## Kindergarten

Kindergarten had a great start in 2026. Our class has two new students. The class did a great job welcoming their new friends!

In math, we have continued adding using the number lines. They have also figured out how to find the perimeter of an object. They can count by 1's, 2's, 5's and 10's. They also know the value of pennies, nickels, and dimes. They are also becoming very good at graphing.

In reading and phonics, they have learned 64 sight words. By knowing those sight words they have become more proficient in reading. We are working on ending sounds of words and rhyming.

On Monday's, Pastor visits our classroom to read and discuss the Bible story for the day. Favorites have included learning about the disciples and Jesus with the children.

Our social studies has focused on customs and cultures around the world. We had a lesson on the past and present Presidents in honor of President's Day. Their two favorites were George Washington and old Honest Abe.

Kindergarten participates weekly in classes on health, physical education, library and music, along with Chapel every Wednesday.

**Science:** Completing hands-on engineering challenges by building and rebuilding structures.

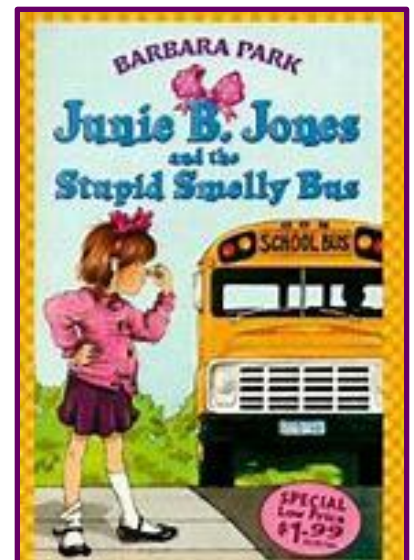

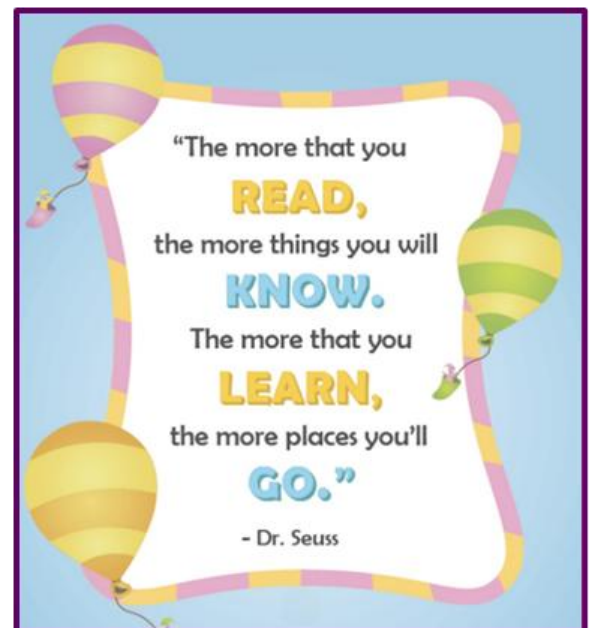
### Library

The LCMS Season of Lent is a 40-day period leading up to Easter, starting on Ash Wednesday and ending on Holy Saturday. It is a time of penance, reflection, and preparation for the celebration of the resurrection of our Lord on Easter Sunday. The season is marked by the use of the color purple, symbolizing repentance and royalty, and the omission of the "Hymn of Praise" and "Alleluia" from the liturgy. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the season with the imposition of ashes on worshippers' foreheads, a practice that recalls human mortality and calls for repentance. The season is also a time for fasting, prayer, and almsgiving, connecting deeper with God and preparing the heart and mind for Good Friday and Easter.

## Devotion, Second Sunday in Lent

March 1, 2026

### 2025–26 Chapel Talks for Lutheran Schools



Does anyone remember where Lent is leading us? We're going to Jerusalem, aren't we? We're going to Calvary, where Jesus will die upon the cross for the sin of the whole world.

Psalm 121 is another psalm that might have been prayed as Israelites journeyed and made a pilgrimage to Jerusalem. As we prayed Psalm 121, you could hear why it would bring some comfort as they traveled.

Verses 1 and 2: "I lift up my eyes to the hills. From where does my help come? My help comes from the LORD, who made heaven and earth" (Psalm 121:1–2). Here, we learn again where to place our trust. Who will lead us throughout this life as we journey with Jesus to His cross and life everlasting?

Verses 3 and 4: "He will not let your foot be moved; he who keeps you will not slumber. Behold, he who keeps Israel will neither slumber nor sleep" (Psalm 121:3–4). God will protect you from spiritual harm like a father walking with a child who has just learned to walk. He will never sleep or leave you.

Verse 5 and 6: "The LORD is your keeper; the LORD is your shade on your right hand. The sun shall not strike you by day, nor the moon by night" (Psalm 121:5–6). To be a "keeper" is to be a watchman. A watchman looks out for danger you may not see and provides security so you may rest and sleep securely.

Verses 7 and 8: "The LORD will keep you from all evil; he will keep your life. The LORD will keep your going out and your coming in from this time forth and forevermore" (Psalm 121:7–8). So where might we find and receive such protection as we travel throughout this world? We find it in our Baptism, at the font, where Christ Jesus gives us His name, life and salvation.

As we journey through Lent and go with Jesus to His cross on Calvary, we should also learn to pray Psalm 121 because it's a prayer for the pilgrimage of life. It's a prayer that leads us to the font, where your help comes from, where your Father in heaven keeps you from stumbling, where there is peace and security, and where the love of Jesus redeems you.

Gracious Father, thank You for watching over us every moment. As we journey through Lent, lift our eyes to the cross, remembering that our help comes from You alone. Keep us secure in Your promises, now and forever. In Jesus' name. Amen.
