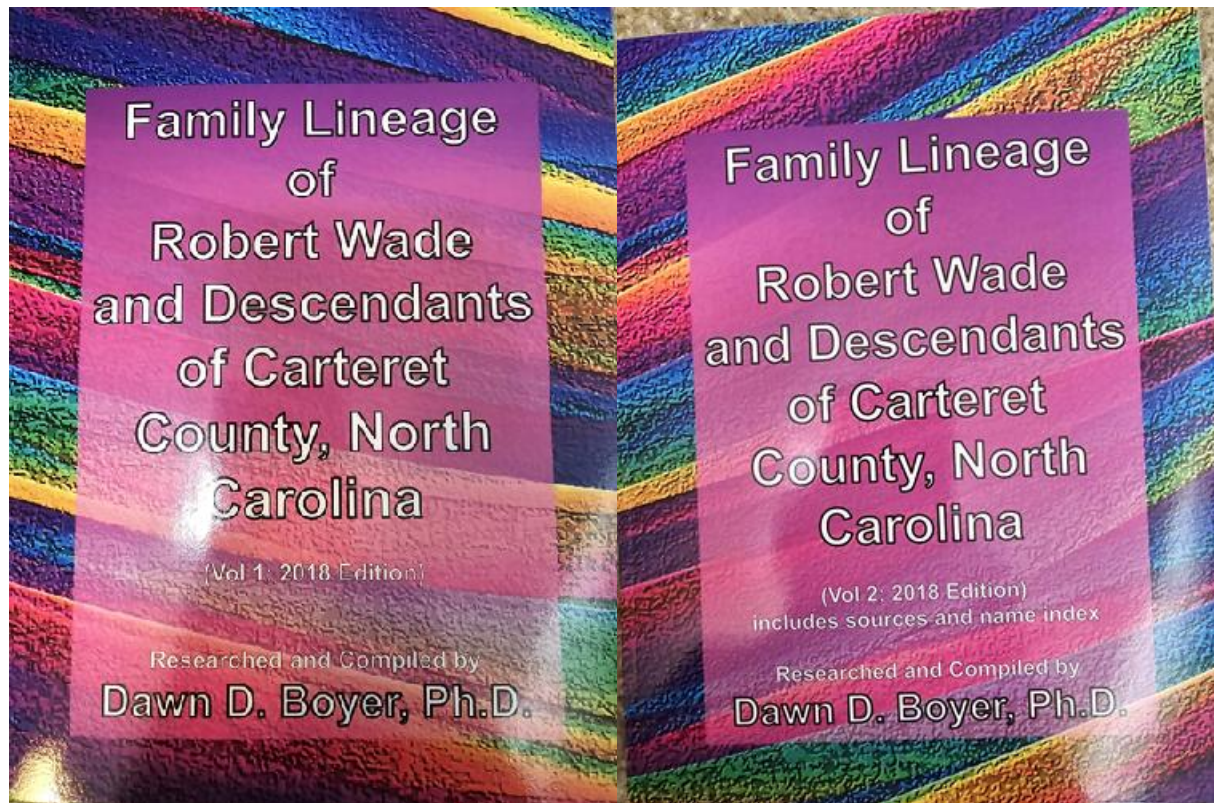
Notes: The newest version is in **blue font**, and the changes made to the document are also denoted in **blue font** in the document below. Original documents do not have **blue font**.

In my system, an “RD-####” document is a “Research Document” that is used before I transfer information to an “FT-####” document, which is a “Family Tree” document. The Family Tree documents are more statements of the various facts of that particular family, while the Research documents are more investigative, intuitive, and sometimes just plain guessing. If you see something named “Source ####”, that is my numbering system for the various sources that back up the conclusions in the FT and RD documents. Sources, FT documents, and RD documents are all numbered sequentially as I create them.

In this Research Document, I will be tracing the Wade lineage, starting with Sarah Wade who married Reuben Benthall (see RD-016-02).

