

Olde Oaks/Waterford Park Residents' ALERT TC Jester Corridor Stop Lights

At the November 13, 2013 OOCIA Board meeting, Ms. Shannen Rumsey of Spring Creek Oaks (SCO) presented information regarding the Harris County/ TxDOT TC Jester Corridor project which will impact several subdivisions, including Olde Oaks. The TC Jester Corridor plan involves implementing nine synchronized stoplights for the six-mile stretch between FM 2920 and FM 1960 and removing all existing stop signs therein. Three of the stoplights will be in Olde Oaks (TC Jester at Kennonview, Aspen Bend and Chapel Bend). SCO has initiated opposition to the plan citing concerns about traffic flow, congestion and likely speeding in attempts to catch synchronized green lights.

Ms. Rumsey invites all interested parties (including individual residents) committed to working actively in the resolution to the traffic light issue on TC Jester to join the committee being formed by contacting them via Facebook: TC Jester Corridor - Stop Signs, Not Lights or email at stopthetrafficlightsatsco@gmail.com.

This month there is more to report on since last time, as we met after the December deadline. We are actually starting our 13th year and are proud of our longevity and all the books we've read and discussed as a group.



I hope this notice allows closure for someone.




Try-outs and registration will be held on Saturday, January 18 at Memorial Middle School, located behind Mac Haik Ford on the Katy Freeway.


Calling all Model Railroaders and Rail Fans!

Local Group Forms to Assist Veterans in Visiting Memorials



Houston has become home to a new hub of The Honor Flight Network. This non-profit organization was created solely to honor America's veterans, by providing no cost transportation to Washington, D.C. to visit their memorials. The Honor Flight Network has hubs all over the United States, but until now, there was no hub in Houston.

"We are extremely proud to announce that Honor Flight Houston has been created and is in the process of organizing its inaugural flight." stated Edd Harshbarger, Chairman of Honor Flight Houston, "Top priority is given to our World War II veterans as well as other war veterans who may be terminally ill. With over 640 World War II veterans passing away each day, our time to express our thanks to these brave men and women is running out."

The group hopes to be winging their way to D.C. with 25 local World War II veterans in April 2014. The effort is dependent on the time given by volunteers as well as donations from the public, as it costs approximately \$1,000 per veteran to make the trip.

Harshbarger added, "If someone would like to donate funds or goods, or to volunteer, or if they know of a veteran who should visit his or her memorial, we hope that they would contact us."



Along with music, magic and laughs, travelers also enjoyed plenty of free time to rest and recoup or to venture out on their own.






