

The 1960 Parade Committee's 34th Annual St. Patrick's Day Parade will be held on **Sunday, March 11**. This is a great chance to enjoy a spring day outdoors, relax with friends and family, and watch the floats go by. For the kids, there are plenty of beads and other treasures to be had if you can catch them.

The parade steps off at 2 p.m. from the parking lot of the Wells Fargo Bank building at Champion Forest Drive and FM 1960 and finishes up at The Texas Rock Tavern at Kuykendahl and FM 1960. Parade officials estimate that between 60,000 and 80,000 people will attend this year's parade, so stake your claim early if you plan to watch from the sidelines.

Keep in mind that the 3.5-mile parade route will be closed down to all traffic from 1 p.m. to about 5 p.m. that day, and plan to use Cypresswood Drive or Stuebner Airline as alternate routes. The intersections at Champion Forest Drive and Kuykendahl will remain open, and police will open up intersections from west to east along the route as the parade clears.

Discussion with ACMI

Property Values

At the owners' meeting on February 8 there was considerable discussion about property values and what the Association Board and members of the Association can do to support those values.

The general consensus within the industry is that a positive first opinion is extremely important in determining the value of a property. This relates to the community, the area where a home is located, the immediate neighbors to the home and the property itself.

Given this perspective, the following items need to be considered by the Association Board and each homeowner:

- How do the entrances to the subdivision appear? Are
 they well kept, inviting? As discussed at the meeting, this
 subject is under review by the Board and everyone should
 support upgrades that assist in providing a positive outside
 appearance for the community.
- Does the community have an overall positive appearance?
 The addition of trees, irrigation of medians and other landscape upgrades over the past few years has helped here.
 The current project to upgrade eight cul-de-sacs is also a positive step. Other such steps should be identified by members and forwarded to the Board for consideration along with ideas the Board may develop.

• How do the individual homes and grounds appear? Are they generally well maintained? This is an area where each homeowner or tenant plays an important role. In recent visits to the community we find several maintenance activities where many homes need attention: a) Winter weeds are not controlled and are allowed to grow without frequent mowing (more than 50 force-mowing notices were issued in January due to this issue). b) Many mailboxes need to be replaced or maintained; they lean, do not have doors, etc. c) Many homes have significant mildew buildup

on brick and wood siding. d) Driveways and sidewalks are in need of repair – just to mention a few areas of concern currently being addressed.

• How you can help? Please take a few minutes to walk around your home and take a critical look for details that need attention. Every home requires some annual maintenance. Then, clean the debris from the eaves, get out the power washer, buy a new mailbox and take other action that you perceive might make your home present a more positive appearance to a visitor, provide an increase in value and thereby to assist in increasing the value of the Olde Oaks and Waterford Park neighborhoods.



"Footnotes"

A nonfiction book, *The Big Rich* by Bryan Burrough, is on the docket for our March 27 meeting. We will meet at the home of Jannette Hanna, and Heather George will be the discussion leader. *Rich*, written in 2009, chronicles the rise and fall of one of the great economic and political influences of the 20th century, Texas oil. It's a tale of money, family, and power. The big four – Roy Cullen, H. L. Hunt, Clint Murchison, and Sid Richardson – were all from modest backgrounds but became heads of the wealthiest oil families of Texas. Together they became known as "the big rich" and helped shift wealth and power from the East Coast, financially backed three Texas native sons to the White House, and so assisted the rise of modern conservatism in the United States.

Bryan Burrough is a best-selling author of four books and is a *Vanity Fair* special correspondent. Raised in Temple, Texas, he attended journalism school at the University of Missouri and then went on to write for several newspapers. He is a three-time winner of the prestigious Gerald Loeb Award for Excellence in financial journalism. In addition, he has consulted for 60 *Minutes* and various Hollywood studios and written book reviews and Op-Ed articles in many newspapers. He presently lives in New Jersey with his wife and two teenaged sons.






Feeling Stretched as a Caregiver?