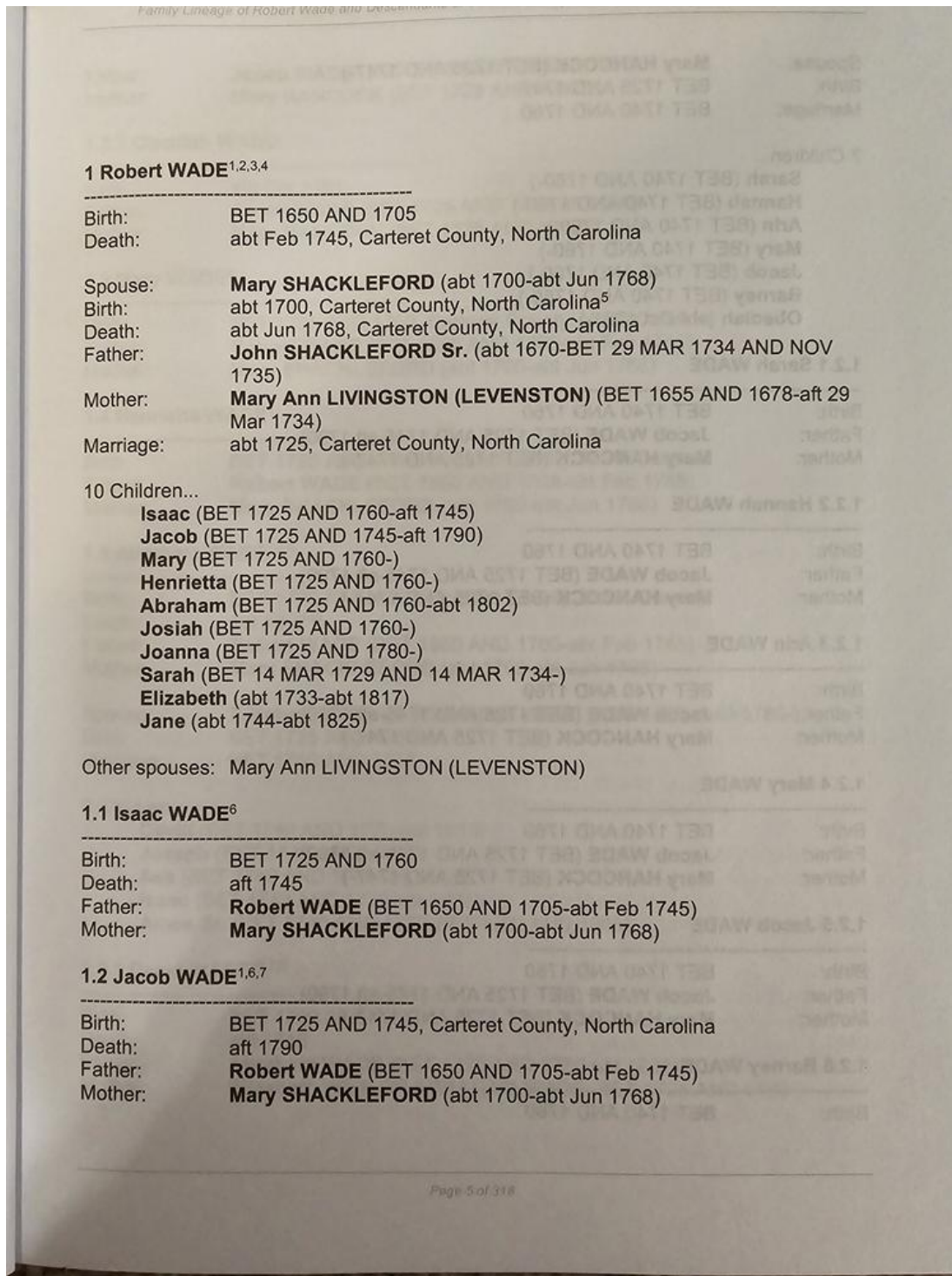
Item # 1	Sarah Wade's Father	Family Lineage of Robert Wade and Descendants of Carteret County, North Carolina”, Voumes I and II by Dawn D. Boyer, Ph. D.
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I found and purchased a book – “Family Lineage of Robert Wade and Descendants of Carteret County, North Carolina”, Voumes I and II by Dawn D. Boyer, Ph. D. It's an okay book, but not always very well resourced. Ms. Boyer says that she has done decades of research, but much of what is in the books is just downloads of various family trees from Ancestry.com, Tree Maker, WikiTree, etc. I have found that much of these family trees are just not well-resourced. Here are the front pages of the books:



Unfortunately, I am really only interested in one of Robert's daughters – Sarah – and his immediate family. So it was a little bit of a waste of \$40 to get both volumes. But I did, so it will go into my genealogy library.

