Since moving here, I have been fortunate to meet and work alongside so many talented and dedicated people who live in Olde Oaks and Waterford Park. This community depends on volunteers, people willing to make a difference without expecting personal enrichment or even acknowledgement. There are the visible ones that come to mind—those who step up to leadership roles, organize events throughout the year, invite neighbors into their homes for book clubs, fellowship and committee work. Other vital volunteer resources are those who provide assistance at local schools, our churches, the library and cultural venues near us. Volunteering is often performed in private—giving your time to watch over grandchildren or the youngster (or pet) living next door.

While composing this month's newsletter, I was provided with an article highlighting a very special style of volunteerism. Until recently, we had in our midst one person whose efforts have touched thousands of lives. His name is Pete Peterson, now in his 90s, who recently moved from Olde Oaks. Many years ago, Pete started the Houston Ground Angels (HGA), a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization that provides ground transportation service linking up with private pilots flying cancer patients into Houston. Peter Barton, an Olde Oaks resident of 30 years and a volunteer for HGA, was originally inspired to volunteer when he read an article in this newsletter years ago. Peter Barton provides free CPR classes and is a volunteer ambulance medic with CCEMS.

- The Board approved and authorized forwarding three accounts for legal collection proceedings against homeowners who have not paid assessed amounts. The range of accounts due to OOCIA was \$5,300 to \$6,400.
- The Finance Committee was authorized for this fiscal year.
 Deborah Plance, Board member and Treasurer, will chair the
 committee. Committee members will focus on strategies to
 match the Capital Reserve Account balance with the
 Reserve Study recommendations. In addition, the committee
 will identify and recommend opportunities to improve the
 OOCIA's current rate of return on deposited savings funds.
- Lively discussion ensued during the Homeowner Open Question session regarding T.C. Jester traffic management, untimely maintenance of lawns, other potential deed violations and ACC approval time frames.

Architectural Control Committee Guidelines

Homeowners planning to make improvements to the exterior of their home or elsewhere on the property must obtain written approval prior to beginning work on the modifications from the Architectural Control Committee (ACC). This includes painting and repainting of siding, trim, brick, front door, etc. The goal of the ACC is to serve both you and the community by determining that your finished improvement will comply with the deed restrictions and architectural guidelines and enhance the value of your property and our neighborhood.
