
CONGRATULATIONS, OLDE OAKS GRADUATE!

Discussion with ACMI

It is hard to believe it is now May, and the temperature is in the high 80s. This is the time to complete preparations for summer heat and likely dry conditions. A few suggestions and comments follow:

- St. Augustine grass requires about 30 inches of water each
 year just to survive. If this grass goes for an extended time
 without water it dies, and does not go into dormancy as does
 Bermuda and some other types of grass. It is best to water
 once or twice each week with an inch or so of water to soak
 deeply than it is to water just a little every day or two.
- The most frequent cause for grass to die is not drought but chinch bugs that eat the roots. These insects thrive in dry conditions. Please treat to control this insect at the first sign of their presence. All nurseries will have recommendations on proper treatments.
- Grass requires sun. If you have a lot of shade, you might consider trimming trees higher from the ground so light gets to the grass.
- Shrubs also require regular watering. A drip watering system
 is preferred to allow placement of water where required and
 in the amount required.



"Footnotes"

I'm sure we'll learn a lot this month as our book is Still Alice by Lisa Genova. This is a 2004 debut novel about a 50-year-old college professor's sudden descent into early onset Alzheimer's disease. It's about Alice Howland, a Harvard professor, who at the height of her career notices forgetfulness creeping into her life.

Confusion and memory failure also help lead to the diagnosis. She tries to maintain her lifestyle and live in the moment even though her sense of self diminishes according to online information. The author captures in detail what it's like to lose your mind.

Dr. Genova graduated as a valedictorian from Bates College with a degree in biopsychology and a Ph.D in neuroscience from Harvard. An online video interview revealed that her grandmother had Alzheimer's and so thought there was a novel there. What is the speed of decline with this disease? What is the truth about the face of Alzheimer's, and what is ahead for the person and the family? The author wanted to help readers gain an appreciation and understanding of someone's story with Alzheimer's. We will meet at the home of **Terri Checkles** on **Tuesday, May 22**, and **Jannette Hanna** will be discussion leader.

OOCIA Monthly Meeting Notes


The OOCIA Board held its monthly meeting on Wednesday, April 11. About 10 residents were in attendance. Some of the topics of discussion included the following:

- A physical count of the homes in Olde Oaks/Waterford Park was completed. There are 1,565 homes and 1,661 lots. The Board and ACMI are working together to sort out a number of issues regarding divided lots – lots whose ownership is divided among several owners.
- The Board voted to make improvements to the Brightwood entrance from Stuebner Airline. The plan calls for lowmaintenance, drought-tolerant landscaping and the addition of irrigation. The goal of this plan is to soften the look of the businesses located on either side of the entrance.



- The Board approved the removal of three dead trees from the green space on Beacham Drive across from the lake. The approximate cost will be \$2,240.
- The Board approved fence repair around the Haven Oaks
 Drive cemetery as well as maintenance of the interior and
 exterior landscaping.
- 212 certified letters were sent out as final notices prior to lien for delinquent annual assessments.
- The Board approved a plan to create small committee groups to work toward the beautification of each entrance to the community, including Pebble Bend, Brightwood, Terrace Oaks, Walters, and Waterford Park.
- A report from the Deputy Liaison showed that having four dedicated Sheriff's deputies is well worth the cost and that response time is minimal.

Update on Olde Oaks Greenbelt Preservation Association

The OOGPA Board is composed of OO/WP residents Bruce Ganer, Craig Lewis, Kathy Zigler and Tanya Morland. OO/WP owns a number of acres of green space between the north side of the neighborhood and Cypress Creek, and the OOGPA has been charged with preserving this precious natural area as a habitat for wildlife, as a buffer for the community, and as a future natural recreation area for residents.

Watch for details about an OOGPA Town Hall Meeting coming in June. Residents are welcome and encouraged to attend. The topics of discussion will include the acreage along Cypress Creek that the OOGPA has jurisdiction over and plans for recreational facilities that are expected to be proposed to the Olde Oaks community in the near future. Subtopics to this discussion will include the various options for types of facilities, costs, rules and regulations, funding sources, solicitation of volunteers, and solicitation of public opinion.

Trash and Recycling Reminders

- Trash is collected on Mondays and Thursdays. Recycling
 is collected on Thursdays. Please do not set out trash
 or recycling receptacles before 7 a.m. on Monday and
 Thursday mornings. Remember that we have "backdoor"
 trash service, but yard waste and recycling must be hauled
 to the curb. Heavy items are picked up on Thursdays.
- Any combination of up to eight (8) bags or bundles of yard waste will be picked up at the curb each collection day. Branches (3" diameter and less) need to be bundled in 4-foot lengths. No yard waste bag or bundle should weigh more than 40 lbs.
- On or around June 1, Royal Recycle & Disposal will provide each home with a 96-gallon wheeled recycling container. If after using the container for 60 days, you feel it is too large for your household's needs, you may switch it out for a 65-gallon container instead. Remember, the container is the property of Royal and needs to stay with the home if you move.
- See the Recycling Guidelines on page 8 for details on what can and cannot be recycled.






