A Message from the Board

The Board hopes you and your families made it through Hurricane Beryl relatively unscathed. We have all learned many lessons from the events that unfolded after the storm came ashore. One takeaway for the Board is the necessity to be able to communicate with homeowners and residents immediately after an emergency. As a result, a system to send email blasts has been implemented to provide important information to the community. Please sign up with Crest to receive email notices, as this may be the only way the Board can communicate with you after a hurricane or other disaster.

Email Address Registration

The Board has implemented a system to send email notices to homeowners and residents on a periodic basis. We encourage everyone to register their email address to receive notices, as this may be the only way the Association can communicate with homeowners and residents after an emergency or disaster. To register to receive community emails, follow the steps below:

Generators – Life Safety Reminder

While generators seem to have become necessary household appliance, especially in the midst of hurricane season, they can also be deadly. Remember to follow all safety precautions for portable and permanently installed generators. Never use a portable generator indoors and make sure it is at least 25 feet from any door or window of your home (or your neighbor's) to prevent carbon monoxide poisoning. Make sure to have working, battery powered, or battery backup powered, carbon monoxide detectors in your home to alert you of a carbon monoxide hazard when using a generator, or any other gas-powered appliance, even if there is not a power outage.


Deed Restriction Reminder

Dead trees and limbs must be removed from yards. The deed restrictions for Olde Oaks and Waterford Park require all front yards and backyards to be maintained. If you have a tree that fell during the storm or tree limbs that fell, you must remove the damaged tree and limbs from your yard. If you hired a tree service to cut up tree limbs or a downed tree and they do not remove the debris, place it at the curb for county pickup.

The Board also reminds all homeowners to partake in regular tree maintenance, which includes pruning and fertilizing trees to try to prevent damage during a storm. Additionally, all dead trees must be removed from your yard to prevent damage to power lines and property during a storm. Last, any tree that has fallen on private property is the responsibility of the homeowner to remove. The Association is only responsible for removing and maintaining trees in the community's common areas.

Architectural Control Reminder

Before any exterior modifications are made to your home, you must obtain approval from the Architectural Control Committee (ACC). This includes, but is not limited to: painting (even if painting your home the same color), roof repairs or replacement (even if replacing with the same color shingles), installation of a new swimming pool, construction of an addition or outdoor gazebo, or the pouring of a new driveway. County Storm Debris Pickup

At the time of writing articles for this newsletter, representatives from Harris County Precinct 3 advised storm debris pickup by the county would begin on Monday, July 15. This includes tree limbs and tree trunks, and any other debris from the storm, such as fences, roofing and other building materials, or non-working appliances, such as a refrigerator.

There is not a date or time certain for pickup on any street in Olde Oaks, Waterford Park, or any other Precinct 3 community.

Precinct 3 officials advised that debris would be picked up three different times but start dates for the other pickups were not yet available at the time of this newsletter's publication. Officials advised homeowners and residents to place debris at their curb for pickup and not to bag anything. The county has also advised against placing any debris near your mailbox to prevent blocking it or your mailbox from being damaged during pickup. Traffic Signals

If you come to an intersection with a non-working traffic signal, which includes flashing lights, no lights on at all, or other odd functions, remember to treat the intersection as a four-way stop.

Inoperable Vehicles

Inoperable vehicles are to be stored out of public view at all times. Vehicles with flat tires or vehicles that are wrecked or do not run are to be stored in your garage or other area not within public view. Homeowners and residents who leave inoperable vehicles in plain sight will receive a deed restriction violation notice. Inoperable vehicles on a public roadway will receive a warning notice from the constable's office and subsequently be towed away if not removed from the roadway.
