Encounter

God has quickly blessed us with wonderful students in this campus ministry plant. In February, we began our weekly campus ministry gathering called Encounter. We've had 12-20 students and young adults our first few weeks, with people bringing friends, new people each week, and community developing. It is a joy. The evening is structured to help people encounter God.

What Encounter Looks like

- ♦ Welcome and worship
- ♦ Meditation to bring our minds before God
- Lesson: Shared teaching time to focus our community on God.
- Stations: We provide four stations for people to respond to what God stirs in their hearts. The stations are: silence and solitude, conversation and prayer with Hannah, kinesthetic activity which rotates, and continued worship.
- ♦ Closing worship and fellowship

Lesson Series

The first five weeks we established the pillars of Encounter. Encounter is a place for Authenticity, Freedom, Relationship, Practice, and Presence. Our next series is *My Story: Learning about the Character of God.* We are sharing our life stories and highlighting what we've learned about God along the way.

After the event we got to have follow up conversations with students, and got to know the speakers over a long dinner.

Coming from a university where students only attend events for which they get credit, I was shocked to see Murdock Hall fill, and fill, and fill. 500 seats, plus an overflow room with livestream. No credit. They came to hear neuroscientist Bill Newsom and colleagues talk about free will and how their lives as scientists interact with their love of Jesus. Oasis was the key partner for this event. Claire did the amazing graphics and marketing, Jenna ran the student question submission system, and I was the moderator for the evening. We also worked for months to plan the event. It was fantastic and we are greatly encouraged for future events. I've been asked to be on the executive board for the organization that hosts this event and we're now planning a conference for next year with the support of a significant grant.



Renewal Retreats

Get away for three hours to be with God. Hosted in the serene, spirit-filled Oasis, small groups are invited to talk about big questions with God and each other. Renewal Retreats are mini-spiritual formation getaways offered every quarter.

We've offered two sets of Renewal Retreats so far. The questions we've asked are *Who is God?* and *Who Am I?* They have a simple structure and are entirely dependent on God meeting people. We come into the space in silence, read scripture, do a guided meditation, have brief teaching on our question for the day, are offered four spiritual practices, have 1.25 hours alone with God, and come back to talk through our experience together and pray.

The groups are intergenerational—students through 70s. They highlight the importance of our time alone with God and our time in community with God. I am finding that they provide a place for rich relationships and deeper connection with God. God is meeting people in this space and speaking powerfully into our lives.
