OLDE OAKS COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT ASSOCIATION



The Olde Oaks Community Improvement Association (OOCIA) consists of the Olde Oaks and Waterford Park subdivisions, and affairs are run by a Board of Directors. The Board consists of five directors who are elected by the Association membership at the Annual Members' Meeting in February. Of the five, three are elected in even-numbered years and two are elected in odd-numbered years; thus three (3) directors will be elected at the Annual Members' Meeting to be held on Wednesday, February 10, 2016. Official notice will be mailed out in January 2016.

To be an OOCIA Board Director, an applicant must be a property owner or legal representative of said property owner in Olde Oaks or Waterford Park. Thus, tenants living in Olde Oaks or Waterford Park are not eligible to run for the Board. By Texas HOA Law, anyone having been convicted of a felony or a crime involving moral turpitude within the last 20 years is automatically disqualified from serving on the Board.

Candidates must be willing to commit to approximately twenty (20) hours per month to fulfill the responsibilities of a director which can include, but are not limited to, working together as a team, following directions of the directors' final decisions, commitment to the hierarchy order of the Board, following Robert's Rules of Order, attendance at the monthly Board meetings (held on the second Wednesday of each month from 5:45-9:30 p.m., approximately), participation on Association Committees, and responding to all forms of communications such as emails, texts, and conference calls as required to conduct business.

Any eligible member interested in running for a Board seat should contact our property manager, Ola Guess, Crest Management, at 281-945-4615 or by email at ola.guess@crest-management.com. There will also be a link on www.oocia.org to a 2016 HOA Board Candidate Bio Form, which can be filled out and submitted to Ola.

Assessments due January 1, 2016

The 2016 OOCIA Assessment remains at \$575. Statements were mailed in November, with fees due January 1, 2016 and considered late on January 31, 2016. Please take measures to ensure timely payment or advance arrangements to avoid any incremental charges. If unpaid, a late fee of \$30 will be added to your account on February 1, 2016 and a statement will be mailed to you. If still unpaid by February 29, 2016, then a reminder fee of \$20 will also be added to your account on March 1, 2016 and another statement will be mailed to you.

Top Six Reasons to Walk for Better Health in Our Neighborhood

As we all find ways to improve our health, walking is a simple way to get started. Here are several reasons why you should incorporate it into your day:

- 1. Experts suggest walking 6,000 steps a day to improve health and 10,000 steps a day to lose weight.
- 2. A 20-minute walk, or about 2,000 steps, equals a mile.
- 3. Walking briskly for one mile in 15 minutes burns approximately the same amount of calories as does jogging an equal distance in 8.5 minutes.
- Less than 50% of American adults exercise enough to gain significant health or benefits. Inactivity is the second leading cause of preventable death in the US, second only to tobacco use.
- 5. The best way to lose weight by walking is to take a longer, moderately paced walk (40 minutes at 60-65% maximum heart rate). Shorter, faster walks (20-25 minutes at 75%-85% maximum heart rate) are best for conditioning the heart and lungs.
- The Top Reason: There is a group being formed in our neighborhood called the Water Oaks Walkers.

If you notice a streetlight has a burned out bulb or the fixture is malfunctioning, including bulbs going on and off or staying on all day, please report this to CenterPoint Energy so the problem can be fixed immediately.

Following are ways to report a streetlight needing repair:

- 1. Report the six-digit pole number (located about six feet off the ground and on the front of the pole), online by visiting http://slo.centerpointenergy.com.
- 2. If you do not know the six-digit pole number, you can use CenterPoint's mapping service online at http://gis.centerpointenergy.com/sloreporting.
- 3. Call CenterPoint at 713-207-2222. Have pole number available.

Report the outage even if someone else may have made a report. Multiple reports will help bring attention to the outage and move the work action up in priority. According to CenterPoint, streetlight repairs are typically completed within three days. However, if the outage is due to extensive damage, such as underground cable failure, the repair can take as long as two to three weeks.

Streetlight Installation Update

This year's HOA Board undertook a comprehensive streetlighting project. Unfortunately, many streets and cul-de-sacs around the neighborhood had inadequate lighting or no lighting at all because of the absence of a streetlight. The HOA Board received complaints about cars idling in dark areas, which was a cause for concern. As a result, the Board approved the installation of streetlights in various areas throughout the neighborhood.