On the first page of the genealogical part of the book in Volume I (the pages of the book are not numbered as you are expected to go by the "numbers" of the various descendants to find people), you can see Robert's immediate family:



At the top of this page, beside Robert Wade's name, you can see that there are 4 citations – 1, 2, 3, and 4. When we look at these citations, we see:

Ok, from this we don't learn Robert Wade's Birth date or even year. So Marty Grant is not the source of Ms. Boyer's birth year estimation. But there is other good information in Marty's webpage that we can use (spouse, children, various will information, etc.).

Item # 3	Sarah Wade's Father	"Kith and Kin of Eastern Carteret County" book, Thelma Simpson's and Rebecca Sanders, published in 1997.
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Ms. Boyer's second citation for the Robert Wade family is Thelma Simpson's and Rebecca Sanders "Kith and Kin of Eastern Carteret County" book, published in 1997. I haven't found any online copies of this book, but I have contacted the Carteret County Historical Society who lists the book on their website as available for purchase. We will see if this book is available, and what is in it.

[John Note: Updated] I have received Thelma Simpson's and Rebecca Sanders "Kith and Kin of Eastern Carteret County" book, published in 1997 from the Carteret County Historical Society, along with "The Index for Kith and Kin" by Phil Hastings, 2004. The Index tells me that there are citations for Sarah Wade on pages 25, 113, 120, and 88 of Kith and Kin.

Page 25 shows:

"433. Cason Gibbs Murphy b: 1852 m: 1881 Sarah Fair Wade" **[John note: obviously not my Sarah Wade]**

Page 113 shows:

"474. Sarah Fair Wade b: 1868 m: 1887 Cason G. Murphy" **[John note: some difference in the marriage year from the page 25 comment, but still not my Sarah Wade]**

Page 120 shows:

"(474) Sarah Fair Wade and Cason Murphy had issue:" **[John note: still not my Sarah Wade!]**

Page 88 **[John note: Ok, this looks like my Wade family!]**

There's a lot of information here about the Wade family, but we will only add that information that occurs before 1800, as that is where I am researching right now. Since Sarah was born about 1745 and probably died between 1782 and 1800, those are my date parameters. Starting on Page 88 we see:

"Wade"

William Wade was living in the area now Carteret County before 1727 for in that year he petitioned the court for payment to his wife Elizabeth for her appearance as a witness.

Robert Wade, possibly son or brother of William, married Mary Shackelford, daughter of John Shackelford, an early land owner in the area. **Robert Wade** bought land on the west side of Wards Creek in 1728 from his brother-in-law Enoch Ward. In **Robert Wade's** "vearble" **[John note: possibly "verbal"?]** will of 1745, he named as his heirs sons Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, and named his wife as Mary. Mary married her deceased sister Elizabeth's husband, Enoch Ward, and had a son Enoch. She later married Ananias Cavenagh and left a will in 1768.

...

Robert Wade devised land to sons Abraham and Isaac Wade “where they live” and land on North River to Jacob (1745 nuncupative will). Isaac does not appear in any deed or record after 1745.”

The next mention of our Robert Wade is on page 90 under the heading of “Ward”:

“Ward

*The Ward name figures prominently in the families of eastern Carteret County. Richard Ward of Henrico Co., VA. was a Court Justice in 1666 and died in 1682, leaving his wife Elizabeth. He probably had other children, but his son Edward Ward departed Henrico prior to 1708, and was known to be in Bath Co., NC by 1711. Edward Ward had sons Richard, Enoch, and Edward. Little is known of the second Richard. Son Enoch Ward married first to Elizabeth Shackelford and had children: Anne, who married Joseph Sutton; Mary who married Benjamin Ward; Elizabeth, who married Edward Simpson; Sarah, who married Nathaniel Hancock; Martha who married Richard Thompson, and Richard. When his wife Elizabeth died, Enoch Ward married 2nd to Mary Shackelford Wade, sister of his wife and widow of **Robert Wade**, and they had children: Enoch Ward, Jr., who married Abigail Shepard; Abigail, who married Joseph Morgan; and Susanne. Son Edward Ward, 1694-1766 (will proved 1766 in Onslow Co.) named his wife Elizabeth and children: Richard, Benjamin, Enoch, Seth, Martha Simmons, Dorothy (wife of Richard Ward), Anne Granada, Elizabeth Hadnot, Ruth Strange, Obedience Hadnot and Mary Williams. Ward’s Creek, between Otway and Bette, got its name from Enoch Ward, Sr., who owned property in the area.”*

