

T.C. Jester Corridor Project Working Diligently on Mitigation

We are committed to addressing the reality of the impending T.C. Jester Corridor synchronized traffic lights in a positive and proactive manner. Commissioner Cagle indicates this project anticipates future traffic needs, yet for affected neighborhoods it is obvious that implementation will present immediate factors that require attention and action. We have been very persistent in highlighting concerns along with suggested solutions to Harris County Precinct 4 and will continue to do so. Preventing tragedy and defending neighborhood integrity are the obvious objectives.

Currently the traffic signal design is TxDOT standard "Z" span; traffic poles on the T.C. Jester median with T.C. Jester signals on mast arms and the side street signals suspended on wire/cable. Groundwork is anticipated to begin mid-May. Speed limits will remain the same and we are pressing hard for driver feedback radar speed signs to curtail speeding and red/yellow light running. We are striving to ensure there are rational traffic type restrictions through residential areas, particularly once the remainder of T.C. Jester is opened to Beltway 8. Funding and the necessary 100% T.C. Jester residents' approval on sidewalk/ walkways will be a big challenge if that is what enough T.C. Jester residents indicate they want and are willing to support, work for and possibly even contribute financially toward. Various aesthetic considerations are also being explored.



Friendly Community Reminders

Deed Restrictions are accessible at www.oocia.org under the "Neighborhood Information" tab. These legal restrictions are in place to promote an aesthetic community environment and are strictly enforced.

Signs are not permitted to be posted on stop signs, street light poles, monument entrances or in your front yard (other than "Home for Sale").

Household and yard trash is to be set out on Monday and Thursday mornings to prevent unsightly community appearance and wildlife disturbance. Please return your trash receptacles to areas out of sight after the Monday and Thursday pickups.

This is a perfect time to **weed and feed** your lawn. Many of our lawns are infused with weeds which inhibit the healthy growth, and this important step will help. Please mow/edge weekly.

Take the time to weed your flower beds and apply 3-4 inches of mulch. This not only prevents future weed growth, but reduces water usage. Tackling one bed a week makes this a "do-able" weekend project.

These beautiful trees in our community come with a price – lots of falling leaves. **Do not sweep leaves, etc. into the drainage system.** Drainage systems can only effectively help prevent flooding if kept clear. Be a good neighbor by sweeping up to prevent that rubbish from traveling downhill.

Homeowners planning improvements to the exterior of the home or elsewhere on the property must obtain written approval prior to beginning work on the modification (see www.oocia.org, "Architectural Control Guidelines" tab). Allow at least 30 days for review of your completed application. This includes painting and repainting of siding, trim, brick, etc.



On Tuesday, May 27 book club will meet at the home of Terri Checkles with Virginia McGriggs as discussion moderator for an autobiography, Prague Winter, by Madeleine K. Albright. Prague Winter is her personal story of remembrance and WWII from 1937-1948, An online source describes the

book as "a moving and thoughtful memoir of her formative years in Czechoslovakia during the tumult of Nazi occupation, WWII fascism, and the onset of the Cold War. An intensely personal journey into the past that offers vital lessons for the future, the book combines the intimacy of an autobiography with the drama of an exciting and well-told story."

Ms. Albright was born May 15, 1937 in Prague, Czechoslovakia. Her father, Josef Korbel, was a member of the Czech diplomatic service who worked in Belgrade, London, and Prague before he fled with his family after a Communist coup in 1948. The family was granted political asylum in the United States, and Josef began working at the University of Denver.

"Footnotes"

Ms. Albright became a naturalized citizen and eventually became our 64th Secretary of State from 1997-2001. She is known for her strong commitment to democracy, arms control, human rights, and peace in the Middle East, Africa, and other regions of conflict. After that office she authored several best sellers and is currently Chair of Albright Stonebridge Group, a global strategy firm, and Chair and Principal of Albright Capital Management LLC, an investment advisory company focused on emerging markets. She also serves on other Boards of foundations and councils related to foreign relations.

Returning to book club matters, we met at the home of Susan Muirhead on April 22 for a potluck lunch and book discussion as a change from our annual meetings at the park for sack lunches and book discussion. We're a flexible group! At our March meeting we decided to take a summer break from June through August and will resume meetings in September. I will also take a break from book club articles during these summer months. 
