#### **Protect Your Pipes and Faucets**

- Locate all pipes and sprinkler systems on the outer walls inside and out. Pipes can be wrapped with heat tape, fiberglass insulation or foam sleeves.
- Seal any areas allowing cold air to leak into exposed pipes.
- Disconnect any hoses and sprinklers from outside faucets and wrap faucets with insulated materials to prevent breakage in cold weather.

## Have Your Heating and Cooling System Inspected and Serviced

- Call to schedule your yearly HVAC inspection.
- Schedule early to ensure a spot on the HVAC company's schedule and to prevent emergency visits.
- Change all air filters to maximize furnace life and efficiency.

#### **Check Your Chimney and Flue**

- Schedule an inspection ahead of the rush to make sure that your chimney can be cleaned to remove any buildup to ensure safety.
- Reverse your ceiling fans in the winter to direct the warm air downward.



Barbara Smith is our new Editor; her perspective as a new resident and graphic design/website development background will rapidly become evident.

Sgt. Martinez, the Precinct 1 Contract Deputy Coordinator, was present along with three of our four contract deputies (one was on night duty). They provided very good neighborhood and personal security tips and addressed specific questions posed by those residents present.

For some time, resident attendance at our Board meetings has been sparse and the meeting format became somewhat relaxed. However, as resident attendance hopefully continues to improve we will adhere to the Board meeting standard protocol whereby residents will have the floor at the end of business, in the open Q and A session. Please make plans to attend the next Board meeting on **November 12.** Your opinions, suggestions and involvement can make a big difference in efforts to improve this community.



## Book Club

Book Club this month will be **Tuesday, October 28** at the home of Jerry Lutz, and I will be discussion leader for *The Invention of Wings* by Sue Monk Kidd. This is the third book of hers that we've discussed over the years, two of which have been made into movies, *The Secret Life of Bees* and *The Mermaid Chair*.

This is the story of Hetty "Handful" Grimke, a young slave who has been given to 11-year-old Sarah Grimke of a wealthy Charleston family. Handful yearns for a life beyond that of a slave, and Sarah yearns to be a jurist. Of course the latter's ambition was thwarted by family expectations and societal norms for that period. The book follows their lives for the next 35 years as a fictionalized account of the actual Grimke sisters.

Sarah Grimke and her sister, Angelina, were the first female abolition agents and among the earliest major American feminist thinkers. We've no doubt all heard of Lucretia Mott and Elizabeth Cady Stanton, and here are Sarah Grimke, the first woman in the United States to write a comprehensive feminist manifesto and her sister, Angelina, the first woman to speak before a legislative body in Charleston, South Carolina.

## "Footnotes"

They were famous in the 1830's but also infamous. Ms. Kidd extensively researched these sisters and felt a failing that their story is so unknown. She had driven by their unmarked house for years in Charleston.



It was quite fascinating to read the author's notes in the back of the book about Ms. Kidd's research on the Grimkes and also the background on the story quilts of the African-American tradition. Quilting also figures into the book with Handful as the quilter. The story quilt theme was inspired by the magnificent quilts of Harriet Powers, an enslaved woman from Georgia who used the African applique technique to tell stories about Biblical events and historical legends. Two of these quilts are on exhibit at the National Museum of American History in Washington, DC and the Museum of Fine Arts in Boston.