Item # 4	Robert Wade	“The Heritage of North Carolina”, Volumes I and II
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Citations 3 and 4 from Ms. Boyer’s book are from “The Heritage of North Carolina”, Volumes I and II, also listed as available at the Carteret County Historical Society. I joined the Carteret County Historical Society today, so we will see what type of information is available to members.

These are available in paperback for \$45 each, so I may order them to see what is in them.

20-Dec-2024 Update

Ok, I finally got these two books from the Carteret County Historical Society! Pretty interesting. From Source 896a:

From: The Heritage of Carteret County, North Carolina, Volume I – 1982. Editors: Pat Dula Davis and Kathleen Hill Hamilton, Editorial Assistant: Kay Slaughter Hewitt, The Carteret County Historical Society, Inc.

This particular article – written by Shirley Wade Lucas – within this document starts on page 442 and ends on page 443 and is numbered 785 ...

The first paragraph says:

Robert, Valentine and Richard Wade were three brothers who left Devonshire, England and landed at New Bedford, Massachusetts late in the seventeenth century. They continued on to Carteret Precinct, Bath Co., Province of N.C. Records show that they were among the original settlers in the area of Williston.

If true, this paragraph answers a lot of questions for me (maybe):

1. I now know who Valentine Wade, who witnessed Robert's will in 1745. He is Robert's brother!
2. Robert may have been an Original Immigrant for my purposes.
3. We may know where they landed in the New World – in New Bedford, MA.

At the end of the article on page 443, Shirley Wade Lucas cites as her sources:

War records, land grants. Early Colonial Records, deeds located in Register of Deeds Office in Beaufort, N. C. Early Marriage Bonds for North Carolina, old wills from 1700 – 1880, census records for Carteret County for 1850, 1860, 1870, 1880 and 1900.

The main issue I have with this data is that Shirley Wade Lucas is documenting her work in only a general way. I can't find anything that she cites online. It looks like I would need to travel to Beaufort, NC to check on her work. I have seen in the past that Robert's birth year was estimated at around 1696 and that he was born in Carteret County. So I am not sure who is correct here. If this other data is correct, it's unlikely that Robert is an Original Immigrant.

Now to see what we can find on any immigration records.

Item # 5	Robert Wade Immigration	The Planters of the Commonwealth in Massachusetts, 1620-1640 Lists of Passengers and the Ships Which Brought Them
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I found this book in the Card Catalog on Ancestry.com and just started browsing through it. Here are some of the things I found in it.

Year: 1635, pages 125-128

I am choosing to note this entry for several reasons:

- The trade of Cooper (barrel maker) was part of my Wade's family heritage. Robert Wade's son – Abraham – was a cooper.
- Richard and Elizabeth are known names in my Wade's family.

- According to Item #4, the Wade's came from Devonshire, England. Below, you can see that this Richard Wade was from Simsbury, England. There is no Simsbury, England today. However, there is a Symondsbury Estate, in southern England, which is very near Devonshire, England. See the Google maps below the extract directly below.

Devonshire is highlighted in light green in the map above, and you can see that it is located near the Southwest Coast of England. Note the little white box around the name of the town of Bridport on the Southeast corner of Devonshire. We will expand that box in the map below.

