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The term “documentation” refers to the supporting materials that came with an application or supplemental application. The older the application is there is a greater likelihood that no documentation now survives. In the years before easy access to photocopy machines (roughly the 1960s), many members requested that their documentation be returned to them. The DAR honored these requests until about 1984. As a result, prior to 1984, a major percentage of applications and supplementals do not have supporting documentation. After that date, all documentation should be present with some exceptions. The DAR does not guarantee that documentation within these files will meet today’s genealogical standards and will be acceptable for current or future DAR applications or supplemental applications.

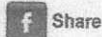

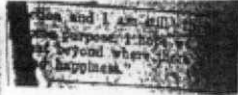
SMITH HISTORY

Mr. Jacob K. Smith, one of Neshoba County's most honored citizens, lives a few miles south of Philadelphia where he settled in 1870 when he came to the county. He is now 87 years old but says: "I am thankful to say I am enjoying very good health, and my eyesight is good. I don't use glasses. My hearing is not good." Recently he sent me information about his branch of the Smith family which I will let him tell in his own way.

"I was born in Perry Co., Ala. in 1847. My father, George R. Smith, was born in Abbeville, S. C., in 1822, and came to Perry Co., Ala., about 1825. In 1842, father married Mary Ann Kinard. My great-grandfather, Solomon Smith, was born in Abbeville, S. C., and came to Ala. about 1805. My maternal grandfather, Jacob Kinard and wife were born in S. C. The father of Grandfather Kinard was in the Revolutionary War and died during the time of it. Grandmother Kinard also died during that war, and grandfather Kinard was raised an orphan by a man by the name of Taylor. Jacob Kinard married Susanna Taylor about 1780 and were parents of 11 children, 7 of whom lived to be grown.

"My grandmother Taylor must have come from the old country. I have heard others say that she had heard her read from her old Dutch Bible many times. My grandfather, Solomon Smith, I have been told was a red-headed Irishman. He likely came from the old country, too. Both grandfather Kinard and grandfather Smith were good providers. They owned a large bunch of negroes at the end of the Civil War.

"My brother Robert Wiley and I were the two brothers that went to the Civil War. He was killed in



"My father, George R. Smith and wife had the following children: Jacob K. Smith (B. 1847), Wm. D. Smith (B. 1852), Chas. R. Smith (B. 1854), Preston B. Smith (B. 1860), J. G. Smith (B. 1862), Martha Smith (B. 1858), Bettie K. Smith (B. 1864). Another son, Robert Wiley, born about 1860 was killed in the Civil War. Gen. R. Smith, my father, died in 1894, my mother died in 1911. Father settled in Lauderdale County, Miss., in 1860.

"I was the oldest child of George R. and Mary Ann Smith. I married Narcissa Stephens, sister of Rev. E. S. Stephens, in 1866. I came to Neshoba County in 1870. We have had the following children: Lula Smith who married G. W. Hamilton, Hurston Smith who married Irene Kilpatrick, Walter Smith who married Fannie Johnson, Elijah Smith who married Tinnie Hardy, Charlie Smith who married Lou Pierce, Mattie Smith who married B. Hardy, Minnie Smith who married Tom Hardy, Jesse Smith who married Lucy Posey, Travers Smith who married Pettus, Albert who married Jessie Hardy and Fannie who married Lee Ward. My wife died in 1825.

My second brother, Wm. D.

Smith, married Frances Sharp and they had the following children: Sarah Smith who married Nathan Eldridge, Martha Smith who married John Smith, Mary Smith married Sam Smith, Fannie Smith married Elton Holder, Emily Smith married Dave McCraw, Edward Smith married Miss Lane and Grover Smith married Miss Davidson (John and Sam Smith who married into the family were not related to our family).

"Charles R. Smith married Angie Sharp and have 8 children: Victoria, Clinton, Jake, Sam, Henry and Preston. This family moved to Texas 44 years ago, and married out their. I do not know who they married. All are married. Preston Smith, another brother, married Bennie Kilpatrick. Their children are as follows: Mary married George Seitz, Ella married Ben Davidson, Annie married Jim Grice, Robbin married Lottie Sharp, Parilee married Tom Kilpatrick, Myrtle married Malolo Seitz. Preston Smith's wife died and he then married Nancy Kilpatrick. They moved to Jones County, Miss., and I do not know the names of their children.

"J. G. Smith, another brother, married Mary Jane Rice and they had 11 children but they moved to Carlington Co., Miss., when the children were young. All are married but I do not know to whom. My sister Martha Smith married J. D. Sharp and had 9 children: Arbet married Alonzo Richardson, Alma married Joe Richardson, Bertha married Hillard Sharp, Parilee married Bud Pierce, Jamie married Alford Hardy, Mattie married Henry Parker, "Hummie" married Ruby Coker, Nathan married Miss Hitt, Leonard married Miss Archie. This sister is dead.

"Bettie B. Smith, my younger sister, married John Savell who was killed in an accident many years ago. Their children: George Savell married Elma Trapp, Preston married in Louisiana, Joe married Yenie Kilpatrick, Joe married Yenie Kilpatrick, William married Narcissa Kilpatrick, Avis married Pincilla Winstead, Leona married John Collins, Beatrice married Thad Havers, Mittie married Louis Skinner, Johnnie married Jim Apperson, Mewdith married Miss Stalock, Edward married in Arkansas. Sister Bettie is dead.

