### From the First Step Board President

The First Step Village and the property on Hwy 101 are progressing this year in preparation for capacity building. Our partnership with the Bridges Program has resulted in several key pieces of infrastructure being added to our property on the north end of Florence. We now have water, sewer, and electrical installed that we can connect to. This will be a great cost savings when we clear land and begin to add our housing units.

Our ambitious plan is to have three additional housing units on that property by the end of the year. Currently, we have contractors working on bids for land clearing, fencing, and running the final lengths of water, electricity, and sewer.

Sandy Craft, our Community Development Liaison, is writing grants and helping the board organize the steps to make this dream a reality. In the coming months, we will have details on the placement of the new village on our property and ways that you can participate in to help more families move into permanent housing.

We have found that trailers are becoming increasingly difficult to maintain and have begun looking at alternatives. City code only allows us to use temporary housing units in our current village, we are considering new possibilities that will better serve our families. We hope to have some pictures at our Gala (your invitation is in this newsletter).

We continue to search for a couple of additional board members. If you have compassion for families experiencing housing insecurity and want to donate some of your time, talent, and/or sweat to help us make a difference, please call me. I would love to take you out for lunch or a cup of coffee to discuss if serving on our board would be beneficial for you and for First Step.

I look forward to seeing you at our Gala.

It's been a successful year for our First Step Village residents! Two of the First Step families have moved into permanent, affordable apartment housing- one of our families moved into the beautiful new Shore Pines complex next door to the First Step Village.

The third family moved into a rental house in Florence. They were able to use their savings acquired through the "rent" savings program organized by our First Step Residents Advocate to pay for the rental deposits, and several months rent. The family is absolutely delighted to have so much space to accommodate their teenagers and a feeling of housing security! Both the mother and her partner are working multiple jobs and have expressed immense gratitude for the First Step program and the kind hearted donors who have made their success possible.

There are plans for fundraising to purchase items to improve the outdoor area of the Village. The goal is to provide a covered sandbox/play area (gazebo) for the children, picnic tables, and storage sheds for bicycles, toys and other things that will not fit in the trailers.
