The Proposed Draft of the OOCIA Amended Bylaws Passed

An important decision made by members at this year's annual meeting was to vote for or against a proposed draft of updated amended bylaws. A neighborhood committee in conjunction with James Young, Partner of Holt & Young, our Association's legal counsel, produced a draft of bylaw amendments to align the Association's dedicatory instruments with Texas State Property Code, specifically Title 11, Section 209. Language was added for clarity of the bylaws requirements and new financial sections were included to delineate Board responsibilities with additional reporting in support of protecting our homeowners' investment made through the Association dues.

The proposed amended bylaws were approved with a vote of approximately 248 for the amendment and 144 against. The adopted bylaw amendments will be reviewed one more time by Mr. Young and will then be certified and recorded with Harris County and effective immediately. This gives homeowners a personal accessible guide for the rules and regulations concerning the governing of the Association.

During the next month, please find time to read through your bylaws, found on the OOCIA website. If you find something you don't understand, are confused about, or disagree with, please send me an email with the questions you have. I will consolidate these topics and answer them in the next newsletter. If there are enough members with questions, we can set up another town hall meeting to review this governing document. We would not be discussing Deed Restriction documents, as that is a completely separate topic with separate requirements.

I appreciate all who helped in studying all the material, having numerous discussions and posing thoughtful, insightful questions. The Board will not always agree, discussions will ensue, learning will happen, and a good compromise will result.

This was a very successful community effort, and I believe the product, while not perfect, is so much better than what we had before. Thanks to all the members of the committee and everyone who came to a town hall meeting and participated in discussions. I hope everyone learned at least a little more about the governance of our community.



Book Club this month will be held on March 28 at the home of Jerry Lutz, with Carol Bright as discussion leader.

Off the Radar, by Cyrus Copeland, will be discussed. From the Kirkus Reviews, it looks like it will be in the desired tradition of our learning something new with all the books we read and discuss. Copeland wrote about late 1970s Tehran, the last days of the Shah's reign, and the repressive Islamic state. At the latter time, Copeland's father, Max, was caught illegally selling radar equipment for Westinghouse, which, like other western companies, was shutting down and liquidating assets prior to the Islamic takeover in 1979. Max was accused for spying for the CIA, was tried in an Islamic court and defended by his wife, the first female lawyer of the Islamic Republic.

Copeland, according to the *Kirkus Reviews*, "highlights his family's resilience in the face of challenging, unforeseen political circumstances. The author's personal immersion in his family's history helps him come to terms with his Iranian heritage and allows him to build a much-needed bridge between two very different but equally misunderstood cultures."



The 39th annual FM 1960 St. Patrick's Parade will take place 2 p.m. Sunday, March 12 in support of the Cypress Creek EMS's program. Come watch all of the unique floats and join in waving and cheering on many of our local schools and organizations. Arrive early to get your spot to watch the event.

There's a vendor market at the mid-point of the parade in the Home Depot parking lot at 1960 and Gladebrook.

Traffic Details

Neighbors living in Olde Oaks and Waterford Park may want to plan their day around the event. The parade begins at 2 p.m. at the Wells Fargo parking lot at Champions Forest Drive and FM 1960 and Kuykendahl. To prepare for the big event, the road will officially close at 1 p.m., and if all goes as planned, completely reopen around 5 p.m.

Intersections at either end of the parade route – Champion Forest Drive and Kuykendahl Road – will remain open, but officers and signs will direct traffic away from the closed section of FM 1960. Police will open up intersections



after the parade moves through and that part of the route is clear Still, large sections of FM 1960 will be closed for the bulk of the four-hour period, so it is wise to use detour routes during that time.
