NHCRWA Water Rates and MUD #44

In the February newsletter, the editor posted an article about NHCRWA water rates and MUD #44. This is a response from the MUD #44 Board:

HCMUD No. 44 Board of Directors are pleased to announce the North Harris County Regional Water Authority (NHCRWA) fee was reduced effective October 1, 2023 pursuant to section 3.04 of the District's rate order. As of October 1, 2023 the NHCRWA fee shown on your monthly water bill reflects the reduced rate plus 10% to cover such things as leaks in distribution system and uncollectable accounts. Please reference the NHCRWA fee on your September 2023 bill verses the NHCRWA fee on your October 2023 bill for confirmation of the reduction. What does this mean and how is this calculated? The current NHCRWA surface water fee \$4.05 x 10% = \$4.455/1,000 gallons. We are happy to share section 3.04 of the District rate order which further explains the District's implementation/billing of the NHCRWA fee. We hope you have a further understanding of this fee and how it is calculated.
