



ALRESFORD TOWN FC HISTORY

Football in Alresford has been found back to the late nineteenth century, but the formation year of the present ALRESFORD TOWN FC side is shown as 1989. Starting in the now defunct North Hants League, Town moved immediately into the Hampshire League before withdrawing in 1996. They returned, again from the North Hants League, in 2000 and then came the 2004 move; they've remained members of the Wessex League since.

The original Alresford Town was established in 1898 and were members of the Winchester & District League. The modern club was established in 1989 and joined the North Hants League.

After finishing as runners-up in their first season, they moved up to Division Two of the Hampshire League. The club were Division Two runners-up in 1990/91, securing a second successive promotion to Division One. However, after finishing second-from-bottom of Division One in 1994/95, the club were relegated back to Division Two. At the end of the following season the club left to re-join the North Hants League.

Alresford were North Hants League champions in 1999/00 and returned to Division Two of the Hampshire League. After finishing second in Division Two in 2001/02 Town were promoted to Division One. In 2004 the Hampshire League merged into the Wessex League, with the club becoming members of the new Division Two. The division was renamed Division One in 2006, and Alresford were runners-up in 2006/07, earning promotion to the Premier Division. After five seasons in the lower-mid table, the club were Premier Division runners-up in 2012/13, a season that saw them win the Hampshire Senior Cup (beating AFC Bournemouth in the final), the League Cup and the North Hants Senior Cup. They were Premier Division runners-up again the following season, also retaining the League Cup and the North Hants Senior Cup, as well as winning the Aldershot Senior Cup.

In 2018/19 Alresford won the Southampton Senior Cup, beating AFC Stoneham 3–0 in the final. The 2019/20 season was abandoned due to the coronavirus pandemic with Alresford top of the Premier Division.

In 2021/22 Alresford won the North Hants Senior Cup beating Basingstoke Town 1-0.

ABOUT FAWLEY AFC...

GROUND:	THE BRICKABILITY STADIUM
NICKNAME:	THE OILERS
YEAR FORMED:	1923

The Club was formed as AGWI United in 1923 and joined the Hampshire League six seasons later. In 1949 we changed our name to Esso Fawley. We won Division Three of the Hampshire League in 1995 and reached the Premier Division in 1999.

In 2002 we changed our name again to Fawley AFC and joined the Wessex League in 2004. In 2010 we finished as runners-up and were promoted to the Premier Division.

Fawley established themselves in the premier division, each year we were considered to be the underdogs but finally succumbed to relegation in 2017 on goal difference. Later the same year The Waterside Sports and Social Club closed due to financial difficulties.

In Division One Fawley has established themselves as a solid team with the potential to upset the more glamorous teams. This has been proven by beating Shaftesbury, Stoneham, Hamble Club and Sholing to reach the Wessex League cup final in 2018.

In 2021 and 2024 reach the semifinal of SSC, each time pushing higher league opposition to penalties


Lee and his management team are in the process of rebuilding a team with a blend of experience Wessex League players combine with enthusiastic local young players. Their aim is to have a team that plays attractive and enjoyable football.

Over the couple of seasons Fawley have successfully introduced a U16 and U18 team into the club and these players are now progressing into the senior teams.

Over the last few years our club's small bunch of energetic committee members lead by Chairman Kev Mitchell have been working hard to upgrade the pitch and facilities and now keenly fund raising to build a new club house. This summer and after eight years of negotiation our club has finally received a long ground lease and now Fawley AFC can finally start progressing with a new club house.

The village of Fawley is dominated by the Oil Refinery which has been there since 1921. It was rebuilt and extended in 1951 and is the largest of its kind in the United Kingdom.






