



Application Record Copies and Existing, Unrestricted, Supporting Documentation for Record Copies

The DAR uses the term “record copy” for a reproduction of an approved membership application paper or a copy of an approved supplemental application paper. A “supplemental application” is a, additional form that a member files tracing her lineage back to an ancestor different from the on whom she joined on her original application.

The term “documentation” refers to the supporting materials that came with an application or supplemental application. The older the application is there is a greater likelihood that no documentation now survives. In the years before easy access to photocopy machines (roughly the 1960s), many members requested that their documentation be returned to them. The DAR honored these requests until about 1984. As a result, prior to 1984, a major percentage of applications and supplementals do not have supporting documentation. After that date, all documentation should be present with some exceptions. The DAR does not guarantee that documentation within these files will meet today’s genealogical standards and will be acceptable for current or future DAR applications or supplemental applications.

“Restricted” documentation is material, such as vital records, that is less than 100 years old. The DAR does not make such documents available for copying or for research under any circumstances. Vital records for a number of states are available online through a variety of websites. For those records that are not online, researchers must contact the appropriate state office to obtain such copies under state laws and the restrictions that will apply

I Stella Corcoran White being of the age of eighteen years and upwards, hereby apply for membership in the Society by right of lineal descent in the following line from William Sanders who was born in Beaufort, North Carolina on the 20 day of Feb., 1760 and died in Jonestown, Alabama on the 15 day of March, 1847. His place of residence during the Revolution was Beaufort North Carolina. I was born in Beassmont, Tex County of Jefferson State of Texas.

2. The said Eliza Norwood Corcoran was the daughter of William F. Norwood born July 21, 1838 died Oct. 25, 1917 and his (1) wife Emily Sanders Norwood born Mch. 5, 1838 died married Nov. 9, 1865

3. The said Emily Sanders Norwood was the daughter of Owen Sanders born 14, 1805 died Jan. 11, 1889 and his (1) wife Rachael Donald Sanders born May 1, 1819 died Feb. 1, 1861 married 1833

4. The said Owen Sanders was the son of David Sanders born 1784 died 1854 and his (1) wife Margaret Fox Sanders born 1781 died 1854 married 1803

5. The said David Sanders was the son of William Sanders born 1760 died 1847 and his (1) wife Patience Benthall Sanders born 1765 died 1831 married 1783

And he, the said William Sanders is the ancestor who assisted in establishing American Independence, while acting in the capacity of Lieutenant, Private & Sergeant

*Wife in every instance in this paper means legal and lawful wife.

Date of marriage may be substituted for dates of birth and death where such date proves the soldier to have been living during the Revolution and of a suitable age for service. Resolution adopted by the Twenty-fourth Continental Congress: Descendants of polygamous marriage are not acceptable as members of this Society.

Any woman not less than eighteen years of age, who is descended from a man or woman who gave unfailing loyal service to the cause of American Independence as a recognized patriot, soldier, sailor, or civil officer, in one of the several Colonies or States, or of the United Colonies or States, is eligible to membership in the National Society, Daughters of the American Revolution; *provided* she is personally acceptable.

Official proof of service must be furnished with the application; also references to authorities quoted, to show line of descent. *Where reference is made to unpublished or inaccessible records, the applicant must file duplicate certified copies of same.* Statements based upon tradition alone cannot be considered.

ANCESTOR'S SERVICES

My ancestor's services in assisting in the establishment of American Independence during the War of the Revolution were as follows:

William Sanders, Lieutenant and Captain, 4th North Carolina Regiment. His name appears on a record of the proceedings of a board of officers of the North Carolina Line dated Feb. 6, 1782, which shows he was Commissioned Captain Feb. 8th, 1779.

He was in the Battle of Briar Creek, Ga. near Savannah river, served under Gen. Lincoln.