1635

..... This unknown vessel left the port of Weymouth in Dorsetshire in March of this year with about twenty families and servants under the leadership of the Reverend Joseph Hull, gathered largely from the parishes of Batcombe and Broadway in Somersetshire. The ship arrived May 5, and practically all of the passengers went to the plantation at Wessaguscus by permission of the General Court which officially changed the name of the settlement to Weymouth in July.³

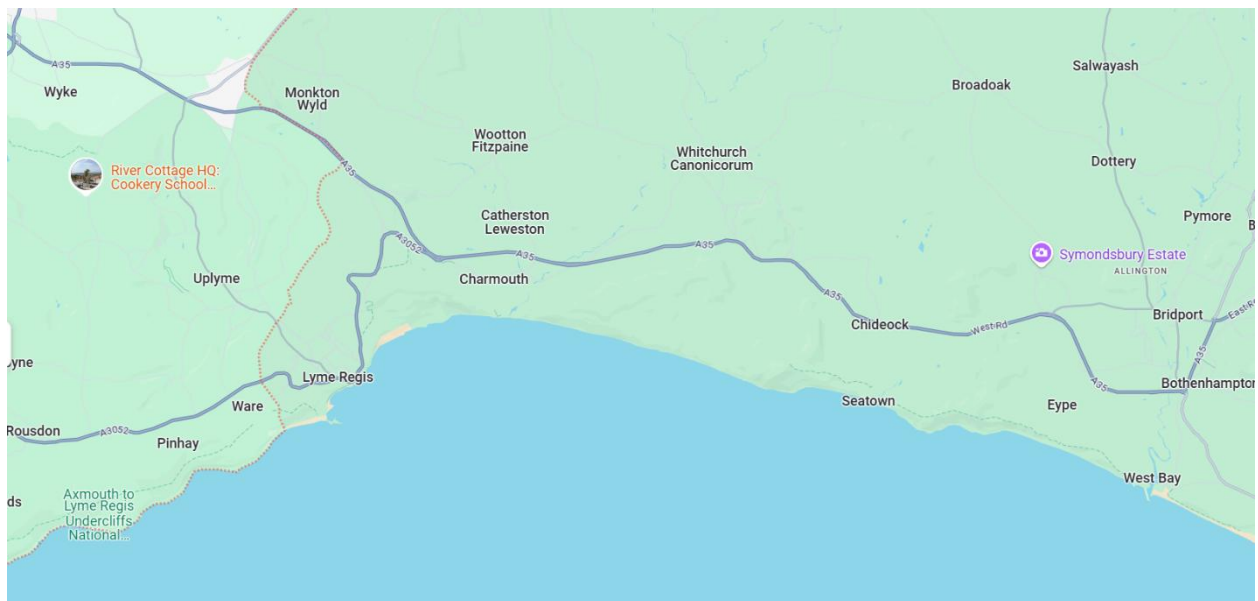
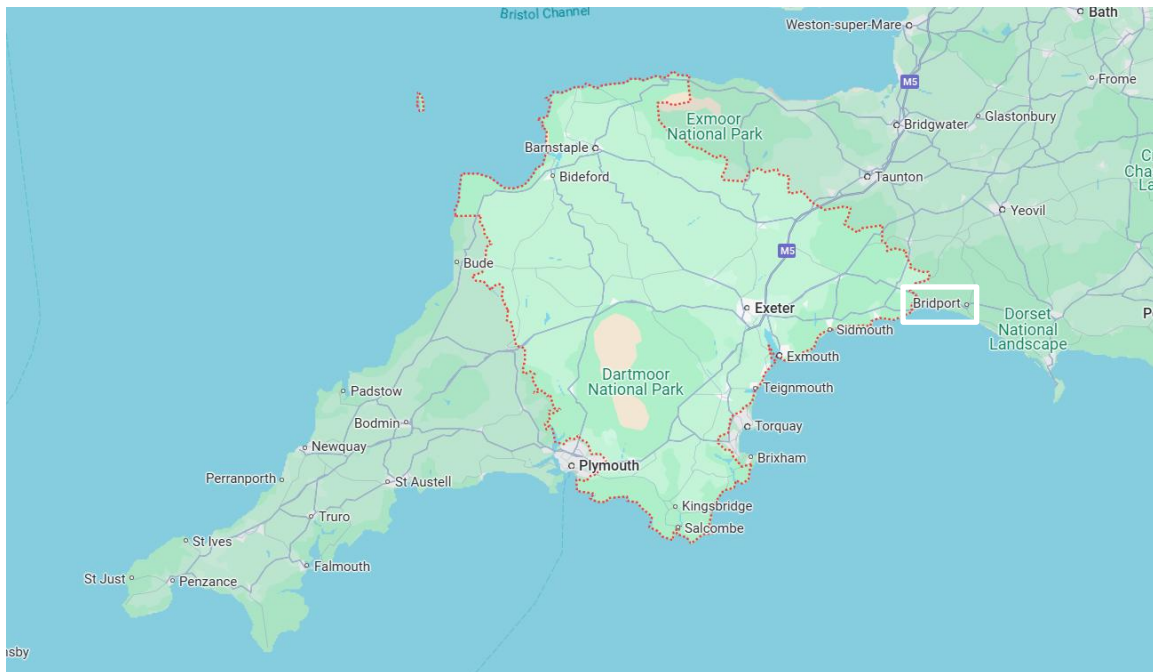

