The Lenten Season!

Dear Families,

We are now in the liturgical season of Lent. This past Wednesday our children and their families were greeted by Father Santiago with a Lenten prayer and the distribution of ashes. This simple yet poignant symbol reminds us that Lent is a time to reflect and not only give up, but give to the Lord and our world. Last year we joined together as a school to share the rosary in our foyer. Each

child held rosary beads and moved their fingers along one prayer at a time. How do we incorporate a “giving” piece of our time to our Lord during Lent. As a staff we will be sharing a daily Lenten prayer before our day begins. I recently read an article about the brain of Steve Jobs and how he meditated every day for at least a half hour. When he was examined his brain, he was decades younger than his chrono-

logical age. That meditation made a difference. Prayer is meditation. Taking time to be quiet within ourselves is difficult but the benefits far outweigh the sacrifice. I am challenging myself this Lent to add one minute a day of prayer until I reach 40 minutes on Easter. Sharing and modeling this with your children as a family will build our connection to our Lord and our overall well being!
