On October 20, the book club will meet at the home of Carol Bright, and Heather George will be the discussion leader. A popular book these days, *All the Light We Cannot See*, by Anthony Doerr, is on our agenda for discussion.

All the Light We Cannot See is a novel about a blind French girl and a German boy whose paths collide in occupied France as they both try to survive the devastation of World War II. It's a work, ten years in the writing, of strife and transcendence as people try to be good to each other against all odds. New stories can still be told about this well-documented period of history. The author is very skillful in incorporating information about physics and mathematics, radio communications, birds, physiology and psychology of blindness, the anatomy of mollusks, and the education of Hitler's Youth elite. All of this is woven into the novel without being pedantic.

Anthony Doerr was born in 1973 in Cleveland and received a BA from Bowdoin College and an MFA from Bowling Green State University. He is a fiction writer who has won various literary awards including the 2015 Pulitzer Prize for Fiction for All the Light We Cannot See, published in May 2014,

and the 2015 Andrew Carnegie Medal for Excellence in Fiction. For 2007-2010 he was the writer-in-residence for the state of Idaho. He now writes a column on science books for the Boston Globe and is a contributor to *The Morning News*.

Other works include the Shell Collector, written in 2002, which is a work of stories that take place in Africa and New Zealand, where he has lived and worked. He also wrote Four Seasons in Rome: On Twins, Insomnia, and the Best Funeral in the History of the World. Doerr presently lives in Boise, Idaho with his wife and twin sons.

If this is your first fall in Texas or you are a born Texan, you will notice that changes are occurring. The days are getting longer due to the full moon, or "harvest moon," that is brightly illuminated, which allows farmers to work longer in the moonlight. The equinox (the first day of autumn) was Wednesday, September 23. This is the first time when the sun passes the equator headed south and the north pole tilts away from the sun, giving day and night hours the same illumination for the same length of time. The harvest moon does not actually do anything other than create a beautiful night sky display.

The changing of the days brings with it the change in temperature. Nights drop to the mid-60s and then stay around the mid-80s. It is suggested to not start pruning your trees and shrubs yet so that you will enjoy the spring flowers; although, now is the time to take care of the severely damaged wood. Planting vegetables is ideal in September for beans, beets, broccoli, Brussels sprouts, carrots, cauliflower, kale, leeks and radishes along with the ideal time to do your re-planting of spring perennials like marigolds, daisies, daffodils, daylilies, and other fall plants.
