Expanding North Houston's Public Education Opportunities

The community of Olde Oaks/Waterford Park will soon have a new neighbor, a neighbor which – among those who have been watching this unfold – is being described as a plus for our community. This new neighbor will take up residence on the northwest end of the vacant 28-acre field (behind Northgate Oaks Apartments) along T.C. Jester Boulevard. This field on T.C. Jester is all that is left of the ranch where cattle once grazed; the ranch had frontage area right up to FM 1960 where Walmart now stands. The upcoming addition to our local community will be the latest campus of the School of Science and Technology (SST). The School of Science and Technology purchased the 14-acre northwest section of the property in July 2019. This leaves one more 14-acre parcel unsold located between SST and the Northgate Oaks Apartments complex. Now allow me to introduce the community of Olde Oaks/Waterford Park to SST, while setting the stage for follow up articles on the SST.





The School of Science and Technology is a state-funded public charter school, which focuses on a curriculum of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM). SST is headquartered in San Antonio, and for the 2019-2020 year will have 12 campuses in Texas: five in San Antonio, two in Corpus Christi, and five in Houston, with the most recent Houston location in Spring at 2105 Louetta Road. Once opened, the T.C. Jester location will be the sixth campus in Houston.

For those who may not know what a charter school is, let me explain. A charter school is a publicly funded school which will accept students from any area of the city the school is located in. SST is a tuition-free public school; i.e., there is no fee for a student to attend. The school is accredited and audited by the Texas Education Agency. Funding for Texas charter schools is provided through the State of Texas and based on student average daily attendance at the school and

unlike our independent school district campuses does not receive any funding from local taxes. SST, although a tuition-free public school, does not provide transportation services for students.

Shortly, you will begin to see activity on this piece of property, as SST expects groundbreaking for the T.C. Jester campus to occur in the fall of 2019 with completion scheduled to meet the 2020-2021 academic year. The initial campus will include Pre-K through 6th grade for the first year, expanding to 8th grade as students progress. When completed, the Pre-K to 8th grade school is projected to house up to 750 students. Applications to the SST T.C. Jester 2020-2021 Pre-K to 6th grade school year will begin being accepted in March of 2020. Acceptance to SST is based on a lottery system.

Future plans for the 2021-2022 school year include expanding the campus to a high school which will start at 9th grade, and continue to gradually grow up to 12th grade. The high school is being planned to accommodate up to 500 additional students.

The OOCIA Board of Directors is already preparing to have Atnan Ekin, Area Superintendent of SST Houston Schools, and Dr. Nancy Dunn Thompson, Director of Community Outreach and Communications for SST Texas, attend and speak at our Olde Oaks Community Improvement Association's Annual Members Meeting in February 2020. What timing this will be, with applications opening for the T.C. Jester location in March of 2020!

If driving on T.C. Jester towards FM 1960 is in your daily commute, you now know what will be going on in the vacant field beginning this fall. As the building begins to take shape, we will do our best to provide our community with additional information about SST. 
BOOK CLUB "Footnotes"

Here we are at the start of another Book Club season. We will meet again on **Tuesday, September 24** at 10 a.m. at my house and will no doubt have book titles to share from our summer reading. Our chosen book for this month, though, is *Founding Mothers: The Women Who Raised Our Nation* by Cokie Roberts.

Cokie Roberts is probably a familiar name to many of you as she has been a political commentator for ABC News and a senior News Analyst for NPR. Her father was Thomas Hale Boggs, Sr., a Louisiana Congressman who disappeared in a flight over Alaska in 1972. Her mother, "Lindy" Boggs, replaced him in 1973 and served for 17 years.

Founding Mothers was written in 2004. One of the interesting things about this book is Ms. Roberts' motivation for writing it. Her ancestor, William Claiborne, in 1790 was in Congress. While Ms. Roberts and her husband, Steve Roberts, were writing a book together, From This Day Forward, she wondered what the women of the late 18th century were doing that the men could go off to Philadelphia or Ben Franklin, off to England. She became particularly interested in Abigail Adams who told John, "remember the ladies."

Although many of the men of that time thought the women were frivolous, history shows that they were very busy in not only raising children and defending their homesteads alone, but also acting as spies, organizing boycotts of British goods, raising money for the soldiers, and petitioning the government. It was a major piece of research to find the information she needed for this book, as not much has been written about the women of that time; or if it was, much has not been saved. If you are a history buff, this is a very worthwhile read.







Tomball Bluegrass Festival