You can see the red dotted line running south to north about a third over from the left side of the map – Devonshire to the left of that line and Dorsetshire to the right of that line. On the far right of the map, in purple font, you can see where Symonds Estate was, which was likely close to location of Symonds, England.

So, I don't know if this Richard Wade is an earlier ancestor of my Robert Wade, or a relative, or it's just a coincidence. He can't be the brother of my Robert Wade as he is too old. My Robert Wade died in 1745

and this Richard came to the New World in 1635 and was born in about 1575. But I can see a couple of options:

- He is an earlier ancestor of my Robert Wade who came to the New World earlier.
- My information about Robert being the original immigrant is wrong.

Item # 6	Robert Wade Immigration	Cavaliers and Pioneers: Abstracts of Virginia Land Patents and Grants 1623 – 1800 by Nell Marion Nugent
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Ok, back visiting the issue of Robert Wade – who were his parents, where did he come from – kind of like “Cotton-Eyed Joe”! I made no progress in my trip to the Carteret County Historical Society in Morehead City, NC in April 2026.

But I recently got back into my genealogical research and I had a new hint in Ancestry.com. It was:

I had heard of these books before (“Cavaliers and Pioneers”), but hadn’t known much about them, as I am not that far back in my research timeline yet. But at this point, I decided to investigate more fully. I purchased the entire series of books on eBay (there are 7 books, plus a small paperback addendum). The citation above is from the first volume which covers the time period of 1623 to 1666.

I searched in the index of the first volume, and found a Robert Wade in an abstract that begins on page 346 and ends on page 347:

(146). On N. side of the narrows of
Mettapony River, beg. At Mr. Digges”
lower devdt. Granted unto Mr. John
Hansford 16 Dec. 1653, by him deserted
& now granted by order of the Govr.
&c. & retaken by new rights: James
Tyler, Mary Rodes, David Otley, Roger
Patter, Robert Mallett, Robert Wade,
Eliza Ware (or Ward), Tho. Parker,
Jane Roper, Jacob Kickerley, George
Mosse, Tho. Dissey, Jone Evans, John
Okelly, Edward Cooke, Edmond
Thacker, Jenkin Yearkey, Tho. Coury
(?). Renewed 11 Mar 1662.*

So this seems to say that a Robert Wade was transported into Virginia in 1653. Obviously, this isn’t my Robert Wade, as this Virginia one would be too old. But maybe an ancestor of mine?

First, who was Robert Abrall? From [Wikipedia](#), his name is correctly spelled “Abrahall”. The [Encyclopedia Virginia](#) has an article on him, he was a very rich land investor who accumulated 21 land grants that totaled over 14,000 acres. He was a member of the first Virginia House of Burgesses. It sounds he was a land speculator, who scooped up any abandoned or deserted land claims he could. This particular land grant was originally granted to John Hansford 16 Dec 1653, but deserted by him. There are 18 people mentioned for “head rights” (when a ship captain brought new people to the Colonies or a merchant paid for people to come to the Colonies, the captain or merchant received 50 acres for each “head”, hence “head rights” or just “rights”). John Hansford also has a listing in the same volume of “Cavaliers and Pioneers” on page 281 for his original head rights:

