# The Importance of Safe Digging

**April Is Safe Digging Month** – A time when homeowners are reminded to make a single

### "call before you dig"

phone call before they even pick up a shovel. This way, utility operators can locate and mark any underground pipelines, conduits, wires, and cables. This is especially important as we tend to our yards and gardens.

"Every digging job requires a call — even small projects like planting trees or shrubs," says the Common Ground Alliance (CGA), an association that promotes best practices for safe digging in North America. "If you hit an underground utility line or pipeline while digging, you can harm yourself or those around you, disrupt service to an entire neighborhood, cause thousands of dollars worth of damage, and potentially be held responsible for fines and repair costs."

Most gas companies are doing their part to promote the importance of using "call-before-you-dig" numbers, which are also known as "one-call" numbers. Calls made using one-call numbers go directly to state call centers, whose staffers then alert utility operators. Those operators may then send out crews to locate and mark underground utilities before any planned digging or excavation takes place.


The message is simple, says CGA: "Whether you're planning to do it yourself or hire a professional, smart digging means making a call before you dig prior to each job. Everyone can play a big part in spreading this awareness to their family members, friends, and neighbors."

Here it is April again and time for our book club meeting at Collins Park where we'll meet on **April 23 at 11 a.m.** instead of the usual 10 a.m. time. We'll eat our sack lunches while we discuss the book.

The choice this month is *Thunderstruck* by Erik Larson. Several years ago we read his *Isaac's Storm* about the 1900 Galveston hurricane. *Thunderstruck* is a narrative history and delves into Guglielmo Marconi's invention of wireless communication. It is set in Edwardian London, the stormy coasts of Cornwall, Cape Cod, and Nova Scotia.

This is a time when shipping companies were in great competition, and the rich outdid one another with ostentatious displays of wealth. Marconi races against incredible odds to perfect his invention, the wireless, which is very interesting as it was a major catalyst for the emergence of present-day communication. During this time Marconi crosses paths with Hawley Harvey Crippen, England's famous murderer, second only to Jack the Ripper.


Larson is the author of four *New York Times* best-sellers. For this book, written in 2006, he traveled to London, Munich, Rome, Nova Scotia, and Cape Cod. Larson started his career with studies of Russian history, language and culture at the University of Pennsylvania and then earned a master's degree in journalism from Columbia University. After writing for the *Bucks County Courier Times*, he became a staff writer for the *Wall Street Journal*, a contributor to *Time Magazine* and several other publications. 


