POST ADVISORY COMMITTEE has granted CPTMA a seat on the their committee that directly advises the POST Commissioners. This important position allows our member departments to have a voice on the POST Commission that oversee POST mandates and the direction of POST oversight on your agency. CPTMA's representative attends all CPTMA meetings to report to POST all your concerns.

NETWORKING with other area training managers from large and small agencies continues to be a main learning tool for CPTMA members. Contact information is shared freely at our meetings. By working with each other we all benefit .

POST CERTIFIED PRESENTER CPTMA holds a POST Presenter number to present POST certified training in our area for your officers to attend and receive POST certified hours toward ongoing CPT training hours. This includes reserve training requirements.



AGENCY ADMINISTRATORS

ADMINISTRATORS understand that hiring the right person, then giving them the best quality training is paramount in the delivery of first responder services in their communities. The agencies' trainers therefore must receive current and important training information to give their officers the tools to better serve their community during calls for service.

In studies conducted after lawsuits such as the Christopher Commission report, departments that did not look outside their own in-house training for new alternative training methods were criticized. A closed-shop system does not work. Networking with other agencies gives growth of knowledge and broader perspective to training your agency's personnel.



POST CONSULTANTS participate in all our meetings. The local POST Consultant attends each meeting with updates on POST mandates and training requirements. POST Consultants are happy to answer any questions to support your training managers.

MEETINGS AND WORKSHOPS

CPTMA has a strong membership due to the networking at all our quarterly meetings. Local area workshops of 4-hours to 8-hours on current trends allow personnel to attend without major travel expense or time loss to their job duties.