*“JOHN HANSFORD, 950 acs. Glos-
Ter Co., on N. side of Narrows of
Mettapony Riv., beg at a Creek by Mr.
Diggs lower devdt. &c. 16 Dec 1653,
p. 223. Trans. Of 19 pers: John Hans-*

*ford, Eliza. Hansford, Richard Hukes,
(or Hickes), John Bide, Mannes Carew,
Dan. Morrin, Patrick Allen, Hugh
Horim, Thomas Hetfield, Mary Pawan,
Pru. Worshipp, Alice Taylor, Joseph
Bates, Joanne Trotter, Eliza. Search, Han-
nah Stone, Joseph Tayloe, Peter Adams,
Jonathan Higby (or Higley).*

It's easy to see that the 19 settlers that John Hansford brought in in 1653 are NOT the same settlers listed in the Robert Abrall listing from 1657. That explains the sentence in Abrall's listing of: "& *retaken by new rights*:" Abrall (or really "Abrahall"), couldn't just take the land for the same 19 settlers. He had to bring in new settlers. It IS the same land, though. The description is almost word for word.

Which means that this Robert Wade – who landed in Virginia – didn't land in 1653, he landed in 1657 under the "sponsorship" of Robert Abrahall, not John Hansford in 1653. Obviously, this is not my Robert Wade, maybe an ancestor, whose descendants later moved to Carteret County, NC. I don't know anything about that journey yet (or even if this is the same Wade family!).

In Volume 2 of "Cavaliers and Pioneers", covering the time period of 1666 to 1695, we find another Robert Wade being brought into Virginia (page 254):

*"BRIGMAN (Bridgman) JOYNER,
300 acs., ls. of Wight Co., -6 Apr.
1683, p. 236. Between Kinsale Sw. &
the maine Blackwater; beg. at Hodges
Councell; to Thomas Man, &c. Trans. Of
6 pers: James Tyler, Mary Rodes,
David Otley, Roger Potter, Robert
Mallet, **Robert Wade**."*

So it looks like both Robert Abrahall and Bridgman Joyner got land for bringing in Robert Wade! And 5 other people on both of their lists 26 years apart! Truly, our founding fathers (little "f") were scoundrels!

There is no Robert Wade mentioned in Volume 3 of "Cavaliers and Pioneers" covering the time period of 1695 to 1732.

There are two listings for Robert Wade in Volume 4 of "Cavaliers and Pioneers" covering the time period of 1732 to 1741. The first from page 15 is:

*“ROBERT WADE, 250 acs. NL in
Goochland Co. on brs. Of
Lickinghole Cr. adj. Henry Harper;
20 Jun 1733, p. 78. £1.55.*

The second listing is from page 152:

*“ROBERT WADE 587 acs.
Hanover Co. on the Northanna
Riv., adj. James Robertson: 9 Feb
1737/38, p.477. £3.*

There is no Robert Wade mentioned in Volume 5 of “Cavaliers and Pioneers” covering the time period of 1741 to 1749.

My Robert Wade died in Feb 1745, so he can’t have been in Virginia during the times of (probably) Volumes 4 or after. However, there is a Robert Wade mentioned in Volume 6 (page 94) that I just have to cite (at least partially):

*“ROBERT WADE, 3,746 acs.
Lunenburg Co. on the Rocky Fork &
Brs. Of **Fucking Cr.**, on Couches’s Cr. &
Reedy Cr.; adj. Murrell, Allen, Briggs
....”*

Of course, today there is no Fucking Creek in Virginia (yes I looked on Google maps!). But there is an interesting quote from Reid Mitenbuler in [Goodreads](#):

“John Steinbeck many years later would write in East of Eden, “The names of places carry a charge of the people who named them, reverent or irreverent, descriptive, either poetic or disparaging.” The Scotch-Irish gave the American places where they made whiskey names like Gallows Branch, Cutthroat Gap, or, in one instance, Shitbritches Creek. In Lunenburg County, Virginia, they even named two streams Tickle Cunt Branch and Fucking Creek. They often called themselves “rednecks,” an old Scots border term for Presbyterians. Another title they used for themselves was “crackers,” a term that came from the Scots word craik, which literally means “talk,” but was typically used to describe the kind of loud bragging that usually leads to a fight.”
