
BOOK CLUB "FOOTNOTES"

Here it is, the end of our 2020-2021 book club season. At our last meeting on **May 25** we'll discuss *Dancing In the Mosque* by Dr. Homeira Qaderi. Also we'll choose books for the fall, and the list will be in the June newsletter. The meeting location will be at a member's home or at the Barnes & Noble coffee shop.

Dancing In the Mosque is a very interesting book as it not only is a memoir rather than a novel but gives insight into the life of Afghan women and the strictures for women's rights in a theocratic and patriarchal society. It includes passages of her letter to a beloved son whom she had to leave behind in emigrating from Afghanistan. The book jacket says "Homeira challenges us to reflect on the meaning of motherhood, sacrifice, and survival" and "to consider the lengths we would go to protect ourselves, our families, and our dignity."

Dr. Qaderi was born in Kabul in 1980 at the time of the Russian occupation. After they left, the Taliban came in with their repression of education for girls. At the age of 13 she started a secret school for boys and girls. After being banned from Kabul, she emigrated to Iran and continued her own education there. Over the years she has developed a career in teaching and writing with many awards earned. She continues today with her women's rights activism for Afghani women.

The Pearl Fincher Museum of Fine Arts has something for everyone this summer, with new exhibitions, Summer Art Camps, classes for teens and adults, and a new Art Start program for preschool children. 


