2019 Community Assessment Fee Announced

At the October meeting of the Board of Directors it was voted and authorized to budget the 2019 Assessment Fee for the Olde Oaks Community Improvement Association and Waterford Park at \$633, consistent with the prior year. Statements were mailed in November. These fees are due January 1, 2019 and considered late on January 31, 2019. A late fee of \$30 will be added to your account on February 1, 2019 and a statement will be mailed to you. If these fees are not paid by February 28, 2019, a reminder fee of \$20 will be added to your account on March 1, 2019 and another statement will be mailed to you.

You have several options to pay before a Certified Letter/ Final Demand is sent to you at a cost:

- Pay by check or money order for the full amount.
- Pay online with a credit card or electronic check as detailed on your statement or on Crest website.
- If you are unable to pay the full amount, contact Crest Management to request a payment plan.

We never charge for visitation. We believe visitation should be conducted as a volunteer service because the handlers and their dogs are absolutely volunteers.


