NHCRWA Reduced Rates

At its January 9, 2023 Board meeting, the Board of Directors of the North Harris County Regional Water Authority voted to reduce water rates. The Board reduced surface water rates from \$5.05 to \$4.55 per 1,000 gallons and groundwater pumpage fees from \$4.60 to \$4.10 per 1,000 gallons. The rate cuts, the first cuts in the history of NHCRWA, went into effect February 1, 2023. Some utility districts modify the NHCRWA water pumpage fee to charge to their customers to cover other costs such as leaks in their system, fire hydrant use, etc., which will make the NHCRWA fee on your water bill higher than what NHCRWA actually charges.


Conversational Spanish Class at the Library

This month we'll meet on March 28 at the home of Carol Bright who will also lead the discussion. Our book is another by Kristin Harmel, *The Sweetness of Forgetting. Sweetness* is Harmel's first World War II novel and made her an international bestseller in 2012. According to notes on the Kristin Harmel website, this book is about a "Cape Cod bakery owner, Hope, who must travel to Paris to uncover a lost family secret for her

dying grandmother. Hope pieces together her grandmother's past and uncovers horrific tales of the Holocaust and her astonishing will to endure."

Kristin Harmel is a 44-year-old American novelist who has written several notable books which have been translated into more than 30 languages. She has proven herself to be a master story teller of historical fiction and was a nominee for the Goodreads Choice Awards Best Historical Fiction for *The Book of Lost Names*. Our group discussed that book in the recent past. Her latest book, *The Paris Daughter*, is coming in June 2023.