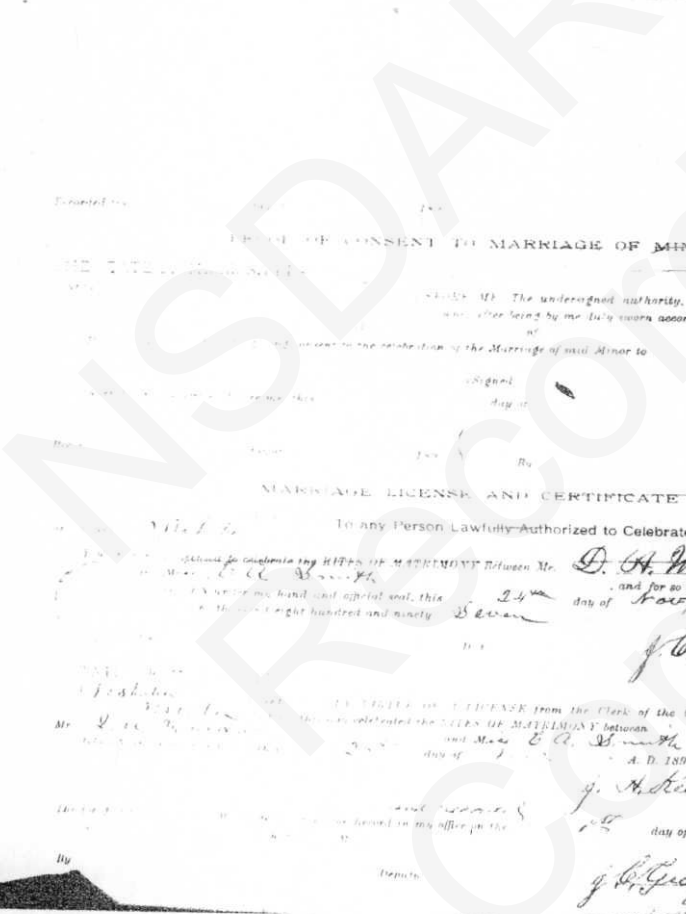

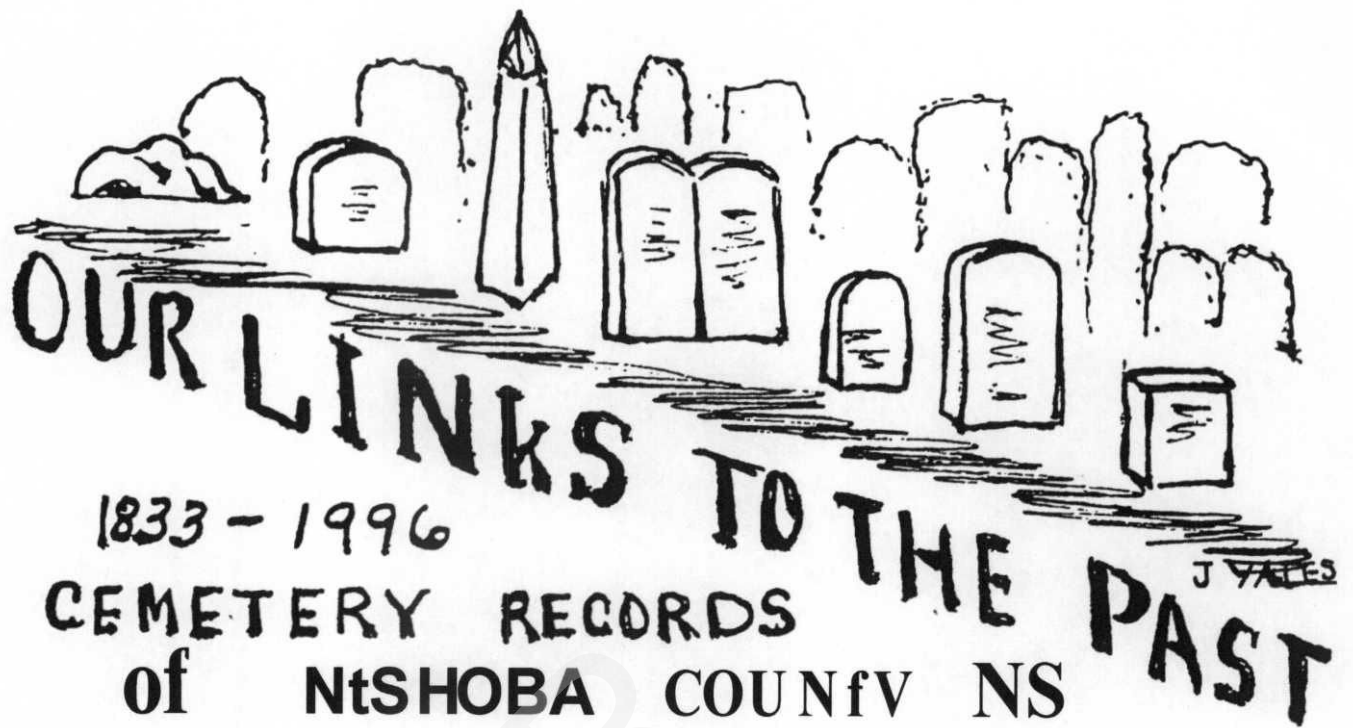
