Thank you, Northgate Country Club, for the use of your room for the last monthly meeting.

And we want to send out a big thank you to our neighbors in Oak Creek Village for allowing us to hold our future monthly Board meetings at their clubhouse at 4062 Gladeridge. Being flooded in Harvey, the MUD 44 building, where we have previously met, is still under reconstruction and we have not heard when it will be available. The meetings will still be at 6:45 p.m. on the third Tuesday of the month for the general meeting. Thank you, Oak Creek Village!

OOCIA members should have received the annual assessment billing statements for 2018. Along with normal budget considerations, several dynamic factors were considered in working on the 2018 budget and will be discussed further in this newsletter. After attending our budget workshop, the Board voted to keep the assessment fees the same for 2018. The Board voted on the 2018 budget at the general monthly meeting November 21. The 2018 budget will be published on the website.

Important – Payment is due on January 1. Payments after January 31 will have a late fee and interest charges added. If payment is still not received the next month, in addition to increasing monthly interest, you will accrue charges for letters sent to you from Crest and our attorney. Your total owed will become quite large very quickly.

Don't let this happen to you! If you are having trouble paying the entire assessment fee, call Crest Management (281-579-0761) and tell them you would like to use the payment plan. It is very important you have your fee paid or be entered into a payment plan by the end of January 2018.

If you ever talk to friends in other subdivisions and compare assessment fees, make sure you are aware of the expenses each one covers. For instance, in some areas,

President's Letter - continued

homeowners pay directly to the trash companies for their service; ours are included in the assessment fee. That amount alone is about one third of our total expense. We contract for dedicated patrol by four deputies; others pay for no dedicated patrol. Those two expenses together constitute more than half of the total fee.

The next largest single amount is the streetlight utility cost. During the year we deactivated 50 lights located out of our boundaries. We aggressively pursued competing energy broker alternatives to settle on a five-year contract, which is projected to yield an approximate \$10,000/year savings. Then in addition, we identified a slip-up in setting up new streetlight accounts in 2015-2016. The erroneous coding caused us to be overcharged due to sales and location related taxes. After discovering this 11 months ago, we are finally expecting a refund of \$5,600. These three factors decrease the amount budgeted from \$150,000 to \$116,400 in streetlight utility cost, for a reduction of \$33,600 for the 2018 budget.

Take time – Please be sure to take time in the new year to refresh your knowledge of the deed restrictions and architectural control guidelines you signed when you bought your home. Take time to walk across the street, turn around and look at how your home impacts our neighborhood. Your responsibility to keep your yard and home clean and attractive affects all the homeowners and our property values. Take the time to make your front yard something your neighbors enjoy seeing.

A Note From the Treasurer

My husband Douglas and I moved from Portland, Oregon and purchased our first ever HOA home here in Olde Oaks back in 2013. HOAs are not common practice in the Pacific NW, so my learning curve came rushing at me quite rapidly once I agreed to become a Board member. It's been a wonderful experience with lots of fun times along the way with the other Board members and with the OOCIA members who have helped get me up to speed. Everyone has been very supportive, and it has been greatly appreciated.

It has been quite a year learning how OOCIA/Waterford Park's HOA operates and trying to help find ways to make the "bottom" line work in our favor. I think that everyone has done a great job in keeping that bottom line a positive number, especially as the number was anticipated to be in the negative range. Yay! It was a great concerted effort by the members of the Finance Committee, as well as the Board members.

The Board has not only met at the monthly meetings, but we have also met at what we call "side" Board meetings. We even met at more than one side meeting in a few of those months. The Board has worked very hard to ensure that the assessments would not be raised, even though there were strong indications that it would have to happen. The majority of what will be helping keep our assessments the same was largely due to the MUD donations, as well as the reduction in electric bills

(streetlights), and making sure that all electric accounts were placed in tax exempt status (no sales tax). Because of these elements, OOCIA's assessments will remain the same.

Some other ways we will be improving the operating and reserve funds of OOCIA are briefly listed below. I will be going into more detail on any (or all) of these items at the Board meetings through the remainder of the year. You only need to ask for further clarification on the listed items below. In brief, the following will be the Board's financial plans for the remainder of this year, and into 2018:

- Aggressive actions are currently being taken to reduce our accounts receivable that will bring OOCIA more in line with industry standard aging of the accounts receivable.
- Reserve study was completed to aid OOCIA in funding
 future repair and replacement needs of the community
 area assets such as monuments, irrigation systems, fencing,
 playground structures and mailbox stations. There are no
 planned large projects that would increase expenditures for
 the upcoming year.
- Better management of the funds to create greater returns on our investments (higher yields).

From our home to yours, Douglas and I wish you the very best Christmas and a happy and prosperous New Year.



Contributions From MUD 20 and MUD 44

The attractively landscaped and well-maintained TC Jester green median between Cypresswood and FM 1960 provides a much-needed aesthetic appeal to the entire surrounding area, particularly given the nearby FM 1960 challenge. To date, the cost burden has been borne exclusively by OOCIA members within their HOA fees. This year we approached MUD 44 and MUD 20 for their assistance to consider more fairly distributing the cost since there is an obvious shared public benefit to the area.

After careful consideration, MUD 44 indicated they would contribute \$20,000. Then MUD 20 followed with their decision to contribute \$30,000, giving a total of \$50,000 toward our 2018 cost burden of the TC Jester green median. We are very appreciative for these contributions and hope our residents will extend their gratitude also! Both MUDs made it clear their decisions were a "vote of confidence" in the OOCIA HOA Board's recent decisions and actions, making it clear future Board actions could either help or hinder future MUD considerations.


To date, OOCIA has paid for all TC Jester green median expenditures. We paid for initial investments like the landscape and irrigation system, daily operating expenses consisting of repairing the irrigation system, routine landscape maintenance, mowing, and mulch, increase in water costs, and every 2-3 years

major tree-trimming and fertilization. For 2017 that cost is anticipated to be approximately \$75,000. The recent reserve study clearly identified that significant money needs to be set aside for future major overhaul/replacement of our extensive aging irrigation system.

We so appreciate the MUDs and their contributions, which provide a way in which the costs of maintaining an obvious area of public benefit is balanced out. **Thank you, MUD 44** and MUD 20!
