2023 HOA Assessments

Your Olde Oaks/Waterford Park Board of Directors voted to pass the 2023 budget without an annual increase in dues for next year. In passing the budget, the Board believed that given the current economic state, an increase in dues however slight, would not have been in the community's best interest. For 2023 the combined Assessment and Service fees per lot will remain at \$445. To accomplish this the Board opted to not contribute to the reserve fund in 2023, and will engage in a reserve study in 2023 to help us map out our path forward. As with each member's household expenses, community expenses also increase which more than likely will result in an increase of dues in 2024. Be a good neighbor and be mindful to pay your annual dues in a timely manner.




So, grab your toy bag and buy out the stores. Let's make this the greatest toy drive ever!



Pearl Fincher Museum of Fine Arts Holiday Concert & Winter Break Art Camp




