#### AiKiDo and the Art of Arguing

In the past, arguing with someone meant discussing an idea and trying to convince the other person that your point of view was correct. These arguments were often sincere and both sides usually learned something beneficial from them. However, today a new philosophy has emerged where people are not interested in discussing different points of view, but rather in stating their position and expecting others to accept it as truth. This has resulted in arguments becoming less common, as people are often unwilling to listen to anything that contradicts their beliefs.

Unfortunately, arguments are now seen as fruitless, whereas in the past, arguments were civil and sincere, and both sides were interested in discovering the universal truth and making good decisions for the common good.

If you want to learn how to argue with someone who is locked onto an idea or ideology and refuses to listen to anything else, I recommend reading "How to Have Impossible Conversations: A Very Practical Guide" by Peter Boghossian and James Lindsay. This practical guide provides detailed and proven techniques, ranging from simple to complex, that can help you have a meaningful discussion with anyone.

I refer to this type of arguing as "AiKiDo arguing" because it is similar to the ancient art of self-defense, where the person being attacked uses the aggressor's power and energy to their advantage to defend themselves. It is impossible to describe all of the techniques in the book here, but I encourage you to read it and learn how to argue and win by using AiKiDo arguing techniques.

Many people today are afraid to engage in discussions with someone who holds an opposing view. They fear being labeled a bigot or a racist and do not want to ruin the relationship by getting into a heated argument. However, AiKiDo arguing techniques can help you to have a productive conversation with someone who holds an opposing view. Instead of disagreeing directly with their position, you can ask them how they came to their conclusion. By exploring their thought process and asking questions, you can develop a conversation that leads them to think about the merit of their position. Even agreeing with some of their points can make them feel that you are friendly and not an aggressive opponent, which can make them more objective and open to reason.

The idea is to lead, not push, the other person to your point of view. It may take some effort to master the techniques in the book, but it is worth it, as it may enable you to preserve a relationship and even change a few minds.
