# **Architectural Control Committee Reminder**

Each homeowner who plans any improvements to the exterior of the home or elsewhere on the property must obtain written approval from the Architectural Control Committee (ACC) prior to beginning work on the modification. Completion of work without prior approval could lead to a requirement to remove and restore the property to its original condition.

**Remember:** The goal of the ACC is to serve both you and the community by determining that your finished improvement will comply with the deed restrictions, architectural standards and guidelines, and enhance the value of your property.

To seek approval the owner must complete an application form and submit it to the ACC. The committee has 30 days to review the application and render a decision, so please plan accordingly. The 30-day period begins on the date that a complete application has been received including all required documentation, not on the date the original application is signed by the owner. All work must be completed within 90 days of the approval or a new approval request will be required.

ACC approval is required for any changes or additions, including but not limited to items such as:

- 1. A swimming pool
- 2. Addition of or modification to fencing
- 3. Painting of the exterior of the home, trim, or front door (even if using the same color)
- 4. Replacement of windows
- 5. Addition of a gazebo, fountain, or large play equipment
- 6. Addition of a garage, storage shed, garden house, outdoor kitchen or other structure
- 7. Roof replacement, if a different type or color of shingle will be used







# **Summer Time Water Safety**

Now that the heat is here and swimming pool usage will soon be in full swing, it is important to remind everyone to be careful in and around bodies of water. **Don't take water safety** for granted!

Drowning is the leading cause of injury or death for young children ages 1 to 4. **Nationwide**, three children die every day as a result of drowning. But you can help to prevent accidental drowning. Here are some tips:


Make life jackets a "must." If you plan on visiting natural bodies of water, make sure life jackets are worn. Even if your child is a good swimmer in a swimming pool, it doesn't mean that he/she won't encounter something in a natural body of water that could drown them.

Bathtubs can be dangerous too! Remember that a child, especially babies, can drown in only 1 inch of water. Bathing in bathtubs is a regular household routine but can turn deadly very quickly. Never leave a baby in a bathtub unsupervised, even for what you think is "just a minute."

**Learn CPR.** Learn cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and get re-certified every two years. CPR can help a child stay alive with little or no brain damage.

Be on the look-out. Adults watching kids near water should avoid distracting activities like playing cards, reading books, using electronic devices, or talking on the phone.

### **Before a Hurricane**

- To begin preparing, you should build an emergency kit and make a family communication plan.
- Be sure trees and shrubs around your home are well-trimmed so they are more wind resistant.
- Clear loose and clogged rain gutters and downspouts.
- Plan to bring in pets, all outdoor furniture, decorations, garbage cans, and anything else that is not tied down.
- Fuel your vehicles and generators.

## **During a Hurricane**

- Listen to the radio, TV, or refer to trusted Internet sites for information.
- Stay inside. Don't go outside unless absolutely necessary. If the eye passes over, don't get caught in the calm of the storm.
- Avoid windows and stay in the interior areas of your home.
- Ensure a supply of water for drinking as well as for sanitary purposes such as cleaning and flushing toilets.
   Fill the bathtub and other larger containers with water.
- Know that fire and emergency medical services may not respond until sustained winds are below 55 mph.


