AGENCY ADMINISTRATORS



ADMINISTRATORS understand quality training is paramount in the delivery of first responder services in their communities. Their agencies' training managers therefore must receive current and important police training information to give their officers the tools to better serve their community.

In studies conducted after lawsuits such as the Christopher Commission report, departments that did not look outside their own in-house training for new alternative training methods were criticized. A closed-shop system does not work. Networking with other agencies gives growth of knowledge and broader perspective to training your agency's personnel.



POST CONSULTANTS participate in all our meetings. The local POST Consultant attends each meeting with updates on POST mandates and training requirements. POST Consultants are happy to answer any questions to support your training managers.

MEETINGS AND WORKSHOPS
