

## MR. DEWAYNE CORBETT SR.

Dewayne Corbett Sr. is a native of Kelly, North Carolina. He enlisted in the United States Army National Guard from 1998 to 2002, serving as a Sergeant (E-5) Armor Crewman (19K20/M1A1) for the E -Troop 196<sup>th</sup> Calvary in North Carolina Army National Guard. In May 2002, he graduated from North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University earning his Bachelor of Science Degree in Manufacturing Systems with Cum Laude Honors and was Commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the United States Army Transportation Corp under the Reserve Officer Training Corps Simultaneous Member Program.



Following graduation from the Transportation Officer Basic Course Fort Eustis, Va. Mr., Corbett's initial assignment was 3<sup>rd</sup> Platoon Leader for the 70<sup>th</sup> Transportation Medium Truck Company, 28<sup>th</sup> Transportation Battalion, 37<sup>th</sup> Transportation Brigade, 21<sup>st</sup> Theater Sustainment Command in Kaiserslautern, Germany. In 2003, he was assigned as Assistant Installation Coordinator for 28<sup>th</sup> Transportation Battalion, Coleman Barracks in Mannheim, Germany. In 2004, Mr. Corbett volunteered to deploy to Kuwait in support of OPERATION IRAQI FREEDOM. During this deployment, he was assigned as Maintenance Platoon Leader in 1836<sup>th</sup> Transportation Combat HET Company. In July 2004, he served as a Platoon Leader for the 66<sup>th</sup> Transportation Medium Truck Company at Forward Operating Base Speicher in Tikrit, IRAQ. In 2005, he was assigned to 1<sup>st</sup> Transportation Movement Control Agency in Kaiserslautern, Germany as the Assistant S-3/Mobility Officer. In 2006, First Lieutenant (P) Dewayne Corbett made the selection list for promotion to Captain. In 2007, Mr. Corbett separated from active duty Army as conclusion of his duty.

In May of 2009, Mr. Corbett entered into a career in Civil Service for the Federal Government as a Traffic Management Specialist with the Marine Corps Logistics Command (LOGCOM) in Albany, Georgia. In September 2010, Mr. Corbett was promoted to Supervisory Traffic Management Specialist, Deputy Director Transportation Execution Division; Government Service Twelve (GS-12). In October 2014, Mr. Corbett graduated from Webster University earning his Master of Arts Degree in Management and Leadership. In December 2014, Mr. Corbett serves as a Traffic Management Specialist in the position of Lead Exercise and Logistics Planner for 39<sup>th</sup> Transportation Battalion, 16<sup>th</sup> Sustainment Brigade, and 21<sup>st</sup> Theater Sustainment Command in Kaiserslautern, Germany. Currently, Mr. Corbett is the Transportation Program Manager for the Logistics Program Management Division (CG-441), Office of Logistics (CG-44), Engineering and Logistics Directorate (CG-4), United States Coast Guard, Department of Homeland Security in Washington, D.C.
