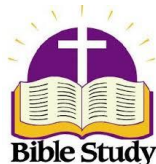

Big Canoe & Highland Joint Council Meeting - December 28, 2025

Present: Big Canoe Council: Brian Bigler - President; Steve Emery - Vice President; Deb Monson - Secretary; and Seth Ferguson and Kathryn Thompson - council members, as well as Pastor Becker.

Pastor Becker gave the opening prayers and the council meeting was called to order.

Deb Monson read the minutes from the council meeting of August 17, 2025. The minutes were approved as read and are on file.

In the absence of Laurie Emery, Treasurer, Steve Emery presented the report. As of November 30, 20205, the balance on hand is -\$1,035.90. The Improvement Fund is owed \$1,000.00. The Cemetary Fund is owed \$2,500 from 2024. The Benevolence Fund is owed \$1,600 of \$8,100. \$11,500 has been borrowed. This does not include money from the Improvement Fund for the parsonage/sewer.

Pastor Becker will continue to post the offering contributions in the monthly bulletin so the congregation knows the monthly contribution income.

The reason is due in part from going from a quarter time pastor to a full time pastor.

Pastor Becker said monies have come in under the QR code system. Bill Stoen stated monies from the QR code should go to the General Fund. Brian requested a motion. Seth Ferguson made a motion, seconded by Steve Emery, and the motion passed that monies from QR code will be put into the General Fund.

Pastor gave his monthly report. He talked about the parsonage Christmas Party which will be held December 27th.

Pastor presented an updated list of the church membership. At the annual meeting, Pastor would like to have a roster of the current active membership.

Pastor would like to have an updated pictorial directory for Big Canoe. The Highland Council has already approved having a new directory. Brian asked for a motion. Steve Emery made a motion, seconded by Kathryn Thompson, and the motion passed. This matter will be voted on at the annual meeting.

Pastor offered the midweek Advent Service sign up sheet for the meal on the 21st which will be after the Christmas Program. Pastor and Detra will be gone to Arizona January 12th through the 20th. He will secure a sub pastor.

The use of the common cup for communion was discussed briefly and we will hold off on that for now.

The Big Canoe Annual Meeting will be held the first Sunday in February. The Highland Annual meeting will be held the last Sunday in January. A joint council meeting is scheduled for December 28th.

The calling tree needs to be updated. A select few will need to be called personally that do not have cell phone or computer.

Tammy Nordheim discussed making the cemetery a separate entity. Church funding would be separate from the cemetary funding. The purpose of this is to protect cemetery funds from being taken by the ELCA, if the church would ever close. The entire church would need to vote on this matter and should be voted on during the annual meeting. Notice has to be made in the church bulletin two separate Sundays before the annual meeting. Pastor Becker noted that the ELCA is not interested in taking over church property. This is a bad rumour going around.

Bill Stoen updated the council that the grant monies that he applied for from The Depot Outlet may not be available until February.

Septic installation - Sawyer Wise plans on working on the septic system on December 11th and 12th.

Tree removal on the church rental cropland was discussed. The field is overgrown. This would be done to reclaim tillable land and would be 20 to 30 feet along the fence line only. Sawyer gave a quote of \$2,500 to \$3,000. Custom removal would be \$4,000 to \$5,000. The council has received a check in the amount of \$4,849.50 for the rent of the cropland.

Men's restroom: Bob Thomas has been renovating the men's restroom at the church. He has already donated his time and has donated some items that needed to be purchased. The cost to complete the renovation is approximately \$2,000. The Luther League has already approved \$2,500 toward the renovation. Items needed for the renovation is a handicap accessible toilet and a divider for privacy purposes. Brian asked for a motion. Seth Ferguson made a motion, seconded by Steve Emery, and the motion passed. Brian will contact Bob and tell him to go ahead with the project.

The Spiritual Retreat for both congregations will be February 7, 2026 from 10:30 a.m. to Noon. This will involve planning for the coming year and pastoral goals. A list of committees and who serves on that committee is needed.

The 175th Anniversary of Big Canoe Church is in 2028. A committee is needed to get started on this.

Vernoe Whitaker and Brian Bigler are on the Nominating committee.

Steve Emery, Brian Bigler, and Kathryn Thompson are going off the church council in 2026.

The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Big Canoe & Highland Joint Council Meeting - December 28, 2025

Present: Big Canoe Council: Brian Bigler - President; Steve Emery - Vice President; Deb Monson - Secretary; and Vernoe Whitaker, Bill Bullerman, and Kathryn Thompson - council members. **Highland Council:** Anna Jetson - President; Al Erickson - Vice President; Gary Selness - Secretary; Danny Dutka - Treasurer; and Kristi Selness, Myron Krauskopf, and Ed Stoen - council members, as well as Pastor Becker.

