Rest easy and know you are being watched over while you sleep. We are fortunate to have a group of officers who are dedicated to our safety. Our contract deputies work hard to ensure that we are protected. Meet Deputy Matthew Amador. Deputy Amador spends his evenings patrolling our area, keeping a watchful eye out for any criminal activity. Deputy Amador has been trained in law enforcement



and comes from a family of law officers. If he sees you out walking early mornings as the sun rises, he may stop to offer you a friendly hello, and if you are not visible he has been known to have a neon vest handy to give to you to make your walk safer.

Deputy Amador says that lighting is helpful to identify activity at your home. Make sure that your home is well lit. Movement in front of lights on your home is a quick and easy way for the patrol to notice a crime in progress or an unwanted trespasser. If a motion light comes on as the patrol goes by, it alerts them, and they will survey the area for criminal activity. Install lights in all dark areas. Help them help us by keeping your home well lit.

Auto Security

Do not leave valuable items in your vehicle. Try to park your vehicle in your garage. If the garage is not accessible, park in your driveway. Always keep your car doors locked. Do not leave your vehicle title in the car (hide it so thieves cannot try to use it if they steal your vehicle). Alarm your car with an anti-theft system. Park it in a well-lit area or install motion lights.

Outside Alarm Sirens

If your home is currently monitored by a security alarm, adding an external siren will help alert your neighbors of a potential emergency. Smoke detectors and fire alarms can be added easily to your siren for added protection.

Panic Alarms

Many systems come with panic alarms that can be installed in rooms or even worn. The wearable controls can be programmed to call fire or police. These are great for any resident.

The following statement was prepared by the Association's attorneys at Roberts Markel Weinberg Butler Hailey PC.

Earlier this year in May, the Association terminated its management contract with ACMI. Since then, ACMI filed a lawsuit against the Association claiming the termination was a breach of its contract. The lawsuit is styled: 2015-40291; Williams ACMI Ventures, L.P. v. Olde Oaks Community Improvement Association, Inc.; in the 164th Judicial District Court of Harris County, Texas. In response to the lawsuit, the Association retained Roberts Markel Weinberg Butler Hailey PC ("RMWBH"), a Houston-based law firm that represents property owners' associations across Texas. At this time, the litigation is in its early stages, but RMWBH is working with the Association to resolve this matter in a timely and effective manner. Because this lawsuit is active, the Board of Directors is prohibited from discussing matters related to this lawsuit which are not already public record.

GARAGE SAFETY

- Make sure that the garage door opener control button is out of reach of small children so that they do not play with the controls. Consult the owner's manual and learn how to use the garage door's emergency release feature. This can be important in case of a power outage or other emergency.
- Visually inspect the garage door each month. Look at springs, cables, rollers and pulleys for signs of wear. Do not
 - attempt to remove, adjust or repair these parts or anything attached to them. A trained door repairman must make adjustments to these parts, which are under high tension.
- Never place fingers between door sections, and explain the dangers to children. If you have small children, consider a door with panels that can't pinch. Avoid cables, springs, and riding or playing on a moving door.
- While on vacation, unplug the garage door opener unit or use a vacation lock console security





- switch, which renders remotes unusable and is an optional accessory to most openers.
- Never leave the remote control in the car or with a parking attendant. Consider using a key chain remote and always lock the entry to the inside of your home especially if your opener is programmed to your vehicle. It is a small inconvenience for safety and security.







No yard waste bag or bundle should weigh more than 40 pounds.

SIGNS OF A STROKE

Personal Experience Shared by Patricia Spicer

When I had a stroke 22 years ago, all the doctors could do was watch. Today, if you get to the hospital within three hours, there is treatment available; treatments which can minimize damage to the brain and treatments which can limit complications.

What to do if you suspect someone may be having a stroke:

- Ask person to smile
- Ask person to lift both arms up
- Ask person to repeat a simple sentence
- Ask person to stick out the tongue

Failure to perform any of the above actions may indicate the person is having a stroke. **Dial 911** for an ambulance to the hospital. **Do not drive to emergency room.** You might have to wait in line as other less urgent patients are seen.
