2020 Changes to Your Water Bill

At the publishing of this newsletter you may have already received your OOCIA 2020 dues statement. If not, your statement should be arriving shortly. If you have received your statement you may have been surprised to see a reduction in your 2020 annual dues. I would like to take this opportunity to provide you with a brief explanation of this reduction and what to expect in 2020.

The reduction in your annual HOA dues is the result of the Association only collecting for three months of trash collection payments during the 2020 budget year. As of the writing of this article, the three utility districts which serve our community (MUD 44, MUD 20, and Bammel UD) have voted to assume the contract management, and billing of trash collection as of April 1, 2020. So, what does this mean to you as a resident of Olde Oaks/Waterford Park? It means that your trash and recycling will continue to be collected; however, your trash collection fees will begin to appear in your monthly water bill as of April. Final cost for prorated monthly services were still being evaluated at this article's deadline but should have been stated in the HOA letter announcing the annual 2020 dues. You are encouraged to attend monthly Board meetings, watch the newsletter, and/or OOCIA website (OOCIA.org) for additional information on this subject.

"Sweet Dreams for Northwest Houston"

Sleep in Heavenly Peace (SHP), a nonprofit, volunteer organization in the NW Houston area is led by Olde Oaks residents Gary and Nikki Akin. SHP builds "cargo-style" bunk beds and gives them, free of charge, to kids three to 17 years of age, who have no bed of their own. It is estimated that 2 to 3% of the population composed of children do not sleep in a bed of their own. We have roughly seven million residents in metro Houston and stats tell us that 27.5% of those are children under the age of 18; in other words, somewhere between 50,000 to 60,000 children ages three to 17 in metro Houston do not sleep in their own bed.


According to Nikki Akin, "Since August 18 of last year, when SHP Houston built our first bunk bed at our Build Facility on the campus of TheMET Church on Jones Road, we have held 20 Builds and delivered 814 beds to 265 families in NW Houston. We have had volunteers from churches: Northwoods Presbyterian, Klein United Methodist, TheMET, John Wesley United Methodist, Kinsmen Lutheran; organizations: FAN-Friends and Neighbors, Young Professionals at NAM; companies: Mitsubishi Caterpillar Forklift America, Shell Engineering, Lennar Homes, David Weekly Homes, Mack Haik Automotive, Molen & Associates, Access Financial Services and youth groups. A recent Build was sponsored by a young man who chose SHP as his Eagle Scout project. He was assisted by his parents. his scout leader, friends from his church and friends from school."



Facebook and other social media continue to be the best source for bed requests. Nikki stated, "a recent post was shared 27,000 times and reached 2,293,249 people according to Facebook. We make it as easy as possible for someone to request a bed. All one has to do is go online to shpbeds.org and enter a bed request. List the names, ages and gender of the children, and based on ZIP code, the request goes to the SHP Chapter responsible for that area. We continue to get close to 100 bed requests a month."

On Saturday, December 14, 25 delivery teams composed of 75 helpers will deliver 100 beds to children in need! So – SHP is gearing up and offering you an opportunity to help out. You can donate funds to help with purchasing, or purchase yourself, kid-friendly, age appropriate (3-17 years of age) complete twin bedding sets, which include a comforter and coordinating sheet set, or individual twin comforters or twin sheet sets.


- _____ 1. When parking your vehicle to go shopping, remember where you parked it! Always park in a well-lit and well-traveled area. Do not park in a remote dark area.

Grand Canyon Photographs: Celebrating the Centennial 1919-2019 celebrates the majesty of the Grand Canyon and commemorates the 100th anniversary of its establishment as a National Park. Through black and white photography, color photography, panoramic images and contemporary prints, the exhibition seeks to capture the grandeur of one of our nation's greatest treasures. The exhibition also features an audio recording, *The Sound of the Colorado River*, made by Burns at Lee's Ferry, mile-marker one of the Grand Canyon, to create a multi-sensory experience within the exhibition.


American photographer Mark Burns was born in Houston and is known for creating compelling images that are a unique mastery of composition, lighting, and photographic technique. He devoted five years of his life to studying and photographing all 59 of America's national parks in black and white for "The National Parks Photography Project." Selections from that iconic work became a traveling exhibit that was seen by nearly 300,000 people during the 100th anniversary of the National

Urban Legend

Urban art, a style of art that relates to cities and city life, has become a global phenomenon of the 21st century. Anat Ronen: Urban Legend gathers this art form into one space for all to enjoy.

After coming to the United States from Israel in 2007, Anat Ronen embarked on a new career in art and has become one of the most exciting and highly regarded street artists of our day – though she has no formal training in art. Typically she works on large-scale projects that can reach over 30 feet tall, with more than 500 pieces in public spaces including highways, bridges, buildings, churches and schools.

The Pearl's exhibit will bring a sampling of her work from the city's social spaces into one gallery, from playful depictions of toys and animals to celebrations of community superheroes. In an exciting nod to the adjacent exhibition of Mark Burns, Ronen will create a large, interactive painting of the Grand Canyon at the Pearl, resulting in an astounding 3D effect. 
