From the President

There's been activity large and small since our last newsletter. Our strategic planning committee is researching the potential impact of statewide flooding on OOCIA. There's a great deal of information to process, but when we've distilled the information, it will be provided to the Board with recommendations and, of course, shared with you.

There have been questions regarding our trash pickup. We were recently approached by WCA about a contract price increase of \$2.39 per household, per month. We are comparing this rate with other companies. Their proposal was driven by decreased reimbursement from recycling centers. We are still under the current trash contract. They do recycle glass for OOWP. Trash pickup is twice a week on Mondays and Thursdays. If trash pickup falls on a holiday, they will not be providing service. Pickup will then be on the next scheduled day.

We are still spraying twice per week for mosquitoes.

The Little Library in Kennonview Park is back! Please see Susan Szota's article at right for details.

For our neighbors in arrears on their fees, a payment plan is available. The cost for the payment plan is \$50 for the first three months and \$10 for each additional month, which the homeowner pays up front. If you are interested, please contact Crest Management.

We ask every resident to do their part to keep their property looking attractive. Please see the articles by Chuck Cornelius on ACC and the deed restriction process and continue to pitch in with keeping Olde Oaks and Waterford Park a great place to live.

ACC reminder

ACC Application Process for Your Home Improvement or Modification

Summer home improvements are happening. Anytime you have an exterior modification, you, the homeowner, will need to submit an application for approval by the ACC prior to beginning work (this includes painting and repainting of siding, trim, brick, etc.). The goal of the ACC is to serve both you and the community by determining that your finished improvement will comply with the deed restrictions and enhance the value of your property and our neighborhood. For more information, please visit http://oocia.org/arc.php.

The application must be complete (http://oocia.org/docs/OLDE_OAKS_ACC_JULY_15.pdf) and accurate, including exact details of request. After the application is completed, submit it for approval. Submit your completed application to Dale Caskey at Crest via dale.caskey@crest-management. com. Dale reviews the document for completeness and then forwards the application to the ACC Committee for review and approval.

On average, once Dale sends the ACC application to the ACC committee, decision generally is given within 48 hours back to Dale to process. If Dale needs additional information,


she will contact you right away. Please respond to her accordingly. The sooner she has the complete application, the quicker she can get it to the committee.

Some of the more common problems that slow down the approval process are:

- 1. missing or inaccurate paint sample color or description;
- 2. missing documentation for roofing material; and
- 3. fence wood type and land plot showing the fence line to be replaced and/or added.

Homeowners should ensure that all the documents are complete and accurate. Accuracy is mandatory for approval, and if it is not done correctly, will slow the process for approval, which would delay your improvement and potentially be a financial burden.





A Positive Image Indeed

Lawn maintenance throughout the summer is important. Helpful ideas for a great lawn may be to fertilize your lawn for a seasonal treat to help create a healthy appearance. Fungus and weeds can take over your lawn, damage your grass, and inhibit healthy lawn growth. Edging is important, and taking this important step promotes a healthy and beautiful appearance of your home for your enjoyment and that of your neighbors. Your home's flower beds should be free of weeds, including maintained mulch. Mulch maintenance helps in preventing future weed growth and aids in water usage. Edging should also occur at the curb, keeping the curb free from plant growth and obstructions. Please mow, edge, and prune regularly.

Deed restrictions and legal restrictions are in place to provide an aesthetic community environment and are strictly enforced. Homes that are in need of mowing can be reported to Crest via email. Homes that are not maintained are subjected to management mowing with the cost billed to the homeowner. To avoid this expense, please maintain your lawns. If you see a property that is in need of TLC, please contact Crest Management. If you have not read the restrictions, please go to http://oocia.org/info.php under the Neighborhood Information tab, find which section you are in, and read about your homeowner responsibilities.

Basic homeownership rules to follow: Keep your exterior maintained and tidy; remove disabled or inoperable cars and keep your driveway free of trailers or campers; keep trash cans out of sight behind a privacy fence or in the garage. If you receive a notice of correction, take a look at what Crest has noted. If it is accurate, please make the correction. If there is a dispute, take a photograph with a date/time stamp and send a letter/email to Dale at Crest detailing the objection. If you still do not find resolution, you can appeal to the Board and we will listen to the appeal

during executive session. Send your request for appeal to Chuck at ccorneliusoocia@gmail.com. The key is to document everything and make sure you read the Deed Restrictions for your home. Following the basic steps for proper reporting, this helps the management company help residents stay in compliance. Talk to the neighbor. If you feel the neighbor is uncooperative or in need of assistance, please contact the management company by phone or email. Social media notifications or discussions will not prompt management action.

Vacant homes near you with pools in need of care? Please make sure Crest and Chuck C. are aware of the property and address via email. Report any suspicious activity on the property to the Sheriff's Department immediately to prevent anyone from taking up residency without any lawful purpose to 713-221-6000. Pool issues need to be reported to Crest and Harris County Public Health – Neighborhood Nuisance. There is a Google and Apple app for your phones to report such items. Visit www.hcphes.org/divisions_and_offices/environmental_public_health or call 713-274-6300. Business hours are Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

If you observe and/or have a complaint about a Deed Restriction violation, email Dale at Crest (dale.caskey@crest-management.com) with location, details of the complaint, and photographs if possible. Please do not trespass on your neighbors' property to obtain photos.
