, food sources, shelter)
- Intentionality of design
- Hardscaping and tableaux

SMALL SPACE & CONTAINER GARDENS

- Maximum and creative use of a small space (for instance, vertical gardening)
- Combination of plant types and appropriateness for location
- Proportionality and pleasing aesthetics
- For container gardens, good aesthetics in selection of plant vessels

BEST OVERALL

The Garden Club of Kent does not accept nominations in this category. The winner is selected from the nominees in all categories.

Gardeners who have most, if not all of the following categories:

- Flowers/ pollinator friendly areas
- Food production (veggies/ fruits)
- Herbs and other culinary plants
- Animals for food production or ones that are beneficial for garden maintenance
