

MAJOR MAINTENANCE OF CYPRESS CREEK AND ITS TRIBUTARIES CONSTRUCTION ADVISORY

In an effort to keep you informed about the Harris County Flood Control District's continuing improvements in the Cypress Creek watershed, we want to notify you of an upcoming project in your area.

In June 2021, the Flood Control District began construction on the first set of project repair sites (Batch 1) of Bond Project CI-012, Major Maintenance of Cypress Creek and Tributaries. Overall, this project involves major maintenance along Cypress Creek and its tributaries to restore channel conveyance capacity across the watershed. Batch 1, located primarily between Spring-Cypress Road and Cypresswood Drive, inside the 77379 ZIP code area, includes removal of silt from the channel, placement of riprap (stones designed to protect from erosion), erosion repair, outfall pipe removal and replacement, manhole replacements, concrete channel lining replacements, excavation and off-site disposal, imported fill, and site restoration.



Major Maintenance in the Cypress Creek watershed Batch 1

Multiple crews will be working on various channels simultaneously. The timeframe for when crews will be working at each site in Batch 1 has not been determined, but additional communications will be sent to impacted areas prior to construction. To maintain a safe construction environment, area residents are urged and reminded to respect all warning signs, fencing, and barriers, and to avoid any trails, and areas, which may be temporarily impacted as work crews move around the area.

Bond Project CI-012 will be constructed in 6-8 phases, called batches, of multiple individual project sites throughout the Cypress Creek watershed in need of repair. This work will not widen or deepen the channels, but will return them to their designed capacity to convey stormwater. More information about this project, including details about planned batches and timelines can be found at hcfcd.org/CI-012. Summer Safety Reminders

Mosquitoes and ticks

Mosquitoes can cause a number of illnesses, including Zika virus, malaria and West Nile virus. Scented soaps, perfumes, and body/hair sprays can make you more likely to attract mosquitoes. Watch out for ticks also. Use a bug spray made with DEET, picardin, lemon eucalyptus oil or a naturally derived product. You can also minimize mosquito bites by discarding standing water in your yard (i.e. bird baths and kiddie pools), wearing long-sleeved clothing and long pants, and using mosquito netting.



Fireworks

Children should never be unsupervised. When using fireworks, don't point fireworks toward the face or body and keep a safe distance from them once they are lit. You may want to think about keeping water or a fire extinguisher nearby to extinguish fireworks.

Grilling

Propane and charcoal grills should only be used outside and not too close to the house. Never leave a grill unattended and be sure to keep kids and pets safely away. Keep the grill cleaned of grease and fat to avoid flare ups. Keep meat, poultry and seafood refrigerated until you are actually ready to grill.

Heat Stroke

Avoid high physical activities in the heat of the day (typically between 11 a.m. and 3 p.m.) and be sure to drink lots of water.

Sunburn

Wear sunscreen daily with a 30 SPF or higher and apply it every couple of hours, especially after swimming. Hats and sunglasses (to protect your eyes) are a good idea and be sure to protect your lips with a lip balm with a sunscreen of at least 15 SPF.

Summer Activities

Biking or skateboarding is great fun, but be sure to wear a helmet that fits well and consider reflective clothing if on roads in the evening or early morning. Be sure to carry water to keep hydrated.

Drowning

Make sure children know how to swim and wear a life jacket while on boats. Avoid excessive alcoholic drinks while boating or at the beach or pool. Make sure to have a fence around your pool or spa. A small child can drown in a bucket of water, a shallow bath, or a toilet. Learn CPR just in case.


