Advent

Dear Families,

Advent is upon us! This weekend we marked the first week of Advent. Last week as everyone left for Thanksgiving break I presented each family with a family Advent Calendar. In lieu of a Christmas gift this year, we felt that an Advent gift would have greater meaning. Each night we encourage our families to read the devotion as their child places the sticker of the foot or hand on the corresponding number. This culminates with the true reason of the season, our Savior's birth and a sticker of Baby Jesus to be placed on Christmas Day.

As a school family we will be lighting as a school community at the <u>11:00 mass on De-</u> <u>cember 15th here at St.</u> <u>Therese Church.</u> We invite all of our families and extended families to join us on this day in church. At the beginning of mass you will be called to enter the sanctuary and help light the wreath. I am always so moved by the wonder and awe of the children as they enter the sanctuary and become a part of our liturgical celebration! Mass is followed by a small reception at our school!

What does Advent mean for your family? Advent is the preparation of the arrival of our Savior's birth. At school we are preparing by sharing stories of our Savior's birth, songs, and in culmination, our pageant. Sharing your faith and preparation for this glorious day with your

children through a tradition, new or old will solidify their bond with the reason of the season.





Within my own family we have two steadfast traditions that bring the reason of the season to our hearts and minds. On Christmas Eve day my children bake a birthday cake for Jesus that we share with our family that evening singing Happy Birthday to our Savior. On Christmas morning before any presents are opened, my children reach for the baby Jesus in our hutch and place him in the creche. Each day after they move the three wise men closer and closer! Simple but poignant, start a family tradition that is unique to your family this Christmas!

Our parish family of St. Elizabeth the Trinity will hold masses at all three churches. Please see the schedule on page two! What better way than to begin the celebration of our Savior's birth than in Mass.!

Christmas Pageants

In celebration of our Savior's birth, we hold a simple reenactment with the children in the sanctuary in church on the <u>last day before Christ-</u><u>mas break</u>. The pageant is followed by a birthday party for Jesus in the church hall. The dates for the pageant are:

Thursday, December 19th 10:30 a.m. for our <u>Three Year Old's</u>

Please note that half day, lunch bunch, and all day students attend in the a.m. on these days. Children who remain all day may return to their class after the pageant. Everyone else will be dismissed from the pageant. Five day students participate on both days.

Friday, December 19th 1:00 p.m. for our <u>Four Year Old's</u>

Miss Christine's a.m. Class and any other noon dismissal students will bring lunch and remain until the pageant. Please remember we are a peanut/tree nut free school. All students will dismiss from the hall after the pageant and birthday party. Five day students participate on both days.

<u>Guests:</u> A formal invitation and letter regarding your child's part will be sent home shortly. We pull names from a hat for our parts! You may invite as many people as you like to the pageant!

<u>Costumes:</u> Costumes are provided and you will receive a letter asking you to dress your child in a specific color on that day.

Reception: Following the pageant, we will hold a birthday party for Jesus in the church hall with birthday cake, cookies, and juice! Sign ups will be online through the sign up Genius. We ask parents to bring their food to the hall the morning of the pageant. Parent volunteers will also receive a reminder notice!

Students who attend the all day pre -k in either threes or fours, arrive at school at 11:30 a.m. on the days of a delay with their lunch. On the day of a delay, p.m. classes begin at their scheduled time. There will be no lunch bunch or early drop off on days with delayed opening.

In the event of an early dismissal, all students including pre-k will be picked up at 11:30 a.m. and there will be no p.m. session! You will be notified by the school if your child is in

school and there is an early dismissal.
