Olde Oaks, Waterford Park and Harris County Working Together to Ensure Your Security and Safety

The summer months are suddenly upon us, bringing the expected influx of visitors and new residents which frequently occurs during this time of year. Unfortunately, there also comes an increase of criminal activities which can quickly evolve into dangerous personal safety issues. But, there is something we can all do to help our law enforcement and public safety personnel have a greater advantage when monitoring and controlling criminal and unsafe situations in our communities.

Community security and public safety has always been a priority in the Olde Oaks and Waterford Park communities, so we encourage all of our neighbors to acquaint themselves with "Close Watch Harris County" (CWHC) and the Harris County Emergency Services District No. 16 (HCESD16).

CloseWatch Harris County

Beginning with security, CloseWatch is a mobile application that enables citizens to turn in tips, images



and videos about crimes or suspicious activities directly to law enforcement from almost any mobile phone or PC. You can submit digital photos or videos from cell phones or cameras directly to the officers investigating a specific crime, and all of this can be done anonymously.

As you enter an address into the application's map,

CWHC will instantly display the crime map for your location or the location of your choice. For more information and to download this powerful crime reporting and prevention tool, go to www.closewatchharriscounty.com.

Harris County Emergency Services District No. 16

When it comes to safety, HrCESD 16 is a political subdivision of the State of Texas serving as a taxing district to support fire suppression and rescue services. HrCESD 16 commissioners recently improved the District's ISO rating to Class 2 in areas with hydrants (such as Olde Oaks and Waterford Park), placing them in the top 7% of rated fire departments in Texas which should reduce homeowners' and businesses' fees for fire insurance. HrCESD 16 contracts with service provider Klein Volunteer Fire Department (KVFD). In addition to responding to fires and rescues such as people trapped in elevators and kids locked in cars, KVFD provides:

- Children's school programs, preschool to grade 12;
- Cub Scout and Girl Scout station tours;
- Fire extinguisher classes;
- Fire safety programs for businesses;
- Retirement community programs;
- Business grand opening events;
- House visits for birthday parties; and
- Others upon request.

KVFD also provides safety training, namely:

- Car seat checks, done in conjunction with Cypress Creek Emergency Medical Services (CCEMES);
- Safe@Home, a program designed for students in grades 4 to 6 to prepare them to be safe when they are home alone; and Safe Sitter classes, which prepare students in grades 6 to 8 to be safe when they're home alone, watching younger siblings, or babysitting.

Not only do we deliver these beds to kiddos in need, but we partner with organizations, churches, businesses and individuals like you to build them at events called Build Days!"

Recently on June 15, SHP National challenged local chapters to hold a nationwide Build Day – Bunks Across America. Nationally, a total of 2,729 beds were constructed with the help of 8,600 volunteers.

Our neighbors, Gary and Nikki Akin, have found their passion in this organization and have led the NW Houston Chapter through many successful Build Days. On this special

day, the local chapter's work was accomplished with about 130 volunteers, plus 20 Work Station Captains and Delivery Team Leaders. In addition to the bunk bed build, 30 bunk beds were delivered making the Chapter's total beds delivered in June a whopping 100! To ensure this local event became a reality, major sponsors and work groups who participated included the Mac Haik Automotive Group, Northwoods Presbyterian Church, Tokio Marine HCC, Axcess Financial and Klein United Methodist Church. It is currently estimated to cost approximately \$350 per bunk; this covers the cost of lumber, hardware, building supplies, new mattresses, and complete new bedding sets that are age and gender appropriate.

According to Gary, "What a day it was and everyone showed up to work, plus a few extras I think. No one seemed deterred by the heat, other than the water cooler" ... SHP Houston NW became "the 6th largest builder out of over 100 chapters participating in Bunks Across America, even if it was only by $\frac{1}{2}$ a bunk."





Harris County Precinct 4 Joins HMNS Cockrell Butterfly Center to Unleash "Mosquito Assassins"

Harris County Precinct 4 and the Houston Museum of Natural Science's Cockrell Butterfly Center have joined forces to study the efficacy of launching "mosquito assassins" on mosquito populations in a semi-controlled environment.

Anita Schiller, director of Precinct 4's Biological Control Initiative, chose the butterfly center for the study because of its contained environment, healthy ecosystem, and unique ability to educate the public about innovative biocontrol methods.



Native to the southeastern United States, mosquito assassins (*Toxorhynchites rutilus*) lay eggs in rainwater-filled vessels in which pest mosquito larvae are likely to be found. After hatching, immature mosquito assassins feed on aquatic insects – including pest

mosquito larvae. By adulthood, mosquito assassins take flight to feed on plant nectar and pollinate flowers.

"The mosquito assassin poses no risk to the environment or man and helps control mosquito populations," said Schiller. "They are also beautifully colored, much like some butterflies, and locally self-sustaining. This study will give us a better idea of how fast mosquito assassins reproduce and eliminate mosquitoes in a semi-controlled environment."

"We are excited to be a part of this study and welcome these fascinating beneficial insects into the Cockrell Butterfly Center," said Erin Mills, the director of the Cockrell Butterfly Center. "They are a wonderful addition to the team of predatory organisms we have fighting against pest activity!"

Schiller has studied mosquito assassins since 2012, when Commissioner R. Jack Cagle formed the Biological Control Initiative and tasked her with developing natural and effective mosquito-control methods. Schiller's team now breeds the insects and releases them into Precinct 4 parks to control mosquito populations without pesticides. Architectural Control Committee Guidelines

As a reminder, homeowners planning to make improvements to the exterior of their home or elsewhere on the property must obtain written approval prior to beginning work on the modifications from the Architectural Control Committee (ACC). This includes painting and repainting of siding, trim, brick, front door, etc. even if repainting the home with the same colors. The goal of the ACC is to serve both you and the community by determining that your finished improvement will comply with the Deed Restrictions and Architectural Guidelines and enhance the value of your property and our neighborhood. Approval is not required for plans to remodel, paint, or otherwise alter the interior of a home.

The criteria followed by the ACC in making its decisions are outlined in the Deed Restrictions and the Architectural Standards and Guidelines, copies of which can be viewed or downloaded by going to the community website at www.oocia.org/governing-documents. You can complete the online application, download an application to mail in with support, as well as obtain further guidance prior to completing your request for ACC review at www.oocia.org/ architectural-control.
