Community meetings, formal changes that affect the community, and committee reports are primarily communicated through email blasts from Crest Management, the newsletter, and the OOCIA.org website, but may show up on Nextdoor as well.

Residents, please make sure you quickly report all suspicious activity, any accidents, robberies, and other criminal activity to the police quickly and first. It is so important to contact the police before posting on Nextdoor. Proper and immediate reporting to the authorities will aid in making the area safer. Posting to

Nextdoor is great for neighborhood awareness, but does not necessarily curb criminal activity. Please contact our local deputies via the non-emergency number at 713-221-6000. There's no other way they can be sure that the report is not frivolous or in error. A reminder: Additional contact information is consistently listed in this newsletter under "Who You Gonna Call?"

WE'RE HAVING what KIND OF MEETING?

Confused about the difference between a Board meeting and a townhall, or an annual meeting and a special meeting? Here's some clarification.

ANNUAL MEETINGS

Annual meetings – or annual membership meetings – are required by our governing documents, which specify the annual meeting will be held on the second Wednesday of February of each year at 7 p.m. and specify how and when members are to be notified about the meeting. This is the main meeting of the year with a primary purpose of electing directors, presenting the financial position of the community, and discussing items of common interest. It is a meeting of all members of the OOCIA.

SPECIAL MEETINGS

Special meetings are unscheduled and are held for a specific purpose. They may be called by the president or a majority of the Board of Directors and are open to all members. They may also be called by association members if they get a minimum number of signatures on a petition that states exactly what issue or problem they want to discuss and present it to the Board president or secretary. Members must be notified of the exact purpose of the meeting, and the meeting must be limited specifically to achieving this purpose.

BOARD MEETINGS

The Board of Directors' meetings are meetings between a quorum of the voting Board of our association during which property owners' business is considered and the Board takes formal action. Board members set policy, oversee manager's work, resolve disputes, and may have an open session to allow homeowners to ask questions about the business discussed. Although this is a meeting of the Board to discuss their business, it must be open to the owners. If the Board considers actions involving personnel, pending litigation, contract negotiations, or enforcement actions or matters that are to remain confidential, the Board adjourns to a closed executive session. Any decision made in the executive session is summarized orally in general terms.

TOWN OR TOWN HALL MEETINGS

Town or Town Hall meetings are informal gatherings intended to promote two-way communication. The Board may want to present a controversial issue or explore important questions like the updating and amending of governing documents. Board directors are advised to provide a process or method by which homeowners may express a collective will. These types of meetings are one area where this could be accomplished.







Report any suspicious activity on the property to the sheriff's department immediately to prevent anyone from taking up residency without any lawful purpose to 713-221-6000. Pool issues need to be reported to Crest and Harris County Public Health – Neighborhood Nuisance. There is a Google/Apple app for your phones to report such items.

Deed restrictions are strictly enforced so that our property continues to hold value and potential new residents are greeted with a pleasant environment.


Homes that are in need of mowing, inoperable vehicles, storing recreation vehicles or boats in driveways, facades in need of paint, and visible mold are some of the listed violations that can be reported to Crest Management. If you have not read the restrictions, please go to http://oocia.org/info.php under the Neighborhood Info tab, find which section you are in, and read about your homeowner responsibilities.

Crest Management maintains a list of homes that they mow their grass when not cared for routinely. This is called "forced mow." These homes are mowed by the HOA and billed to the homeowner. To avoid this expense, please maintain your lawns.

To report violations, contact Pam Hummel, Assistant Community Manager, at 281-945-4661 or Pam.Hummel@crestmanagement.com.

If you receive a notice of correction, take a look at what Crest has noted. If it is accurate, please make the correction. If there is a dispute, take a photograph with a date/time stamp and send a letter/email to Pam at Crest detailing the objection. If you still do not find resolution, you can appeal to the Board and we will listen to the appeal during executive session. Send your request for appeal to Chuck Cornelius at ccorneliusoocia@gmail.com. The key is to document everything and make sure you read the Deed Restrictions for your home. Follow the basic steps for proper reporting. This helps the management company help residents stay in compliance. Talk to the neighbor. If you feel the neighbor is uncooperative or in need of assistance, please contact the management company by phone or email. Social media notifications or discussions will not prompt management action.

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
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
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