The reading of the Secretary's Report was waived due to the weather.

Pastor Becker went over his Pastoral Report and discussed the goals he accomplished in 2025 and goals he was unable to complete.

Pastor presented his goals for 2026:

- Pastor will continue with Sunday morning Bible classes. At present 15-20 members attend the Sunday classes and Pastor hopes that more members will attend in 2026.
- Pastor will continue with home visits and communion to the home bound, and those in the hospital or nursing homes.
- Luther League members will meet quarterly.
- Pastor did reach out to inactive members over the past year.
- The two councils are in agreement to continue having services as currently established, the first and third Sundays at Big Canoe and the second and fourth Sundays at Highland.
- Pastor will continue sending out his weekly pastoral messages.
- Lenten services will need to be revised.
- Pastor will continue participating in retreats and continuing education programs.
- Pastor will share his goals for 2026 at the annual meeting.
- For consideration for the summer months:
 - During the summer months, start services ½ hour earlier.
 - On the 5th Sundays of those months with five Sundays, we could have an evening service.
 - Another possibility is to have services at the parsonage and then to the church for a meal.

Old Business:

QR Code - contributions by using the QR code system have been good so it's a program the two churches should keep. Monies from the QR code are kept in a separate account. The monies received under the QR code could be transferred to the General Fund account. To keep the QR code account active, a total of \$25 has to stay in the account.

A person has been arrested who had committed **burglary in the area**. No checks were reported stolen. The deputy advised to have a security camera in the church. At present, the security camera in the church is on loan from Cary and Tammy Nordheim. Pastor was authorized to purchase a security camera for the church. The wifi system at the church is now password protected.

Pastor has seen vehicles in the church parking lot at Big Canoe at 11:00 p.m. and 1:00 a.m. People parking at those hours may be doing a drug exchange.

A **Constitution Committee** needs to be formed to update each church's constitution so Pastor can make a report to the Synod/Bishop that the individual constitutions are up to date.

Pictorial Directory - the pictorial directory needs to be updated for both churches. This will need to be voted on at the annual meetings. Pastor has updated the membership lists at both churches.

New Business: Pastor and Detra will be going to Arizona Monday, January 12th through January 20th. Due to his brother's passing, they are going to Arizona to pick up certain items that have been in Pastor's family for many years. Pastor Gies will be conducting services on Sunday, January 18th.

Given the bombings and the current dangerous situation in Nigeria, Pastor is leaning towards not going. He will make the final decision in the next week or two.

If Pastor does not get into Nigeria, he will be going to Germany. Pastor is provided with funding for the cost of the trip.

A joint congregation retreat is currently scheduled for Saturday, February 7 at Big Canoe from 10:30 a.m. to noon. The purpose of this retreat is to discuss where the two congregations are going in the future.

The 175th Anniversary of Big Canoe will be in August 2028. An anniversary committee will need to be formed at the Big Canoe Annual meeting. Consideration should be given to having commemorative plates being made and having a history book printed. Should the church consider inviting the Crown Prince of Norway? If the prince cannot attend, maybe they will consider sending an ambassador from DC.

Pastor Becker will try to locate the Articles of Incorporation for Big Canoe which may be at the Luther College Archives.

Highland will observe their 135th Anniversary in October 2029.

Danny Dutka gave an update as to the renovation projects at the parsonage and the garage.

- There was a lot of structural rot on the south porch at the parsonage. The only salvageable part of the porch was the roof and the floor. Everything else had to be rebuilt.
- There are concrete and foundation issues with the parsonage.
- Cost to replace sidewalks and garage floor:
 - Garage floor \$ 5,565.00
 - Concrete Apron \$ 945.00
 - Sidewalks \$ 3,079.00
 - Patio & new basement entry \$ 2,525.00
 - Hatch entrance
 - Stabilize the four corners of the parsonage foundation - the northeast corner is the worst.
 - TOTAL COSTS \$18,539.00

The budget to complete these projects is \$15,000.00. Danny will apply for a grant from The Depot to help with part of the costs. A bigger refrigerator is also needed at the Parsonage.

The council members worked on the 2026 proposed budget. A motion was made by Myron Krauskopf to accept the proposed budget, seconded by Vernoe Whitaker. Motion passed by all council members voting aye.

The meeting was adjourned.
