

Mrs. Tammie T. Perry is a Records and Information Management Specialist at U.S. Coast Guard Headquarters. She is responsible for developing, implementing, coordinating and training military and civilian personnel on compliance with the Federal Records Act, federal laws, regulations and mandates pertaining to Federal Agency Records Management while administering current program policies and procedures.

Mrs. Perry retired from the U.S. Navy in 2011, after 22 years of honorable service. Her tours of duty included USS Monongahela (A0-178); Fleet Mail Center Norfolk, VA; USS Canopus (AS-34); USS Shenandoah (AD-44); Naval Amphibious Base Little Creek, VA; USS Whidbey Island (LSD-41); Joint Military Postal Agency-Pacific Honolulu, HI; USS Nitze (DDG-94) and Fleet Industrial Supply Center (FISC)/ Regional Navy Mail Center (RNMC) Norfolk, VA.

After her transition from military service, she accepted a position as a Manpower and Training Coordinator for Northrop Grumman and McKean Defense Group. She oversaw training and certification programs for ships and crewmembers during their Midlife, Modernization and Pre-Commissioning cycles, identified deficits and developed an efficient cost-effective program in support of future requirements.

Mrs. Perry began her career in the federal civil service with the U.S. Coast Guard December 2015 as a Postal Operations Specialist. Her efforts contributed to the U.S. Coast Guard receiving the Top DHS Mail Management award for four consecutive years.

She was selected by COMDT CG-6 to serve as the Action Officer for the White House Minority Servicing Institute (MSI) Initiative with Virginia State University spearheading outreach programs that promote both military and civilian career opportunities and advocating for a more diverse and talented workforce.

She is an affianced member of the Leadership and Diversity Advisory Council (LDAC), Morale and Welfare Committee and the Parent-Teacher Student Organization (PTSO). She also volunteers at the local Middle School and High School supporting events to raise funds and better community relations.
