- Deed Restrictions: View the Olde Oaks/Waterford Park website (www.oocia.org) – Neighborhood Information tab, left side. These legal restrictions are in place to provide an aesthetic community environment and are strictly enforced.
- Signs: Postings not permitted on stop signs, streetlight
  poles, monument entrances, or in your front yard, other
  than "Home for Sale/Rent" signs. If you wish to communicate
  a future garage sale, you may contact Barbara, our OOCIA
  editor, at oldeoakseditor@hotmail.com to post the date of sale
  or join (for free) www.nextdoor.com to advertise the date of
  your sale/address. This has proven to be extremely effective for
  neighbors in the past. We will have a community garage sale
  in March.
- Household and Yard Trash: Set out only on Monday and
   <u>Thursday mornings</u> on trash days to prevent an unsightly
   appearance in our community and disturbance by wildlife.
   <u>Please return your trash receptacles to your garage or out of view from street</u> after pickup on Monday and Thursday.
- Lawn: This is a perfect time to treat your lawn with a fungicide and winter fertilizer. Many lawns have become tainted with fungus which damages the grass and inhibits the healthy growth of your lawn. Taking this important step promotes a healthy and beautiful appearance of your home for your enjoyment and that of your neighbors. Also, please mow, edge and prune regularly.
- Weeds: Free your beds of weeds and maintain approximately two to four inches of mulch. This not only prevents future weed growth, but reduces water usage. Tackling at least one bed a week makes this a doable weekend project and reduces future work in the yard.

- Drainage System: We are fortunate to have an abundance of beautiful trees in our community. Unfortunately, with this asset we also have to deal with a large quantity of falling leaves. Bag the leaves and place on your driveway Monday or Thursday for trash pickup. Also, take a few extra minutes to sweep up leaves in the street near the curb in order to prevent them from traveling from your property to your "downhill" neighbor's property or into the drainage system. We want our drainage system to be clear of debris to effectively prevent flooding.
- ACC Approval: Homeowners planning an improvement to the exterior of the home or elsewhere on the property must obtain written approval prior to beginning work on the modification from Architectural Control Committee (ACC) at www.oocia.org (tab on left for application). This includes painting and repainting of siding, trim, brick, etc.! The goal of the ACC is to serve both you and the community by determining that your finished improvement will comply with the deed restrictions and enhance the value of your property and our neighborhood.

Stop signs in our neighborhood play an important role in traffic safety. Stop signs are placed at designated corners for a definite purpose. Attaching posters and signage on stop signs and the stop sign poles is a driver distraction and is extremely dangerous.

There are rules and regulations pertaining to signage in our community. No signs can be nailed to telephone poles as detailed by the City of Houston Sign Ordinance or adhered to traffic signs (stop signs, yield signs, street signs, etc.)

The City of Houston Sign Code prohibits two specific types of signs – Spectacular Signs and Bandit Signs as detailed in Sec. 28-39, posting advertising matter on utility poles, trees, traffic signs, etc. To learn more about sign regulations, visit www.houstontx.gov/council/5/faq.html.

To report what you suspect to be an illegal sign, call the City of Houston's Sign Administration Office in the Code Enforcement Division at 832-394-8840.





# Caring for your Holiday Plants

Holiday plants such as poinsettias, Christmas cacti and the amaryllis are longtime favorites that require similar care and can be coaxed into blooming for future holiday seasons.

Poinsettias can come in red, white, pink, yellow or bi-color varieties. To rejuvenate your plant, move it outside when night temperatures are not apt to fall much below 50 degrees F and prune to keep it bushy and compact. To initiate flowering, the poinsettia needs long nights in complete darkness starting in early October. Cover plant with a cardboard box or keep it in a closet from about 5 p.m. to 8 a.m. and water sparingly. When buds form in early December, stop dark treatment.

Like poinsettias, Christmas cacti are available in many colors including red, white, pink, cream, and fuchsia. Long-lived, they may produce beautiful blooms year around. You can force the cactus into bloom at Christmas by providing long nights starting around October 1. You can also persuade it to flower by subjecting it to cool night temperatures of 50-55 degrees F starting in early November.

Although amaryllis can be purchased at any stage of development, it is more fun to grow your own plant from a bulb. Most bulbs are sold already potted and with complete growing instructions. Once watering is started, you can expect kiltlike blooms of red, pink, white or orange in four to six weeks. After flowering, grow the amaryllis as a foliage plant until leaves grow yellow. Then store the potted bulb on its side in a cool, dark room, basement or closet for eight to ten weeks. When new growth appears, repot bulb and return it to the light to start the cycle again.

Once your holiday plants are back on track, display them away from drafts in a bright room – but not in direct sunlight – and keep in moist but not soggy soil.

# Board of Directors' Nominations and Applications

The Olde Oaks Community Improvement Association (OOCIA) consists of the Olde Oaks and Waterford Park subdivisions, and its affairs are run by a Board of Directors.

The Board consists of five directors who are elected by the Association membership at the Annual Members' Meeting in February. Of the five directors, three are elected in even-numbered years and two are elected in odd-numbered years; thus, two directors will be elected at the Annual Members' Meeting to be held on **February 11, 2015**.

Any members interested in running for one of the two open Board positions are encouraged to complete the Application Form and submit it to the Nominating Committee for consideration. Applications not received by 4 p.m. on **December 26** can still volunteer to run for the Board as a "write-in candidate" at the Annual Members' Meeting.

To be a director, an applicant must be a member of the Association, which means they must own a home in Olde Oaks or Waterford Park. Thus, tenants living in Olde Oaks or Waterford Park are not eligible to run for the Board. As a result of recent changes in Texas law, no one who has been convicted of a felony or crime of moral turpitude can become a Board member.

Applicants must also be willing to commit to approximately a minimum of 10-15 hours per month to fulfill the responsibilities of a director which include, but are not limited to, attendance at the monthly Board meetings, held on the second Wednesday of the month from 6:45-9 p.m. (approximately); participation on Association committees; and responding to emails and/or participation on conference calls as required to conduct business.

Applications for the Board can be submitted by email to info@ACMImgmt.com or by mail to OOCIA Nominating Committee, c/o ACMI, 12603 Louetta Road, Suite 101, Cypress, TX 77429 with the subject line "OOCIA Nominating Committee."

All applications, which can be found online at www.oocia.org, must be received by ACMI no later than 4 p.m. on Monday, December 22.

This deadline will not be extended and any application received after this deadline will not be on the mailed or online ballots for residents. Late applicants may volunteer to run for the Board from the floor of the Annual Members' Meeting in February.



# Spring ISD News

# Receives Superior Rating in Financial Accountability

The Spring Independent School District received a rating of Superior Achievement for the 2012-13 fiscal year under the Financial Accountability Rating System of Texas, which is commonly referred to as School FIRST.

Ann Westbrooks, assistant superintendent of finance, said the district received the highest possible score in each category resulting in a perfect score overall.

Westbrooks said the primary objective of the rating system is to assess the quality of financial management in Texas public schools. The School FIRST rating system consists of 20 base indicators that analyze trends relating to financial management efficiencies. The first six indicators are answered with either a "yes" or "no" answer while the remaining indicators are assigned a point value. Each indicator is weighted equally with the exception of the first six. Failure to comply with any of the first six indicators would result in a substantial penalty and a rating of Substandard Achievement.