Sixty-plus lights will be installed, not including the additional lighting on TC Jester Boulevard. At the time of writing this piece for the newsletter, 95% of the additional streetlights have been placed in the ground, again, not accounting for the lights along TC Jester. The streetlights are being installed in CenterPoint Energy's utility right-of-way, and they will be energized in phases after all the fixtures are installed. The streetlights on TC Jester will be the first lights to work because of the roadway's designation as a major thoroughfare. Due to speeding, recent accidents, the activation of traffic signals and the new lights being in a linear pattern, CenterPoint designated these lights to be the first to be energized.

CenterPoint's goal is to have all of the new streetlights installed and working by the end of this year.

The Board also approved the installation of streetlights at both ends of TC Jester Boulevard, which currently do not have any streetlights. Once complete, TC Jester will be lit from FM 1960 to Cypresswood Drive.

Several complaints and inquiries have been received from homeowners wanting to know why the Board would spend money on streetlights not within the boundaries of the community. The simple answer is safety. TC Jester is also now one of the many "front doors" of Olde Oaks and Waterford Park, and adding streetlights will hopefully not entice people that do not live in the neighborhood to wander down a dark road and then do harm to a person or homes, in addition to helping drivers see the roadway at night, and hopefully increasing property values along the roadway. It is also important to note the Board solicited contributions from the many different entities that can benefit from the lights. Wal-Mart, MUD 20 and the Enclave at Olde Oaks have all agreed to contribute their equal share to the installation cost of the lights on the portion of TC Jester closest to FM 1960.

Many property owners are also not aware, but the HOA pays for streetlights outside of the boundaries of Olde Oaks and Waterford Park for every street that leads into the community. Lights on Terrace Oaks Drive from FM 1960 to Pebble Trace, Walters Road from FM 1960 to just before Windbriar Court, Pebble Bend from FM 1960 to just before Fernglade and Brightwood Drive from Stuebner-Airline Road to just a few hundred feet before Denbrook, are all paid for by the HOA, yet outside of Olde Oaks boundaries.

In addition, the HOA pays to maintain and mow the grass near all the entrance monuments, all of which is not on land owned by Olde Oaks. Last, previous Boards decided to install sprinkler systems and plant trees within all the esplanades along the newly-opened portions of TC Jester. Those trees are also fertilized by the HOA, and the grass and mulch maintenance is also paid for by the HOA (in addition to the monthly water bill).

Arguably, most of these items could be turned over to the county and designated as their responsibility (with the exception of streetlights, as Harris County has a policy of not installing or paying for streetlights along their roadways, unlike the City of Houston which installs and pays for streetlights along all of its roads). However, if these things were turned over to the county, the grass would not be cut weekly, trees would not be fertilized and pruned on a regular schedule, and mulch would not be placed around trees semiannually. In turn, the roadway would begin looking derelict and such would surely negatively affect all of our property values. While paying for these items may not be favored by all homeowners, it is the only way to assure our property values stay up and keep the neighborhood looking presentable for residents and visitors.

The Board thanks all homeowners for their cooperation during this project, and we hope everyone understands this project was undertaken to increase safety and the perception of safety around Olde Oaks and Waterford Park in addition to protecting property values.

Waterford Park Pond Lighting Update


The installation of lights around the pond in Waterford Park has officially begun. A project kickoff meeting was held on Wednesday, November 11, and the light installation should be complete by the time you are reading this newsletter (weather permitting).

The HOA Board solicited a contribution for the cost of this lighting project from MUD 20 and they generously offered to pay for the entire project, which totals about \$47,000. In addition, MUD 20 also offered to pay for the cost of electricity for the lights.

The vast majority of the owners with property backing up to the pond approved the installation of the lights to alleviate the darkness around the pond after dusk. The new fixtures will be similar to the River Oaks poles at the entrances to Olde Oaks; however, the light will be a soft or warm white color emitted from energy-efficient LEDs.

The HOA Board would like to extend thanks to the MUD 20 Board for their generous contribution toward this project. We hope all residents enjoy the new lights around the pond.




