

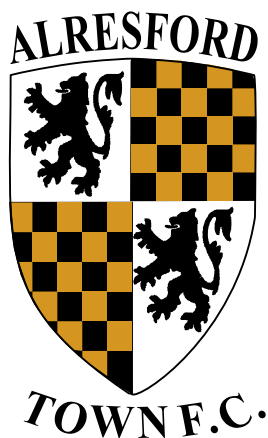

MILLBROOK

Millbrook FC is a newly formed club after the merger of Bush Hill FC and Oakwood Youth FC. The clubs have worked in conjunction with each other over many years only being a stone throw away from each other. Oakwood Youth were based at Test Park as the community club selected to utilise the facility back when the facility first opened.

The decision to join ranks came for several reasons. Both clubs in their respective areas were successful in what they were involved in. Bush Hill didn't boast the youth section that Oakwood Youth had, and Oakwood Youth wasn't a club that had an established adult section. This meant that several players left Oakwood to progress into the adult game. Bush Hill were competing in the Hampshire Premier League and won the league on a few occasions, however, did not have the facilities to progress into the Wessex league. When Solent decided to leave the Wessex league it opened discussions with Bush Hill to start using the main pitch at Test Park. Bush Hill gained promotion based on a points per game basis and in our opinion were a well-deserved selection on that basis to be promoted. Around this time both clubs started the discussions about the two clubs merging. Once those discussions started happening, we recognised and questioned ourselves why it hadn't been discussed before. The rest as they say is history and Millbrook FC was born. We opted for a complete name change due to both clubs having their own history and identities and neither wanted to give their name up to each other. We both serve the community of Millbrook so it seems fitting that our club is named after the region it serves and we hope the community get behind the club with their support.

We have a very exciting project ahead of us. The youth section now has a pathway to a good standard of adult football and the adult section has the renewal and turnover of young players coming through and always injecting youth and enthusiasm into the adult setup whether it be first team, reserve teams or otherwise.

The club now boasts 26 teams ranging from U7 through to open age. We offer football for all levels competing in numerous leagues such as Wessex League, Eastleigh District Mini Soccer League (EDMSL), Southampton Tyro, Junior Premier League (JPL), CSYFL, Hampshire Combination Dev League, Hampshire County Woman's Football League & COSFL.

We have a good army of volunteers who are also buying into the project and the support we are also getting from Solent University is key to our success. The 5-year plan is exciting with many mini projects happening within the club.

ALRESFORD TOWN CLUB HISTORY

Football in Alresford has been found back to the late nineteenth century, but the formation year of the present ALRESFORD TOWN FC side is shown as 1989. Starting in the now defunct North Hants League, Town moved immediately into the Hampshire League before withdrawing in 1996. They returned, again from the North Hants League, in 2000 and then came the 2004 move; they've remained members of the Wessex League since and have been a top tier side since 2007.

The original Alresford Town was established in 1898 and were members of the Winchester & District League. The modern club was established in 1989 and joined the North Hants League. After finishing as runners-up in their first season, they moved up to Division Two of the Hampshire League. The club were Division Two runners-up in 1990/91, securing a second successive promotion to Division One. However, after finishing second-from-bottom of Division One in 1994/95, they were relegated back to Division Two. At the end of the following season the club left to re-join the North Hants League.

Alresford were North Hants League champions in 1999/00 and returned to Division Two of the Hampshire League. After finishing second in Division Two in 2001/02 they were promoted to Division One. In 2004 the Hampshire League merged into the Wessex League, with the club becoming members of the new Division Two. The division was renamed Division One in 2006 and Alresford were runners-up in 2006/07, earning promotion to the Premier Division. After five seasons in the lower-mid table, the club were Premier Division runners-up in 2012/13, a season that saw them win the Hampshire Senior Cup (beating AFC Bournemouth in the final), the League Cup and the North Hants Senior Cup. They were Premier Division runners-up again the following season, also retaining the League Cup and the North Hants Senior Cup, as well as winning the Aldershot Senior Cup.

In 2018/19 Alresford won the Southampton Senior Cup, beating AFC Stoneham 3–0 in the final. The 2019/20 season was abandoned due to the coronavirus pandemic with Alresford top of the Premier Division.

In 2021/22 Alresford won the North Hants Senior Cup beating Basingstoke Town 1-0.
