## Pearl Fincher Museum of Fine Arts My Hero! Contemporary Art & Superhero Action: June 1 – August 17

The Pearl Fincher Museum of Fine Arts is delighted to announce its summer 2019 exhibition: My Hero! Contemporary Art & Superhero Action as well as its Heroes & Villains themed summer art camps.

With more than 130 pieces, My *Hero!* is a "**POW**-erful" exhibition for all ages that is being presented exclusively at the Pearl this summer, for Houston-area residents to enjoy. The exhibition explores what it means to be a superhero and celebrates the possibilities when you have a magic cape, lasso, or superhuman power. This intriguing collection features work by contemporary artists from around the world, in a variety of media including sculpture, printmaking, and photography.

My Hero! at the Pearl opens to the public at 1 p.m. on Saturday, June 1. Special previews will be held for patron museum members on Friday, May 31, and all members on Saturday, June 1. Visit www.pearlmfa.org for information on becoming a member.

"Superheroes appeal to people of all ages," said Ani Boyajian, director of the Pearl Fincher Museum of Fine Arts. "My *Hero!* will be fun for children and families, but it also offers unique twists for teens, adults and seniors to enjoy." The exhibition includes a series of photographs by Dulce Pinzón of Brooklyn, NY, depicting the lives of immigrants as society's superheroes, such as an image of Catwoman working as a nanny, and Superman delivering pizzas on his trusty bike. Several artists ponder what happens to superheroes when they get older, and San Francisco artist Lizabeth Eva Rossof created a 6' 7" tall, 420-pound statue of Batman as a historic Terracotta Warrior.



Fans will recognize their favorite superheroes in the exhibition, including Superman, Spider-Man, Batman, Robin, Captain America, Wonder Woman, Supergirl, Catwoman, Hulk, Iron Man and more—in "out-of-the-box" new and interesting ways. My *Hero!* will be featured in the Main Gallery and Rebecca Cole Gallery of the Pearl Fincher Museum of Fine Arts from **June 1** through **August 17**. The exhibition is made possible in part through generous gifts from The Hamill Foundation and Houston Federal Credit Union.

Located at 6815 Cypresswood Drive in Spring, the Pearl Fincher Museum of Fine Arts is open 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday through Saturday. Admission is free. Donations are appreciated and help continue the Pearl's mission of art, education, and community.



#### Vincent van Gogh: His Life in Art

#### Through June 28

The MFAH is the only venue for this major survey that brings together more than 50 masterworks by one of the most iconic artists in the history of Western art. *Vincent van Gogh: His Life in Art* follows Van Gogh (1853–1890) through four key stages of his career, from early sketches to final paintings.



Few artists left behind as complete a diary of life and work as Van Gogh, whose decade-long career as an artist began when he took up painting in 1881. *Vincent van Gogh: His Life in Art* highlights the artist's early years in the Netherlands; his luminous period in Paris; his search for light and color in the south of France; and his exploration of nature as a source of enduring inspiration in Saint-Rémy and Auvers.

The exhibition showcases portraits, landscapes, and still lifes drawn primarily from the collections of the Van Gogh Museum in Amsterdam and the Kröller-Müller Museum in Otterlo, the Netherlands.



- Get your tickets before you arrive. Purchase online or on-site prior to your visit.
- See the exhibition sooner rather than later. The volume of guests increases as the closing date draws near.
- Visit on a Tuesday or Wednesday. Peak visitation days are Thursday through Sunday.
- **Consider your parking options in advance.** Go to mfah.org/parking for a handy map.
- It's okay to view the art in the order that works for you. Feel free to walk around from gallery to gallery and experience these masterworks in the sequence that suits you best.
- Audio-tour beacons work from two feet away. No need to wait for a turn to stand directly in front of the beacon point your player toward it to trigger new audio content.
- If you're an MFAH member, bring your membership card. Don't miss out on your free tickets, plus shop and parking discounts.

#### The U.S. Army Field Band to Give FREE Performance on Pavilion Main Stage

The internationally acclaimed United States Army Field Band and Soldier's Chorus of Washington, DC will continue its long tradition of presenting free public performances when it appears at The Pavilion as part of the venue's 30th Performing Arts Season on **Thursday, July 25** at 7 p.m. This is a free event and tickets are not required. Gates will open at 6 p.m.

The Concert Band and Soldiers' Chorus are the oldest and largest of The U.S. Army Field Band's performing components. These two ensembles combine to present joint concerts on their national tours.

They have performed in all 50 states and 30 foreign countries for audiences totaling hundreds of millions.

The 60-member concert band and 29-member soldiers' chorus perform regularly in some of the most famous concert halls in the world, and just as often in the humblest auditoriums in the smallest of communities. The joining of these two ensembles allows them to offer unparalleled versatility of programming, ranging from orchestral masterworks and operatic arias to Sousa marches, jazz classics, and Broadway musicals. The band and chorus also perform independently, and have recently shared the stage with such ensembles as the Boston Pops, the Cincinnati Pops, the Detroit Symphony

Orchestra, and the National Symphony Orchestra. The Pavilion first welcomed the Army Field Band at a free concert July 2009.

"It was an honor to host the Army Field Band in 2009 and we are honored again that they reached out to us to schedule a return performance," said Jerry MacDonald, President and CEO of The Pavilion. "This exciting performance provides residents an opportunity to honor our servicemen and women by attending the concert and is a wonderful addition to our anniversary season."


