Architectural Control Reminder

Before any exterior modifications are made to your home, you must obtain approval from the Architectural Control Committee (ACC). This includes, but is not limited to: painting (even if painting your home the same color), roof repairs or replacement (even if replacing with the same color shingles), installation of a new swimming pool, construction of an addition or outdoor gazebo, or the pouring of a new driveway. You can obtain and submit an application for approval by visiting Crest's website at www.crest-management.com.

Deed Restriction Reminder

Warmer weather has arrived. With higher temperatures comes faster growing grass (and weeds). Our deed restrictions require lawns to be maintained, which includes regular mowing and edging and removal of weeds from flowerbeds and driveways. Additionally, dead trees or shrubs must be removed. Let's keep Olde Oaks and Waterford Park beautiful by maintaining our yards.

Deed Restriction Violation Notices

Did you receive a deed restriction violation notice? Do you need time to comply or complete an Architectural Control Committee (ACC) application to correct the problem? Make sure to contact Crest Management to prevent receiving additional notices or escalating the issue to the Association's attorney. Communicating with the management company is key to providing notice that you are working on the problem. Ignoring deed restriction violation notices will cause the Association to turn the issue over to the Association's attorney, which is a cost the violating homeowner has to pay. Let's work together to help maintain Olde Oaks as a great community to call home!

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

Swimming Pool SAFETY TIPS!

Please Keep Kids Safe

A dip in the pool is a great way to beat the heat. But it's important to remember that pools and other water environments can be dangerous, especially for children. Here are some important water safety tips:

- Stay alert... children move fast and disappear from sight in seconds
- Make sure your child is wearing a U.S. Coast Guard approved life jacket for their weight and size.
- Never rely solely on the lifeguard to watch your child.
- Secure your pool with appropriate barriers. Completely surround your pool with a 4-feet high fence or barrier with a self-closing, self-latching gate.
- Place a safety cover on the pool or hot tub when not in use and remove any ladders or steps used for access.
- Consider installing a pool alarm that goes off if anyone enters the pool.
- Children should never play games of holding their breath under water.
- Keep children under active supervision at all times. Stay in arm's reach of young kids. Designate a responsible person to watch the water when people are in the pool – never allow anyone to swim alone.
- Enroll yourself and child (after age 3) in swimming classes. Ensure everyone in the home knows how to swim well by enrolling them in age-appropriate water orientation and learn-to-swim courses from the Red Cross.
- Learn basic CPR; keep rescue items and a phone close by in case of an emergency.

General Water Safety Tips

- Keep your pool or hot tub water clean and clear. Maintain proper chemical levels, circulation and filtration. Regularly test and adjust the chemical levels to minimize the risk of earaches, rashes or more serious diseases.
- Establish and enforce rules and safe behaviors, such as "no diving," "stay away from drain covers," "swim with a buddy" and "walk please."

The best defense against drowning injuries is parent supervision. Actively watch children by keeping them within arm's reach.



The Woodlands Area Quilt Guild Presents "Bloomin' Crazy for Quilts"

"Bloomin' Crazy for Quilts" show will be held on June 21-22, 2024 at the Lone Star Expo and Convention Center (9055 Airport Road, Conroe, Texas 77303). Hours are 10 a.m. – 5 p.m. on Friday, June 21; and 9 a.m. – 4 p.m. on Saturday, June 22. Admission is \$10 for adults. Guests under age 18 are free.

The show will exhibit 255 quilts ranging in size from baby quilts to king sized quilts, and in style from traditional to modern to art quilts. Along with the quilt exhibit, the show will offer a silent auction, a boutique featuring quilts and other items handmade by Guild members, mini quilts for charity, a schoolhouse, and 30 vendors offering both quilting and non-quilting items. Sleep in Heavenly Peace (SHP) will be accepting donations of twin-sized bedding at the show.

The Guild supports a number of local charities with donations of quilts, such as Camp for All, SHP, Montgomery County Women's Shelter, CASA and Child Protective Services.

Be Prepared During Hurricane Season

Before a Hurricane

- To begin preparing, you should build an emergency kit and make a family communications plan.
- Be sure trees and shrubs around your home are well-trimmed so they are more wind-resistant.
- · Clear loose and clogged rain gutters and downspouts.
- Plan to bring in pets, all outdoor furniture, decorations, garbage cans and anything else that is not tied down.
- · Fuel your vehicles and generators.

During a Hurricane

- Listen to the radio or TV, or refer to trusted Internet sites for information.
- Stay inside. Don't go outside unless absolutely necessary. If the eye of the hurricane passes over, don't get caught in the calm of the storm.
- Avoid windows and stay in the interior areas of your home.
- Ensure a supply of water for drinking as well as for sanitary purposes such as cleaning and flushing toilets. Fill the bathtub and other larger containers with water.
- Know that fire and emergency medical services may not respond until sustained winds are below 55 mph.
